Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today our Gospel presents us with the "Good Samaritan," a model of compassion to those in need. Most of us upon hearing this parable take it as a lesson on how we are to respond generously to all persons in distress. But so often we are the wounded ones, the traveler lying beside the road having been beat up by the trials and vicissitudes of life. St. Augustine interpreted the parable in just this way saying, "*The man who journeyed from Jerusalem to Jericho represents humanity, you and me. Jericho beckoned and we left the holy city. But along the way, robbers attacked us and dumped us in a ditch, naked and half-dead. The robbers are the demons and the temptations of this world. Jesus - the Good Samaritan - shows compassion. He bandages our wounds and takes us to an inn, his Church. He gives the innkeeper two coins, the great commandments: to love God and to love ones neighbor.*"

The image of the Good Samaritan takes on special meaning this weekend as we send forth 54 St. Mary's teens and adult leaders as Missionaries to Gainesville, Florida from July 14-21. They will be based at a Catholic Heart Work Camp, doing outreach in the surrounding communities. Among other projects, our teens and chaperones will build wheelchair ramps, prepare and serve food at a homeless shelter, visit and assist the elderly with their homes, and paint several damaged churches. Throughout the week, our Mission Team will live in community and experience an exciting spiritual program designed to "foster the Catholic Faith of each participant through the sacraments, prayer and involvement in social service."

The teens and chaperones touch many lives as they serve the poor and needy, while at the same time strengthening their relationship with Jesus Christ. Please pray for their safety and that they will truly be Good Samaritans to the people they serve. Let those of us not going to Florida redouble our efforts to look for hurting persons right here in our midst. Let us consider whom we may have "walked by," whom we may have dismissed as unworthy or unconnected to us, just like the Levite and priest walked right past the injured traveler on the road.

May the Lord of Our Journey continue to bless you and yours.

THE MARY QUEEN OF HEAVEN MISSIONARIES was established to address the cruelest result of impoverishment in the Philippines. Young girls being forced into the sex trafficking trade due to poverty. Girls ages 8 to 15 are locked in rooms and exposed to rape, diseases and murder. Many die quite young before they even have a chance to live. Through perfect love and charity, the determined nuns of MQHM have developed a two-fold plan to combat these atrocities:

1 HOME OF LOVE:

We rescue children and young women from prostitution. We rescue as many women and children as possible and bring them to The Home of Love. Once there, they are safe, receive shelter and rehabilitation, while being educated and older girls are taught a respectable trade to provide for themselves and in many cases their families.

2 REGINA COELI EDUCATION PROGRAM:

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

RCIA: The **R**ite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is for anyone interested in exploring the Catholic faith. This includes Christians of other faiths, non-Baptized persons, persons Baptized Catholic but who never received their First Communion, Confirmation or both. The first part of RCIA is called "Inquiry," an opportunity to learn about the faith and ask questions in an informal and supportive setting. At a certain point, individuals then decide if they wish to continue RCIA in preparation for receiving their Sacraments of Initiation at the great Easter Vigil. RCIA meets roughly twice a month with the schedule tailored to the needs of each year's candidate group. Catholic spouses or fiancés are more than welcome to attend, often coming as a couple. THE FIRST PILLAR OF THE CHURCH – THE

CREED: The word *creed* comes from the Latin Credo, means "I believe." During the early centuries the Church issued official creeds for the early communities known as the Apostles Creed and the Nicene Creed. Both of these creeds profess our faith today as they did centuries ago. The Nicene Creed professes our faith in the Triune God and formulates doctrines about God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the Church, salvation and our final destiny. Heresies arose in the early Church that denied Christ's divinity. One such heresy by an Egyptian priest, Arius, denied that Jesus, the Son, always existed with the Father. Thus, Arius denied the divinity of Christ. As a result of this heresy the Emperor Constantine convoked the Council of Nicaea (325) which declared the divinity of Christ by issuing the Nicene Creed. The Council of Constantinople (381) solidified what we profess today.
