The WINGS ministry provides an opportunity for women of all ages to deepen their faith, no matter where they are on their spiritual journey. Our first speaker is Kathy Stebbins, Retired Coordinator of Youth Ministry in the Archdiocese of Boston. Kathy will share how her life's work as a Youth Minister influenced her faith and increased her trust in God. She will also share effective ways to help our youth grow in their

RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is for anyone interested in exploring the Catholic faith. This includes Christians of other faiths, non-Baptized persons, persons Baptized Catholic but who never received their First Communion, Confirmation or both. The first part of RCIA is called "Inquiry," an opportunity to learn about the faith and ask questions in an informal and supportive setting. At a certain point, individuals then decide if they wish to continue RCIA in preparation for receiving their Sacraments of Initiation at the great Easter Vigil. RCIA meets roughly twice a month with the schedule tailored to the needs of each year's candidate group. Catholic spouses or fiancés are more than welcome to attend, often coming as a couple. 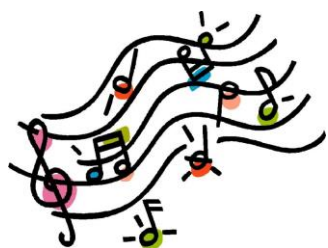
Romans 12:6-8 *Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.*

***All Catholic Ministers are witnesses to their faith, living lives in harmony with its teachings and in all ways seeking to show the love and mercy of Jesus Christ to others.
Most ministries require annual CORI's.***

Lectors: At Mass, the lector, or reader, proclaims the Word of God, the Old and New Testament readings, and presents the petitions during the Prayer of the Faithful. Lectors are men, women and teens of good faith, eager to serve their community. While lectors need not be professionally trained in public communication, certain basic abilities for public speaking are necessary for the lector to proclaim the Word of God in an effective manner to the liturgical assembly. Lectors participate in initial and ongoing skill training and support.

Youth Lectors: The St. Mary's Youth Lector program allows youths in 7th grade or higher to proclaim the Word of God at Mass and at other liturgical celebrations. Youth Lectors are most often assigned to the Sunday 9:30 AM Family Mass, so that the young may minister to their peers. Otherwise the character of the ministry is very much the same as for adult lectors.

Vacation Bible School: VBS is a weeklong celebration of faith. Through song, prayer, arts & crafts, movies, drama and scripture, the children grow in their understanding of God's love. VBS takes place for one week each year in late July, Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM. Exact dates are announced in the spring in the Parish Bulletin and Parish Newsletter.



Music Ministry: Music ministry at St. Mary's Parish involves the work of people of many ages and music of varied traditions. The adult choir sings and leads the assembly with traditional hymnody at the 11:30 AM Sunday Mass. The folk group leads the assembly with contemporary music at the 5:00 PM Mass on Saturday. Children and teens also serve the parish as music ministers on a regular basis at the 9:30 AM Sunday Mass. Groups rehearse weekly, enhancing both the music skills and spiritual development of their members.

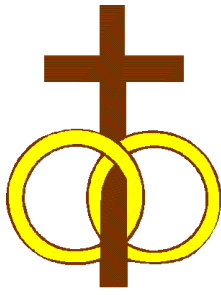
Eucharistic Ministers: The Eucharistic Minister is a person of faith called to bring the body and blood of Christ to his or her fellow Catholic Christians. Eucharistic Ministers serve at our parish Masses and bring communion to those hospitalized at MetroWest Hospital in Framingham. Preparation for this ministry includes both practical training and ongoing spiritual formation.

Altar Servers: The St. Mary's Altar Servers minister at Sunday and Holy Day Masses, as well as at First Communions, weddings and other parish liturgical celebrations. Their presence in the sanctuary is a reminder that the young are an important part of the church, and that Christians of all ages have gifts to offer to God and to our community. Any boy or girl in the 4th to 11th grades may become a server.



Art and Environment: This ministry is responsible for the liturgical decoration of the church, including flowers and plants inside the church and planting and general upkeep of the flowers around the church. The exterior work entails seasonal plantings, clean up and weeding, pruning and dead heading. The interior work entails the care of the green plants in the trough behind the altar and seasonal arrangements of plants and flowers.

