Pastor's Christmas Greeting

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Christmas Greetings in the Lord! I pray that today's celebration of our Saviour's birth may find you joyful, hopeful and at peace with God and neighbor.

I offer a special welcome to those who are visitors to St. Mary's. If visiting from afar we wish you safe travels. If local, we invite you to join us again for Holy Mass – that awesome mystery and gift by which the same Jesus Who was once born in Bethlehem, comes down to us anew each Sunday to be with and sustain His people.

As we look at this year's Christmas bulletin cover, we see a Nativity scene with one unusual detail. While the figures of Mary and the angels are gazing adoringly at the newborn Christ Child - Joseph is not. Instead, he is looking intently heavenward, his aspect one of reverent prayer. What is Joseph saying to God? We cannot know for certain what the artist intended, but I think that Joseph is offering a prayer of thanksgiving. Thanksgiving for a safe delivery. Thanksgiving for the gift of a healthy, beautiful baby. Thanksgiving above all that after long ages of darkness, finally God had sent a Saviour to enlighten the world.

As Catholics, we take time each week to stop and do exactly what Joseph did – to give thanks to God, Who is the source of every good thing in our lives. The word Eucharist literally means “thanksgiving.” And that hour we dedicate to God each Sunday in sacred worship is our thanksgiving to Him for every breath, every moment, every beauty, every joy, every love, every grace received. Far from being a burden, the Mass is the great gift by which God *relieves* our burdens and refreshes our souls. It is a source of light and hope and goodness in a world that seems to become darker and uglier every day. If we lose the Sunday Mass in our lives, then our Catholic faith becomes a pale reflection of what God intends for it to be. It is no longer the strong help and blessing that we *need* it to be.

For me this Christmas is rather bittersweet, as my home parish of St. Bernard's in Simsbury, CT just closed a few weeks ago. I received my Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation there, and it was while ministering as an Altar Server at St. Bernard's that I first felt the stirrings of a priestly vocation. A few times a year, when visiting home, I would still go to Mass at St. Bernard's. I was no longer a regular there, but it was always very nostalgic to worship in the place where my faith began. Unfortunately, nostalgia cannot keep a parish alive. Less and less people attended St. Bernard's on Sundays, less and less people made their weekly stewardship contributions, and on December 12, 2018, Mass was celebrated there for the very last time. Today, Christmas Day, my home parish is shuttered, silent and dark.

So, as we gather here at our bright and beautiful St. Mary's this Christmas, I ask you to consider this question. Are you here today out of nostalgia? Or are you here because you are committed to your Catholic faith? This question will be answered not by words, but by your presence or absence at Mass next Sunday and the Sabbaths that follow. It will be answered by the value you place on hearing God's Word each week, receiving His Eucharist and living out your faith as part of a community of believers. If Joseph was filled with gratitude at Jesus' birth, then how much more should we desire to thank God for Jesus' life – a life He laid down in order to save us from our sins?

Christmas is really all about commitment. It was through the Incarnation and birth of His Son that God proved His commitment to us. By taking on our human nature as His own, God demonstrated that He would be *for* us and *with* us forever, no matter what should come. In Jesus' own words, “Behold, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world.” (Mt. 28:20) And so this Christmas, I ask you to consider your commitment to Jesus, the One Whose birth we have gathered to celebrate. I ask you to consider your commitment to the Church, Jesus' Living Body. I ask you to hear again the words of Jesus as He gathered with His disciples in the upper room for Passover. When He taught His followers how to give thanks to God - by listening to the Scriptures and sharing the bread made His Body and the wine made His Blood. When Jesus said at that very First Mass, “Do this, in memory of me.”
