

January 26, 2020 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

"Come follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." (MK 1:17) These words, taken from today's Gospel, are among the richest in all of Scripture. They remind us not only of what we are – but of what we can become in Christ Jesus. Simon and Andrew, lowly fishermen, were unlikely candidates to become Apostles of the Church. And yet by the grace of Jesus, they would lead multitudes to salvation. So if we are ever feeling unworthy in the sight of God. If we are ever disappointed in ourselves, because of things we have done – or things we have failed to do – then we can find encouragement, and hope in these words; "Come follow me, and I will make you fishers of men."

The best part is that Jesus' promise has nothing to do with our own abilities. "I will make you fishers of men," the Savior says. It is Jesus who will accomplish our transformation – according to His grace, and the greatness of His love. All He asks is that we abandon our old ways of life and try to follow Him. We may stumble and fall in the attempt, but as long as we keep moving in His direction, Jesus will provide a way.

It is important to remember that Jesus calls us for a purpose, which is to become "fishers of men." Once we have been caught up in the net of Christ's love and hauled by Him out of the dark waters of sin, He intends for us to fish for others in His name. In a very real sense, the Christian who is not actively seeking to bring others to know the Lord, is only halfway formed. Such a one is not yet what the Lord intends – a "fisher of men."

It is not easy to be a fisherman. The fishermen are up at dawn. They continue fishing until late in the afternoon. They cast and draw in their nets on calloused hands until those hands have no strength left in them. The fishermen often have to go out in rough weather, risking themselves on stormy and unpredictable seas.

And so the Christian who fishes for souls has to expect risk. He will be bound to do or say things that are very unpopular; and that run contrary to the society and powers that surround him. The Christian these days who defends the sanctity of human life, may be called "anti-choice." The Christian who defends the sanctity of marriage, may be called a "bigot." The Christian who lives his life as Jesus did will most certainly be called by many "a fool."

In the end, it does not matter what the world calls us. But only what Jesus calls us; and calls us to be. Fishermen. Seekers of souls. Faithful imitators of the One who said, "Come ... follow me."

May the Lord of Our Journey continue to bless you and yours.

P.S. This weekend Cardinal O'Malley has requested that all parishes share a recorded Pro-Life homily at our Masses. He has also requested that we employ the Church's Mass "For Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life" at all the Vigil and Sunday Masses. A recorded homily is not an ideal form of communication, but it is the only way our Archbishop can address his entire flock at the same time. The Cardinal's message is timely as this past Wednesday we marked with prayer and fasting the sad anniversary of Roe vs. Wade; and as new legislation in our state attempts to widen the availability and occurrence of abortion. In a world that de-values human life more and more every day, we as Catholics are called to defend the sanctity of all human life – from the moment of conception in the womb, to the moment of natural death. In doing so, we imitate Jesus, who powerfully advocated for the poor, the weak and the vulnerable of His society.