Children's Liturgy of the Word: CLOW is held during the 9:30 Mass on Sunday morning. It offers children from Kindergarten and beyond the opportunity to have their own celebration of the Liturgy of the Word. Children leave the main assembly to hear the readings proclaimed from the Catholic Children's Lectionary. They are able to participate in a "dialogue homily". Right now new leaders are urgently needed, and will be welcomed and mentored in the ministry. Materials are provided in advance of the celebrations. Adult Monitors from within the congregation are essential to assist the children's safe movement from the main church to the lower hall. Please stand and join the CLOW group as an adult monitor whenever you see many children with less than 6 adults.



St. Mary's Marriage Fellowship: This is a parish ministry that provides opportunities for married couples to connect and grow together spiritually. The ministry meets monthly for fellowship and a brief reflection on topics related to marriage, raising children, faith formation, and service. Whether you are newly married or have been together for many years, we'd love to meet you! Free onsite childcare will be provided by teen volunteers from St. Mary's confirmation program for couples who have young children. Please plan to bring an appetizer or dessert to share and be certain children have already eaten dinner. We hope you can join us!

Marriage Preparation Team: The St. Mary's Pre-Cana team presents a Marriage Preparation program for engaged couples once a year. Married couples present various topics in a relaxed and supportive setting and facilitate discussions among the engaged couples. New team couples are needed! Come share your experiences and stories or help out in any way. Not sure? Be an observer for our next session.

Ministry to the Homebound: One way in which our parish ministers to those who are "homebound" is to provide the opportunity for regular pastoral visits and the reception of Holy Communion. Pastoral visitors provide support to the homebound person through their presence and careful attention, as well as with prayer and communion. Volunteers are needed for this important ministry.

Religious Education: Our parish Religious Education Program assists parents in the formation of their children and teens in the Catholic faith and Traditions. Through religious instruction and preparation for the sacraments, a continuous spiral approach to faith formation for each grade offers a foundation upon which to build a lifelong relationship with Jesus Christ. Our program depends solely on faith filled volunteer teachers from Pre-K through Grade 10. Please call 508-429-6076 if you can take part in our teaching ministry.

Adult Food Group: Our parish provides a meal for the women guests of Pine Street Inn on a monthly basis. Volunteers are needed one Saturday a month to either cook or serve at the Inn or bake desserts to send with the meal.

Parish Pastoral Council: The Parish Pastoral Council is an advisory group that acts as the "voice" of the people of St. Mary's. Its members assist the pastor by making him aware of the needs, ideas, concerns, and dreams of our parishioners and helps develop plans to address them. The Council meets several Sundays a year from 7:00 to 8:30 PM in the library. Please consider nominating yourself or someone else for this ministry to St. Mary's Parish. We especially welcome young singles, marrieds or parents and/or folks who have background in business planning or strategy who have a love for St. Mary's and our faith.

St. Mary's Newsletter Committee: We fold, label and seal the 2300 St. Mary's Newsletters that are sent every month to all registered St. Mary's parishioners. We meet 11 times a year, and many of our members are retired. We usually meet in the morning after the 9:00 AM. Mass, but that time can change. We have light refreshments: coffee, tea, muffins, and homemade bread. Contributions to the menu are entirely optional. Please come and see if you would like to join, it is a lot of fun!



WINGS: Women in God's Spirit (WINGS) is a faith enrichment group for women of all ages. This group provides an occasion for women to deepen their faith, no matter where they are on their spiritual journey. Participants share the experience that, when we deepen our faith, we grow happier and more content in life. The format features an inspiring speaker presentation followed by small group discussion.

Meetings run from 9:45 am to 11:15 am each Wednesday, beginning September 25 in Fr. Haley Hall through November 6, 2019. Loving childcare is available for younger children. Please know that all women are welcome to WINGS, even if not registered or if unable to come on a regular basis.

St. Mary's Catholic Women's Group: The aim of this group is to offer women of the parish the opportunity to socialize and work to meet some of the charitable needs of the local community. Many of the members crochet and/or knit and make projects not only for their family, but also to raise money to help as needed in the community. Meetings are held monthly and new members are always welcome.

Knights of Columbus: St. Mary's Knights of Columbus Council #14224 is a fraternal organization open to Catholic men ages 18 and older. The Knights, whose core principles are charity, unity, fraternity and patriotism, serve the needs of various communities of St. Mary's parish. We sponsor local charities and youth programs and work to meet parish needs and other worthy causes through fundraising and service. Meetings are held monthly and new members are always welcome.



