The heartfelt gratitude of our parish goes out to all those who made our St. Mary's Christmas 2017 celebrations so very beautiful!

The St. Mary's Adult, Youth, Children, and Contemporary Choirs under the direction of Juan Mesa and Leo Racine respectively, offered glorious music to herald the Savior's birth. Deacons Marty, John, and all the Altar Servers, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, and Ushers brought great reverence and faith to our Christmas Masses. At the Hall Mass, Debra Frey led our children in a beautiful and meaningful Nativity Pageant. Outdoors, the efforts of the St. Mary's Knights of Columbus, and Stumpy's Tree Service provided a grand light display, with the Knights also setting up the lower lights, Manger and Nativity scene.

Inside, the Paltrineri's handmade ribbons adorned our wreaths, Marilyn Lourandos, Bea Hait, Cindy Pratt, Katie Smith, and Tristan Torres oversaw the decoration of the church Christmas tree (also put up by the Knights), while Ann Connoni set up the Nativity scene before our altar. Bob Connoni, Mark and Will Harrington put up all the wreaths in the Church.

Eileen Kampersal and Meghan Robshaw assisted by Mary Theresa Whalen, Jenna and Nicholas Calabrese decorated the family tree in the Parish Center Lobby using all the lovely ornaments created several years ago by members of the Spirited Hands Craft Group. A wonderful team of many volunteers (too numerous to name) helped Najat Whalen, Linda Truitt, Marjorie Graham and Bea Hait arrange the poinsettias on the Altar and in Father Haley Hall.

The old adage that "many hands make light work" was certainly true this year as we were able to quickly change the church from the solemnity of Advent to the celebration of Christmas. A sincere thank you to everyone who helped out.

On behalf of the retired priests of our Archdiocese, we thank everyone who contributed to the 2017 Christmas collection which came to \$20,577. While very grateful, it must be noted that this was a \$7,237 drop from last Christmas' 2016 collection which was \$27,814. This is a drop of 26% in a single year. (2015 was \$27,909). Given that we know our people value our retired priests, we surmise that this drop was caused by the bad weather Christmas Eve and Day.

Due to this being St. Mary's smallest Christmas Collection in 11 years, and the importance of this collection in the lives of our retired priests, we encourage anyone who may have been away from St. Mary's this Christmas, to please make their Christmas offering now. This may be done by mailing it to 8 Church Street, or placing it in any Mass collection. In either case, it must be in a separate envelope clearly labeled "Christmas Collection" in order to differentiate it from the parish offertory.

Anyone who did make a Christmas offering, but would like to do a little more in light of the shortfall, may do so in the same manner. Thank you for being there for our retired priests, who gave their lives in faithful service to God's people.

We thank anyone we may have forgotten to mention here, and most especially we thank all of you who made our Christmas celebrations meaningful by your prayers and presence. May our celebration of Christ's birth bring us all a renewed faith and increase our longing for His return.

January 7, 2018 Feast of the Epiphany

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

On this Feast of Epiphany, we recall the Wise Men who arrived in Bethlehem following a long journey. Just so, every single one of us is on a journey home to God. Yesterday we celebrated the Funeral of Pat Zack, and Monday we will celebrate the Funeral of Bill Hosmer, both devout members of our Parish Family who have now completed their earthly journey. Just as the Wise Men "entered the house and saw the child with Mary his mother," we pray that Pat and Bill will now see Jesus and Mary face to face. Just as the Wise Men were "overjoyed" at what they found in Bethlehem, so may Pat and Bill now experience that perfect joy and peace which we can only know when at last we go home to God.

Scripture tells us that the Wise Men brought gifts for the newborn Christ – Gold, to show that He was a King; Frankincense, used in worship, to show that He was God; and Myrrh, a funerary ointment, to show that Jesus was mortal, and that one day He would die to save us from our sins. The truest gifts are always sacrificial, requiring us to give of that which is most precious to us. We remember therefore on this Feast of Epiphany that Jesus was God's great gift to the world, His only and beloved Son.

The gift of Jesus is one that we are all called to share, particularly by our willingness to forgive others even as He has forgiven us by the shedding of His blood. Over and over again, the scriptures call on those who are "cherishing" anger and resentment in their hearts to turn these things over to God. Job 36:13 "The godless in heart cherish anger; they do not cry for help." Psalm 66:18 "If I had cherished vengeance in my heart, the Lord would not have listened." If on this Epiphany Sunday we are cherishing some grudge or enmity, holding it tight to us like a treasure, then that is the very gift that Jesus most desires us to lay down at His manger this year.

May the Lord of Our Journey continue to bless you and yours.

EPIPHANY BLESSING OF THE HOME WITH CHALK

In the Middle Ages, it was customary for Catholics to bless their homes for the New Year on the Feast of the Epiphany. The family would walk in procession from room to room, the father carrying a plate with burning incense, the oldest son carrying holy water to sprinkle each room, the youngest child carrying a piece of chalk that had been blessed at Epiphany Mass that morning.

