January 14, 2018 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

A dramatic change greets us as we enter the church building this weekend. Gone are the evergreens, poinsettias, and lights of the Christmas Season. In their place is the simplicity of Ordinary Time. The term "ordinary" comes from the word "ordinal," meaning "counted". Ordinary Time then, means "counted time," not time that is common or mundane. The count began anew this past Sunday with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and will continue uninterrupted until Ash Wednesday, February 14. We might think of it as a countdown to salvation and the day we stand face to face with God. May we make the best and most generous use of the limited time each of us possesses in this passing life as we prepare for the eternal life to come.

The green color worn during these days of Ordinary Time has traditionally been associated with new life and growth. In Hebrew, for instance, the same word for the color "green" also means "young." Some may remember the beautiful prayer with which the priest and people used to begin every Mass: "Introibo ad altare Dei. Ad deum qui laetificat juventutem meam." "I will go in to the altar of God. To God Who gives joy to my youth." By His Birth, Life, Death and Resurrection, Christ has remade and revitalized the whole world, making us all young in our hope for eternal life in Him.

This weekend our Scriptures share the common theme of "God's call". Samuel is called by God to serve Him as a prophet. The Psalmist cries out his willingness to submit his life to God's plan. St. Paul reminds us that we are all called to keep our minds and bodies pure as dwelling places for the Holy Spirit, while Andrew and Peter answer Jesus' call to "come and see" where He is staying. Occasionally God's call is dramatic and unmistakable. More often it is subtle and needs to be discerned through prayer. But the fact is that God never stops calling each of us to holiness, to particular paths, and to the unique peace that comes from knowing and accomplishing His will.

The boy Samuel at first did not recognize God calling him because "at that time Samuel was not familiar with the Lord." If it has been awhile since you tried to get to know God better and in a new way, consider taking advantage of one of the many adult faith opportunities here at St. Mary's, three of which are highlighted in this weekend's bulletin – FORMED, THE JOY OF THE GOSPEL and THE SAINT AND THE POPE. The more we know of the Lord, the easier it becomes to recognize His call and movement in our lives.

May the Lord of Our Journey continue to bless you and yours.

P.S. In honor of Martin Luther King, the American flag has been placed in our sanctuary this weekend and the closing Mass hymn is the Battle Hymn of the Republic. This song was first associated with efforts to end slavery and then with the Civil Rights movement. Recent months have revealed the deep divide that still exists between the races in our country, and the need to educate ourselves and the next generation as to the equality and dignity of all human persons before God. This includes the innocent unborn, for whom we will pray as a Parish at our Holy Hour for Life this coming Thursday, January 18, and for whom the whole Church will pray on Monday, January 22. In the end, peace will only come when all human life is recognized and reverenced as a precious and inviolate gift.

- Click "REGISTER". The page will change and you are in a new window.
- Enter the Parish Access Code: NW3N3Q (all caps).
- 5. Enter your personal Email address.
- Another window opens and you will be asked to enter your First and Last Name, Job (Parishioner), Address, State, and Zip Code.
- Enter your <u>Password</u> (twice for verification) *please write this down.
- 8. You will then be asked to verify your Email.
- 9. Go and check your Email box and verify.
- Once you verify your Email you will be in the FORMED page.
- 11. Now LOGIN: Enter your Email Address and Password. Enjoy the various programs!