Respect Life Committee: This committee promotes an awareness of the value of human life from conception to natural death. Some of the activities that the group sponsors are the parish's participation in the October "Respect Life Walk", the Birthright Carnation sale and "Baby Shower" as well as the Respect Life resource board in the Center Hall lobby.

Family Promise Metrowest: St. Mary's is a support congregation in the Family Promise network. FPM is a faith-based, volunteer driven program that helps families in MetroWest who are experiencing temporary homelessness. In Holliston, four times a year, families live for one week at Christ the King Lutheran Church. During those weeks, volunteers from St. Mary's help with meals and other activities designed to assist these families in getting resituated. This is an excellent way to get involved in providing direct support to families in need and interact with those from other faith congregations in Holliston.

Website Committee: Are you website-wise and computer skilled? St. Mary's has an outstanding Parish Website, but it could always be better and webmasters are needed to keep its design and content current and fresh. Parents of Faith and Hope: A faith-based support group for parents of children, teenagers and adults with special needs, and those struggling with depression, severe anxiety and other serious life challenges. Provides prayer, support, discussion, pertinent information and coping strategies in a confidential setting. The group meets two Fridays per month.



Lenten Soup Suppers: On the Friday evenings of Lent, St. Mary's offers parishioners the opportunity to gather for a simple meal and prayer as one way of observing this holy season. We need a person (or two) to coordinate these weekly suppers. More info about the specific tasks will be happily provided to anyone interested. Soup cooks and other helpers are needed, too!

Creation Care Team: (aka the Parish Green Team) is a new ministry group here at St. Mary's Parish which will be affiliated with the Boston Archdiocesan chapter of the Catholic Climate Movement. This committee will offer parishioners the opportunity to learn more about the environmental and economic challenges we face, as highlighted in Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical *Laudato Si*, and offer suggestions on how to meet these challenges as individuals, families and a parish community.



Ushers: A number of St. Mary's Masses are currently short of Ushers. Their role is essential as they collect the offertory, and occasionally assist parishioners with seating. Do you attend the same Mass time most weekends? Then please consider being an usher. Annual CORI's apply.

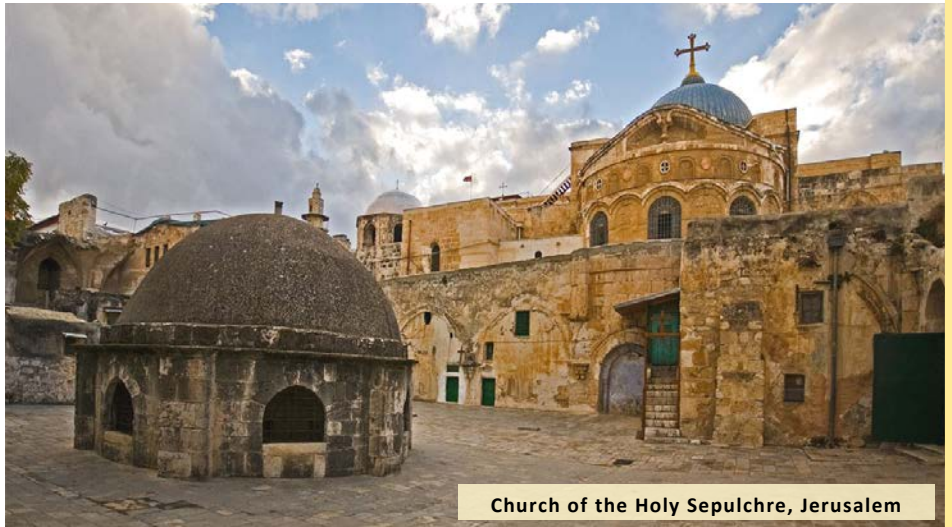

SAMPLE DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Day 1, Fri, Mar 06: Depart for the Holy Land

Make your way to your local airport where you will board your overnight flight. Your meals are served on board.

Day 2, Sat, Mar 07: Arrive in Tel Aviv and continue to Tiberias

Upon arrival at Ben Gurion Airport in Tel Aviv, make your way to the baggage claim area and collect your luggage. Proceed to the arrival's hall, where you will be greeted by your tour guide and/or driver. Transfer to your hotel in Tiberias in time to check-in. Enjoy dinner at the hotel before retiring for the evening.

