

The items collected for the school at our Sister Parish in Beit Sahour (also now closed off to travelers), will be shipped instead of carried by the pilgrims. Fasting: Catholics over eighteen and up to the beginning of their sixtieth year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting.

Abstinence: Catholics over fourteen years of age are bound to the obligations of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. On abstinence days, meat may not be used at all.

LENTEN SOUP SUPPERS: The remaining evenings scheduled for the Lenten Soup Suppers are: **March 13, March 20, March 27 and April 3.** Dinners begin at 6:00 PM and end between 7:30 - 8:00 PM. The suppers are wonderful events, time to share a meal, meet and get to know other parishioners, and greet and speak to our Confirmation student helpers. People make cauldrons of soup, trays of mac n'cheese/pasta, breads and desserts. **Please consider coming to one or all of the evenings.** You can sign up to bring food for the meal at: https://bit.ly/2OwJRSE.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST: PART

II: Continuing with the Catechism of the Catholic Church we learn that the Eucharist is "the Source and Summit of the Christian life." "The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are orientated toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is consumed the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself, our Pasch." (CCC 1324). The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination of both God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through Him to the Father in the Holy Spirit." (CCC 1325).
