

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today Jesus gives us His great commandment to *"love one another as He loved us."* It's a frightening proposition, because who among us loves everybody? Happily, we don't have to like people, in order to love them in the way that Jesus meant. Love as action is what Jesus talks about here. *I give you a new commandment,*" says Jesus. And commandments govern our actions, not our emotions. We cannot command someone to love somebody else in their heart – to have a warm fuzzy affection for them. That's just not human nature. But it is always possible to treat another person in a loving fashion.

It's the kind of love which finds expression in kindness, courtesy, tolerance, and forgiveness of those around us. Jesus calls us to love one another in the way that we treat others, and in so doing to reveal His love to the world. *"A new commandment I give to you: that you should love one another, even as I have loved you."*

Jesus loved us in many specific ways that He expects us to imitate: His generosity, His hospitality, His charity, His willingness to forgive. He also loved us by taking joy in our successes. We have a beautiful reminder of that truth in the Mass, when right before receiving Communion we say, *"Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."* It's a direct quote from Matthew 8:8, when the centurion begs Jesus to heal his paralyzed servant. When Jesus offers to come to his house, the centurion says he is not worthy, and believes that just by giving the command; Jesus can heal the servant from afar. And Jesus is delighted.

There were so many times that people let Jesus down, that they didn't understand Him, that they disappointed Him. But on that occasion – the centurion got it. And Jesus praises Him saying, *"Not in all of Israel have I found faith like this."*

One of the ways that Jesus loved us, then, was by taking joy in our successes. And that is one of the ways that He expects us to love one another - that we rejoice in each other's successes instead of being envious of them. St. Francis of Assisi actually said that the thing that makes it hardest for us to love each other as Jesus loved us is the presence of envy in our hearts.

We might envy people's worldly success, good looks, popularity, money, a bigger house than ours, athletic ability, whatever. We might even envy their spiritual success - it's not unknown for one person to resent another whose faith seems to come to them more easily. But if we desire, enviously, what our neighbor has, we come to resent our neighbor. We become unable to rejoice in their good fortune. We find it hard to fulfill Jesus' commandment to love others as He has loved us.

St. John Vianney warned that envy fosters "a prideful heart," which is a heart that will find it harder and harder to love, because it looks down on others. And he offered this beautiful advice: *"If you are envious of another – weaken the envy in this way. Make to God a prayer of thanksgiving for your neighbor's good fortune. Say to God, 'Lord, You are the source of every good thing. I thank you that my neighbor has been so blessed, for in their blessing, I see revealed Your love.'"*

May the Lord of Our Easter Journey continue to bless you and yours.

Online Giving is now available for St. Mary's Parishioners through **WeShare**, an easy and convenient way to save time and support your Parish. Donating is simple and completely secure.

With **WeShare**, you can set up a recurring weekly or monthly transaction using your checking, savings, **or credit card account**.

The benefits of online giving with **WeShare** include web access at all times, the ability to schedule your payments to coincide with your pay period, and the ease of adjusting your contributions at any time.

You can allocate different amounts for different collections and make your donations one-time or recurring. You can setup **WeShare** yourself using their secure web site, which will give you the ability to look at your giving history whenever you wish.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are we being asked for?

St. Mary's offertory has declined and not kept up with the cost of operating our parish. For the first time since 2010 we are respectfully asking all parishioners to consider increasing their weekly or regular support through the offertory so that our parish can better serve parishioners and the community, while fulfilling its financial responsibilities.

What does my offertory support pay for?

Offertory provides the operating income of the parish. It pays the regular, necessary expenses of the community, including but not limited to utilities, salaries, benefits, liturgical supplies, supplies for outreach ministries, religious education materials, maintenance repairs to the property, etc.

Why do I need to fill out a Pledge Form?

This is a non-binding "pledge" of your support to your parish through the offertory. The Pledge Form helps our parish budget for the next year based on the increase indicated by parishioners. It is not a request for a large financial gift at this time, but rather tells the parish how much you hope to give each week throughout the year.

How do I fulfill my offertory pledge?

You may fulfill your pledge through envelopes, automatic giving, online giving, or check or cash. Online giving is the best way to ensure that you give consistently according to your wishes. You can adjust your regular contribution online at any time. Automatic Giving through your bank also maintains regular giving, while envelopes are also helpful for consistency. While appreciated, cash and loose checks do not provide you a tax statement, or a reminder to make up missed weekly support if you are away on a given weekend.

What if I can't fulfill my pledge?

Your commitment is not a binding pledge, it is simply for planning purposes. Life takes unexpected turns and finances are often tight. It is understandable if you have to refrain from fulfilling your commitment for a time. Please know that we are constantly praying for the temporal well-being of our parishioners. Thank you!

Feast Day Masses, Thurs., May 30, at 9:00 AM & 7:00 PM

The Feast of the Ascension of Jesus Christ is celebrated each year on the fortieth day after the Feast of Pascha (Easter). Since the date of Pascha changes each year, the date of the Feast of the Ascension also changes. The Feast is always celebrated on a Thursday, and marks an event of such importance that it is a Holy Day of Obligation. This means that Catholics attend Mass this day as on a Sunday. The Feast itself commemorates when, on the fortieth day after His Resurrection, Jesus led His disciples to the Mount of Olives, and after blessing them and asking them to wait for the fulfillment of the promise of the Holy Spirit, He ascended into heaven. Where He has gone, we hope one day to follow.


