3rd Sunday of Lent

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

"Contemptus Mundi." This spiritual phrase means not "contempt" for the world – but rather "detachment" from the world. The world is a blessed thing, created good by God, then corrupted, but still the place in which God calls each of us to serve Him. The trick is to live in the world while not being "of" the world. The world is fine – "worldliness," can become a deadly distraction.

Jesus makes this very clear in today's Gospel by His reaction to the money changers and purveyors of livestock in the great temple of Jerusalem. Both were necessary to the Jewish worship of that day – money changers were needed to change the Roman coins with their graven images of the emperor into coins acceptable as temple offerings. Similarly, the animals were necessary to purchase as sacrifices to God.

But these things which in and of themselves were innocuous, had become corrupted. The money changers charged extortion rates. The livestock for sacrifice had to be purchased from the temple flocks so you had to pay a lot more for them. Even worse, all this commercial activity had moved from the outer courtyard to the inside of the temple itself. It was a distraction from prayer, as merchants winked at godly values in order to make quick cash.

And so Jesus drives forth those who had desecrated His Father's house, showing us by His actions never to let the things of this world get too strong a hold over us. Money, clothes, houses, cars, popularity, position - anything that we find ourselves valuing more than a holy relationship with God and neighbor, needs to be returned to its proper priority.

In a sense, the purification of the temple by Jesus is a model for what you and I are to accomplish during these 40 Days of Lent. Contemptus Mundi – detachment, from the things of this world. We do it by fasting – not just on the 2 required days of Ash Wednesday and Good Friday – but frequently, as our health allows. We do it by giving to the poor, not just out of our surplus, but sacrificially – in ways that have a real impact on the way we live. We do it by turning our eyes away from our possessions, and the riches of our neighbors – in order to raise our eyes to heaven in prayer. Heaven, our true home, and final destination.

Jesus used a whip fashioned of chords to purify the temple. And in the same way we take up the Lenten chords of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving – to drive away this world's influence over us. To remind ourselves that we are not citizens of this world trying to make our way to heaven, but rather that we are citizens of heaven trying to make our way through this world.

May the Lord of Our Journey continue to bless you and yours.

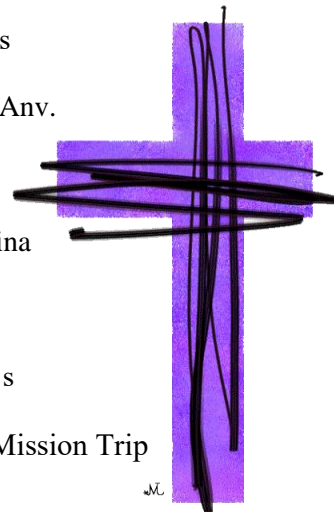

LENTEN PENANCE SERVICE: Monday, March 12 at 6:30 PM. Additionally, Confessions will be heard every Saturday from Noon -12:45 PM, excepting Holy Saturday on which sacraments are not celebrated before the Great Easter Vigil that night. In this beautiful Sacrament we experience the fullness of God's mercy, healing and peace.

PRAYING PSALM 51, THE MISERERE ~ Sunday, March 18, at 6:30 PM in the Church. Join us as our Pastor Fr. Mark Coiro, offers a reflection on Psalm 51. Known as the "Miserere," this Psalm is prayed every Friday morning as part of the Church's Liturgy of the Hours. Attributed to King David, it is one of the most eloquent expressions of human repentance and the awesome, healing mercy of God. Join us as we dig deeper into the history and meaning of this Psalm, reflecting together on the forgiveness of God available to all who long for His pardon. LENTEN RESOURCE FROM THE CREATION CARE TEAM: The Global Catholic Climate Movement has created a calendar for a Lenten Fast for Creation. TAIZÉ SERVICE: Friday, March 9, 7:30-8:30 PM. Join us for an hour of musical prayer following the tradition of the Taizé community. This service incorporates the singing of easy and memorable refrains, which are repeated to create an atmosphere of prayer and contemplative meditation. Modeled after the practice of the Taizé community in France, the goal of this repetitive singing is to help us contemplate a single aspect of God.

