Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Rejoice! Rejoice for the Lord has risen as He promised! Rejoice because death has forever lost its power over us! Rejoice to gather together on this holiest of days, united as the Church in our Savior's love! Rejoice!

St. Mary's has special cause for rejoicing this weekend as we receive a new brother into the Catholic faith. Please welcome Alexander Barberio, who is receiving First Communion and Confirmation at our Easter Vigil. Please also congratulate parishioner Sophia Lindsay as she makes her First Communion at that same celebration. Always, the initiation of new persons into the Church invites us to consider our own place as members of the Living Body of Christ. To be a Catholic is to be part of a community of believers who are committed to assisting one another as we journey together in the Lord. It's not by accident that Jesus never sent His disciples off alone, but always two by two. In this way, they were able to support and encourage each another along the difficult but royal road of the Cross – the way of forgiveness and sacrificial love that alone will bring us safely home to God.

Today's Gospel tells us that on the first Easter morning when Mary Magdalene came alone to the tomb and found it empty she was filled with distress. In contrast, when Peter and the Beloved Disciple ran to the tomb together, they began to believe in the Resurrection. The simple lesson here is that we are not meant to seek Christ alone. That is why the faster, Beloved Disciple waited for Peter to catch up before entering the tomb. It is when we seek the Risen Lord together as Church that faith and hope unfold most readily before us. Nowhere is this truth more evident than when we gather each week for Sunday Eucharist – the Sacrament and mystery by which we are united to Christ and one another. Jesus is risen, but when we gather in His Holy Name and receive together the precious gift of His Body and Blood, He is with us still.



SILVER JUBILEE: This Spring our Pastor, Fr. Mark Coiro, is one of six Boston Priests celebrating his Silver Jubilee. He was ordained to the priesthood 25 years ago, on May 21, 1994. In the Catholic tradition, priests celebrate their 25th and 50th Anniversaries. Fr. Mark was installed as the Pastor of St. Mary's thirteen years ago, meaning that more than half of his priestly service has been to the people of our parish. He is also the first priest in our Parish's long history to minister here alone, having been "solo" at St. Mary's for the past ten years. All are invited to Fr. Mark's Silver Jubilee Mass, on the Feast of Pentecost, Sunday, June 9, at 11:30 AM. A reception luncheon will follow in Fr. Haley Hall.

The Silver Jubilee Mass will be concelebrated by a number of Fr. Mark's brother priests, including several formerly assigned to St. Mary's. Bishop Mark O'Connell will also be a participant. This 25th Anniversary is a wonderful opportunity to thank Father for the countless ways he has served our people over the years – in our times both of joy and of sorrow.

Knowing of his love of travel, a group of parishioners is organizing a special 25th Anniversary gift for Fr. Mark in the form of a trip to Rome.
