Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

"Two roads diverged in a wood, and I - I took the one less traveled by. And that has made all the difference."

Most of us are familiar with these beautiful words by Robert Frost, and as Christmas now comes rushing upon us they are worth considering. There are in fact two very distinct roads by which we may arrive at Christmas. The wider, more traveled road is paved exclusively with shopping, decorating, socializing and every kind of worldly distraction. It is a road that consumes our time with busyness and the accumulation of things. It is a road that brings us to December 25 feeling stressed and spiritually exhausted for having traveled it.

There is, however, another road - the road of Advent, which when deliberately travelled can bring us closer in love to Jesus, the One Whose birth we are preparing to celebrate. This road is less popular and at times less convenient. But at its end waits a Christmas full of peace and a renewed sense of joy and wonder at God's greatest gift - the gift of His Only Beloved Son.

I encourage you this December to choose the road of Advent. Make a good Confession, especially if it's been awhile. Read completely one of the Gospels, they are shorter and richer than you think. Take home a daily Advent prayer book from the church after Sunday Mass. And if Mass has been missing from your life, know that you are wanted, welcome and that we have been holding your place for you at the Table of the Lord. This Advent perhaps make a special family trip to select items for the poor through Give A Gift. Or come together to add your voices to the magnificent Lessons & Carols Celebration.

Do something **new**, opening up to God in a way you haven't for a long while or maybe even never at all. Take the road less traveled by, the road of faith, the road of sacrificial love that Jesus walked before us. And when Christmas finally comes, you will discover that truly it "has made all the difference."

Confession is a healing encounter with Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins. The Lord's mercy, healing and grace are given to us through this encounter. In it Jesus also strengthens us to resist future or ongoing temptation. The Sacrament of Confession is a moment of accountability for us and before the Lord. The Lord's forgiveness and mercy is infinite. Nothing we have done or could do can ever separate us from experiencing God's forgiveness through this sacrament. Confession will also continue to be offered each Saturday in the church from Noon to 12:45 PM.

December 7 & 8, after all Weekend Masses. Long rows of tables will be set up in Fr. Haley Hall - tables loaded down with over 2,000 delicious homemade cookies baked by St. Mary's Middle School Youth Group Members. For \$8, you may purchase an empty cookie bag, then "walk" down the rows of tables and select a dozen cookies which MSYG youths (wearing plastic gloves) will place in your bag. All proceeds will benefit the poor of Haiti, a deeply impoverished nation rocked by political collapse, horrific gang violence, and multiple natural disasters. LITTLE BETHLEHEM CHRISTIANS OLIVE WOOD OFFERINGS ~ After all Masses

December 21 & 22 in the Parish Center Lobby. In 2003, the Alsahouri Family fled the fighting in Bethlehem between Palestinians and Israelis,

finding a new home in the United States. Christians used to make up 80% of the population of Bethlehem, but many have been forced to flee. Now less than 10% of Bethlehem's residents are Christian, with 200 of those families supporting themselves by carving religious articles of olive wood. The Alsahouri's then sell some of these artworks in Catholic parishes in the United States. We are delighted to welcome them with their beautiful olive wood creations for sale just in time for Christmas!