FAURE REQUIEM MASS: Friday, March 16 at 7:00 PM in St. Mary's Church. This Lent, St. Mary's Adult Choir will perform the Requiem Mass by Gabriel Fauré. The Requiem by the French composer Gabriel Fauré (1845-1924) is perhaps one of the best known musical settings of the Requiem Mass, and the best-known work by the composer. The term "Requiem" designates a musical setting of the Catholic Mass of the Dead. "Requiem" in this sense is used as an abbreviation for the words that comprise the opening of the Introit for the Mass of the Dead, "Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domine," which means: "Grant them eternal rest, O Lord." Composed in seven movements, Fauré's Requiem provides a musical setting for every one of the sung portions of the ordinary of the Latin Mass (Introit and Kyrie, Offertory, Sanctus, Agnus Dei) and, in addition, for two texts which are exclusive to the Mass of the Dead: Libera me, and In Paradisum. Fauré composed this work between 1887-1888 and premiered it at the church of the Madeleine in Paris in 1888 for a Funeral Mass. It was not until 1931, however, that the work was first performed in the U.S., quickly gaining popularity after its North-American premiere.

Just as it was first performed in France, we will offer this work in the context of the celebration of Mass, accompanied by the beautiful St. Mary's organ. The Mass and music are in honor of our beloved friend Patrick D. McDonald (1944-2017), who was an active parishioner at St. Mary's Church for 43 years. Patrick, an avid lover of music and choral singer, wished that the Fauré Requiem could be performed for his Funeral Mass, which took place in August 14, 2017. Unable to fulfill his request at that time, we decided to remember him by performing the work in the context of a Mass on the eve of St. Patrick's Day, March 16, 2018. All are invited to this moment of sacred music and prayer.

FRIDAY ABSTINENCE: Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on all Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be used at all.

Persecuted Christians In The Holy Land

This weekend St. Mary's will support our fellow Christians in the Holy land as we have the opportunity to purchase their olive wood carvings. The Christian communities in the Holy Land are currently experiencing

unprecedented persecution by extremist Jewish groups (including arson attacks against churches), and discriminatory practices by the Israeli Government. The latter came to a head this past week, as a "Church Land Bill" was proposed that would tax out of Church ownership properties not used solely for worship and authorize the seizure of properties previously sold by the Church to non-Church entities. So grave is this threat, that the Church of the Holy Sepulcher – containing both Calvary and Jesus' Tomb, was closed in protest. Please take some time to familiarize yourself with the situation of Christians in the Holy Land, already vastly reduced in numbers since the formation of the Israeli State, but now experiencing persecution at unprecedented levels.

Statement on Municipal threats and the discriminatory “Church Lands Bill”

The heads of Churches in charge of the Holy Sepulcher and the Status Quo governing the various Christian Holy Sites in Jerusalem, are following with great concern the systematic campaign against the Churches and the Christian community in the Holy Land, in flagrant violation of the existing Status Quo.

We, the heads of Churches in charge of the Holy Sepulcher and the Status Quo governing the various Christian Holy Sites in Jerusalem - the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate, the Custody of the Holy Land and the Armenian Patriarchate - are following with great concern the systematic campaign against the Churches and the Christian community in the Holy Land, in flagrant violation of the existing Status Quo.

Recently, this systematic and offensive campaign has reached an unprecedented level as the Jerusalem municipality issued scandalous collection notices and orders of seizure of Church assets, properties and bank accounts for alleged debts of punitive municipal taxes. A step that is contrary to the historic position of the Churches within the Holy City of Jerusalem and their relationship with the civil authorities. These actions breach existing agreements and international obligations which guarantee the rights and the privileges of the Churches, in what seems as an attempt to weaken the Christian presence in Jerusalem. The greatest victims in this are those impoverished families who will go without food and housing, as well as the children who will be unable to attend school.

The systematic campaign of abuse against Churches and Christians reaches now its peak as a discriminatory and racist bill that targets solely the properties of the Christian community in the Holy Land is being promoted. This abhorrent bill is set to advance today in a meeting of a ministerial committee which if approved would make the expropriation of the lands of churches possible. This reminds us all of laws of a similar nature which were enacted against the Jews during dark periods in Europe.

This systematic and unprecedented attack against Christians in the Holy Land severely violates the most basic, ab antiquo and sovereign rights, trampling on the delicate fabric of relations between the Christian community and the authorities for decades.

THEREFORE, and recalling the Statement of the Patriarchs and Heads of Local Churches in Jerusalem, dated 14 February, 2018 and their previous statement of September 2017, as a measure of protest, we decided to take this unprecedented step of closure of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.

Together with all Heads of Churches in the Holy Land we stand united, firm and resolute in protecting our rights and our properties.

May the Holy Spirit answer our prayers and bring a resolution to this historic Crisis in our Holy City.