Day 3, Sun, Mar 08: Caesarea - Stella Maris - Nazareth - Tiberias - Cana

Theme: The Annunciation

Depart Tel Aviv to Caesarea Maritima, one of the three largest ports in the Roman world, next to Alexandria and Piraeus "Athens", which were built by Herod the Great between 21 B.C. and 9 B.C. It was in Caesarea where St. Peter baptized the first gentile convert Cornelius, and where St. Paul gave his defense of the church. From here, we will see the Roman Theater, Herod's Palace, view the Hippodrome, and the harbor from where St. Paul sailed on his journeys. Continue north to Haifa, located on Mt Carmel, where we will visit the Carmelite Shrine dedicated to Our Lady of Mt Carmel, and pray at the cave which Elijah the prophet took refuge. Continue on to Nazareth for lunch, and then visit the Church of the Annunciation. Visit the museum and archaeological garden where we can see the remains of Nazareth at time of Christ, as well as St. Joseph's workshop – which is now known as St. Joseph's Church. Within the Church of the Annunciation, you will make our way down to the Grotto to see the remains of the house of the Blessed Mother, and where the Angel of the Lord announced the good news to Mary. Celebrate Mass in this Church, and then continue on to Cana. It was here that Jesus performed His first miracle, changing water into wine. During your visit at the Wedding Church, married couples will have the chance to take part in the ceremony and renew their wedding vows. From there, we continue on to Tiberias, located on Sea of Galilee, for dinner and overnight.

Day 4, Mon, Mar 09: Tiberias: Sea of Galilee

Theme: The Ministry of Christ in the Galilee

Today begin this day with breakfast at the hotel, followed by a boat ride on the beautiful and scenic Sea of Galilee (Luke 5:1). Upon docking the boat, you will have the opportunity to view the remains of a boat that dates back to the time of Jesus. Following the Sea of Galilee, we continue to the Mount of Beatitudes, where Jesus proclaimed His great Sermon on the Mount (Luke 6:20-49). Near the Mount, is Tabgha, one of Jesus' miracle sites. At Tabgha, Jesus fed the crowd of 5,000 people from five loaves of bread and two fish (Luke 9:10-17). Also, in Tabgha is St. Peter's Primacy where Jesus bestowed church leadership upon Peter (John 21:9). Continue to visit the birthplace of Mary Magdalene in Magdala. During the time of Jesus, this village was a prosperous fishing village that exported fish and garum (a fish sauce reduction; popular in Roman cooking). Your day concludes at Capernaum, the launching place of Jesus' ministry. In Capernaum, see the Synagogue where Jesus taught (Mark 1:21-29) and gave His sermon on the Bread of Life. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 5, Tue, Mar 10: Jordan River - Mt. Tabor – Jericho – Jordan River - Jerusalem

Theme: The Transfiguration

After breakfast, we will drive to the site of the Transfiguration, Mount Tabor (Matthew 17:1-50). At this site, you will have some time to reflect on Christ's Humanity and Divinity. Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Transfiguration. Continue south to the Jordan Valley to the oldest inhabited city in the world, Jericho (Joshua 6:12-25). In Jericho, you view the exact location, the Mount of Temptation, of where the Devil tempted Jesus during his forty-day fast (Luke 4:1). Following the visit to this mountain, continue to Jesus' baptismal site on the River Jordan (Matthew 3:13-17). After some time at the Jordan River, we will transfer to Jerusalem to check-in to your hotel and enjoy dinner and overnight.

Day 6, Wed, Mar 11: Jerusalem: Temple Model - Ein Karem - Bethlehem

Theme: The Visitation and Nativity

This morning, enjoy breakfast before we start our day in Jerusalem, which houses the temple to which Jesus was Presented (Luke 2:22). Visit a model of the Second Temple as it was in the time of Jesus. Following this visit, we will take a short drive to the village of Ein Karem, the birthplace of John the Baptist. It is known that there are two churches in Ein Karem, both representing the two homes of Zechariah and Elizabeth. The first is in a valley where the birth of St. John the Baptist is commemorated (Luke 1:39-80) in the Church of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. The second is on a hill where Elizabeth spent five months in seclusion (Luke 1:24) at the Church of the Visitation. You will have a chance to visit both of these churches and have the opportunity to pray the Mystery of the Rosary as you walk up the hill to the Church of the Visitation. In the afternoon, transfer to Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus. In Bethlehem, you will have the opportunity to view the Shepherd's Fields (Luke 2:8). In the caves of these fields, you are still able to see the soot marks of fires that shepherds lit to

keep warm. The tour concludes at the Manger Square which stands in front of the Church of the Nativity. As you enter the Church, you will proceed down to the Grotto of the Nativity which marks the spot of Our Savior's birth (Matthew 2:1-18). Beneath the altar, there is a silver star and a Latin inscription that states: HIC DE VIRGINE MARIA JESUS CHRISTUS NATUS (Here Jesus Christ was born to the Virgin Mary). Following Mass in this Sacred space, return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 7, Thu, Mar 12: Bethany - Dead Sea

