Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Christmas Greetings in the Lord! I pray that today's celebration of our Saviour's birth may find you joyful, hopeful and at peace with God and neighbor.



As I looked upon the cover of this Christmas bulletin, I was struck by how tiny the figure of the Christ child is – and yet how He is the brightest of the figures, the One from Whom the light of God's love is emanating.

The figure of the tiny, newborn Christ reminds us that God prefers to work through the smallest and most ordinary of things. We need only consider the circumstances of Jesus' birth to see that this is true. "O Little Town of Bethlehem," is not just a Christmas song title. It is also an accurate description of the place where Jesus was born – a tiny, insignificant hamlet. And yet it was there that God chose to come among us as a human being, a helpless baby with legs too weak even to stand, but Who one day would shake the world.

Still today, God continues His work in the world through the smallest and most ordinary of things. First among these is the Holy Mass. The one hour we give to God each Sunday in worship and thanksgiving is such a small part of all the many hours He has given us; but with this small amount of time He accomplishes so much. If you are a Catholic who has been away from Jesus in the weekly Eucharist, then our parish rejoices at your presence here today. We also invite you to return here on Sunday to meet the Lord again. You might wonder if receiving so small a thing as the Communion host each Sunday can really make a difference in your life. But God does His greatest works through the smallest and most ordinary of things, from a tiny baby born in a stable, to a tiny white wafer of Holy Communion.

May God's love find countless "tiny" ways to enter your home and your heart anew in this joyous season.