The chalk was used to inscribe the doorway to the family home with the New Year, three crosses, and the letters **C M B**. These letters are the initials of the three Wise Men that came bearing gifts to the Christ child on the first Epiphany – Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. In Latin, the letters also represent a prayer – "Christus Mansionem Benedicat", "May Christ bless this house".

The tradition of blessing the doorway with Epiphany chalk symbolizes the family's commitment to welcome Christ into their home throughout the New Year. It is a beautiful reminder that every Catholic home should be a "little church" – a house of prayer where the presence of Christ is made visible, and from which His love shines forth into the neighborhood. Just as the three Wise Men welcomed Jesus at His birth, so too must we seek always to welcome Him into our homes and lives.

Again this year, St. Mary's is pleased to provide blessed chalk at all Epiphany Masses. Each parish family is invited to take home a piece of chalk to inscribe the outside lintel or top of the door most frequently used to enter their house. The whole family should be assembled for the blessing.

BLESSING OF THE HOME WITH CHALK

On the lintel of the door the leader writes:

20 + C + M + B + 18

Leader: **20** + In this New Year of Our Lord and God We honor Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Leader: C + May all who come to our house this year

All: Find Christ living among us.

Leader: **M** + May our home be a place of faith All: A dwelling of goodness, love and peace.

Leader: \mathbf{B} + Bless this house and all who inhabit it

All: Fill us with a concern for others that we may reflect your love.

Leader: 18 In this year of Our Lord and God

All: Bless all the members of this household and surround them with your protection.

Leader: Lord, God of heaven and earth, You revealed Your Only-Begotten Son to every nation by the

guidance of a star. Grant that those who live in this house will be a light of truth and goodness.

We ask this through Christ our Lord, Amen.



HOLY HOUR FOR LIFE: A Holy Hour for Life will be held on Thursday, January 18 at 7:30 PM in the Church. The Holy Hour is part of the Archdiocesan observance of the National Day of Prayer and Penance marking the anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's decision legalizing abortion on demand. This Holy Hour will be held at parishes throughout the Archdiocese to pray for safe travel and a successful pilgrimage to Washington DC for all those attending the annual March for Life.

Our Holy Hour, led by Deacon John, will include Adoration, praise and worship. We will pray together for those who have been wounded by abortion, for respect for the dignity of human life from conception to natural death, and that those who govern us may be guided by justice, truth, and a love for the gift of life. The Holy Hour for Life, held in parishes throughout the greater Boston area, is organized by Boston Deacons for Life in collaboration with the Pro Life Office of the Archdiocese of Boston. Please join us, all are welcome.

POPE FRANCIS ON THE EPIPHANY: "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we have observed his star in the East, and have come to worship him" (Mt 2:2). With these words, the Magi, come from afar, tell us the reason for their long journey: they came to worship the newborn King. To see and to worship. These two actions stand out in the Gospel account. We saw a star and we want to worship.

These men saw a star that made them set out. The discovery of something unusual in the heavens sparked a whole series of events. The star did not shine just for them, nor did they have special DNA to be able to see it. As one of the Church Fathers rightly noted, the Magi did not set out because they had seen the star, but they saw the star because they had already set out (cf. Saint John Chrysostom). Their hearts were open to the horizon and they could see what the heavens were showing them, for they were guided by an inner restlessness. They were open to something new.



The Magi thus personify all those who believe, those who long for God, who yearn for their home, their heavenly homeland. They reflect the image of all those who in their lives have not let their hearts become anesthetized. A holy longing for God wells up in the heart of believers because they know that the Gospel is not an event of the past but of the present. A holy longing for God helps us keep alert in the face of every attempt to reduce and impoverish our life. A holy longing for God is the memory of faith, which rebels before all prophets of doom. That longing keeps hope alive in the community of believers, which from week to week continues to plead: "Come, Lord Jesus".

This same longing led the elderly Simeon to go up each day to the Temple, certain that his life would not end before he had held the Saviour in his arms. This longing led the Prodigal Son to abandon his self-destructive lifestyle and to seek his father's embrace. This was the longing felt by the shepherd who left the ninety-nine sheep in order to seek out the one that was lost. Mary Magdalen experienced the same longing on that Sunday morning when she ran to the tomb and met her risen Master.

Longing for God draws us out of our iron-clad isolation, which makes us think that nothing can change. Longing for God shatters our dreary routines and impels us to make the changes we want and need. Longing for God has its roots in the past yet does not remain there: it reaches out to the future. Believers who feel this longing are led by faith to seek God, as the Magi did, in the most distant corners of history, for they know that there the Lord awaits them. They go to the peripheries, to the frontiers, to places not yet evangelized, to encounter their Lord. Nor do they do this out of a sense of superiority, but rather as beggars who cannot ignore the eyes of those who for whom the Good News is still uncharted territory ...