Theme: Early Years in Jerusalem & the Wilderness

Following breakfast at your hotel, we will travel down the Jordan Valley to Qumran. Qumran is made up of 2,000 year old ruins from the days of the Second Temple and also the site where the Dead Sea Scrolls were written and discovered (Ezekiel 47:8-10). These writings have helped further the understanding of Jewish background in Christianity. Time and weather permitting, you will have the opportunity to take a float in the Dead Sea, the lowest and saltiest spot on Earth. Continue as you travel through the Judean wilderness, the site where Jesus spent His 40 days of fasting. The day of touring culminates with a transfer to Bethany. Bethany is the site where Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead which foreshadows His own Resurrection (John 11:38-44). Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 8, Fri, Mar 13: Jerusalem: Mt. Of Olives - Gethsemane - Mt. Zion (Upper Room) - Western Wall

Theme: Palm Sunday and the Agony in the Garden

After breakfast, we will make our way to the Mount of Olives where you will be able to take in the beautiful, panoramic view of Jerusalem. Historically, the Mount of Olives was a mandatory transit point for Jesus during many iconic moments. Visit the Pater Noster Shrine where Jesus taught His disciples the Lord's Prayer (Pater Noster) (Luke 11:1-4). You will have the opportunity to stop at Dominus Flevit which is a Church that commemorates where Jesus wept for Jerusalem (Luke 19:41). Continue on to Gethsemane, a garden at the foot of the Mount of Olives. Jesus brought His disciples here to pray the night before He was crucified (Luke 22:29-53). The Garden still contains trees with roots that date back to the time of Jesus. Your next stop, the Church of All Nations, built over the "Rock of Agony". This is where Jesus prayed alone on the night of His arrest. Throughout this time, you are invited to remain in prayer and to reflect on Christ's agony that He experienced. You will have the opportunity to visit the Western Wall, which is the last remnant of the Jewish Temple after it was destroyed in 70 A.D. Continue with a visit to the house of the High Priest Caiaphas (Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu). This Church commemorates where Jesus was examined and eventually imprisoned before the Council in Jerusalem. It also commemorates Peter's Denial of Christ (John 18:15-18), Peter's repentance, and Jesus' forgiveness of Peter. You will also visit the Upper Room on Mt. Zion. The Upper Room is where Jesus and His disciples celebrated the Last Supper (Matthew 26:17-30) and where Jesus appeared to His disciples after His Death and Resurrection (Mark 16:14). In addition, visit the nearby Benedictine Church of the Dormition. Tradition tells us that this Church is where Mary, the Mother of Jesus, "fell asleep." At the end of this prayerful day, return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 9, Sat , Mar 14: Jerusalem: Via Dolorosa - Holy Sepulchre

Theme: The Way of the Cross, The Crucifixion, The Resurrection

This morning you will have a very early wake-up to begin the Via Dolorosa (The Way of the Cross) at the Antonia Fortress. This is the spot where Jesus was condemned to death by Pontius Pilate (John 18:28-19:16). Following His condemnation, He was taken (on the Road to Calvary) to His place of Crucifixion. Reflect upon the Stations of the Cross as you travel through the markets of the Old City to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher (Luke 23:26-33). This sacred destination is the site of Calvary (Jesus' crucifixion place) and His tomb (Luke 23: 50-55). Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Following Mass, we will return to the hotel to enjoy breakfast. We will continue our day with a visit to the Church of St. Anne's, the home of Jesus' maternal grandparents (Anne and Joachim); and the Pool of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the crippled man (John 5:1-9). This afternoon, enjoy a revisit to the Old City. Following this visit return to the hotel to enjoy dinner and overnight at your hotel.

Day 10, Sun, Mar 15: Return Flights Home

After an early breakfast and heartfelt farewells, transfer to the Tel Aviv airport for return flights home.

In this case an alternative site for Mass will be arranged.
