December 29, 2019 Feast of the Holy Family

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Thank you to ALL who helped make Christmas 2019 at St. Mary's so beautiful and full of faith. As ever, the people of St. Mary's stepped forward, taking the lead and lending their hands wherever needed. So on this Feast of the Holy Family, I thank God for the generosity and support of the men, women, and children who make up our St. Mary's Family of Faith.

In a very real sense, every Catholic family is called to be like the Holy Family of Jesus, Joseph, and Mary. No family is perfect, and indeed the Holy Family knew trial, struggle and suffering – including the Flight to Egypt today. Rather, a holy family is one that invites Christ into it, and then seeks to imitate His example of sacrificial love. Family prayer is always the essential means by which this invitation to God is made. In the words of Pope Saint John Paul II, "Family prayer has its own characteristic qualities. It is prayer offered in common, husband and wife together, parents and children together. Communion in prayer is both a consequence of and a requirement for the communion bestowed by the sacraments of Baptism and Matrimony. The words with which the Lord Jesus promises His presence can be applied to the members of the Christian family in a special way: 'Again I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything they ask, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them.'" (Familiaris Consortio, 59)

and I should not expect from them the judgement of adults.


Let me not rob them of the opportunity to wait on themselves and make decisions.

## The Story of Mary, Mother of God

Mary's divine motherhood broadens the Christmas spotlight. Mary has an important role to play in the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. She consents to God's invitation conveyed by the angel (Luke 1:26-38). Elizabeth proclaims: "Most blessed are you among women and blessed is the *fruit of your womb*. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" (Luke 1:42-43, emphasis added). Mary's role as mother of God places her in a unique position in God's redemptive plan.

Without naming Mary, Paul asserts that "God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law" (Galatians 4:4). Paul's further statement that "God sent the spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying out 'Abba, Father!" helps us realize that Mary is mother to all the brothers and sisters of Jesus.

Some theologians also insist that Mary's motherhood of Jesus is an important element in God's creative plan. God's "first" thought in creating was Jesus. Jesus, the incarnate Word, is the one who could give God perfect love and worship on behalf of all creation. As Jesus was "first" in God's mind, Mary was "second" insofar as she was chosen from all eternity to be his mother.

The precise title "Mother of God" goes back at least to the third or fourth century. In the Greek form *Theotokos*—God-bearer—it became the touchstone of the Church's teaching about the Incarnation. The Council of Ephesus in 431 insisted that the holy Fathers were right in calling the holy virgin *Theotokos*. At the end of this particular session, crowds of people marched through the street shouting: "Praised be the *Theotokos*!" The tradition reaches to our own day. In its chapter on Mary's role in the Church, Vatican II's *Dogmatic Constitution on the Church* calls Mary "Mother of God" 12 times.

#### Reflection

Other themes come together at today's celebration. It is the Octave of Christmas: Our remembrance of Mary's divine motherhood injects a further note of Christmas joy. It is a day of prayer for world peace: Mary is the mother of the Prince of Peace. It is the first day of a new year: Mary continues to bring new life to her children—who are also God's children.

Teens must attend five EPIC Meetings and complete one Service Project before participation in the Summer Mission Trip (6 general meetings still remain). Mission Trip paperwork and Teen Leader interview signups will also be available at the January 12 meeting.

MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH GROUP: Our next trips are this Friday, January 3, Celtics vs Hawks; and Saturday, January 18, Snow tubing. Our next Meeting is Sunday, January 26 from 6:30 – 8:30 PM, a half hour longer because of the 13<sup>th</sup> Annual Battle of the Sexes. There will be faith, friendship, fun, and signups for the February Vacation week trip to Coco Key and Boda Borg! All 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Graders are welcome!
