April 26, 2020 3rd Sunday of Easter

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Our Gospel verse today starts with two disciples who meet Jesus on the road to Emmaus and then hurry back to share with the other disciples what had happened. As they are sharing about their encounter with Jesus, the Risen Lord appears in their midst. It is almost as if their sharing opens a "spiritual space" in which the Lord is then made manifest.

In this pandemic Easter Season, when many have so much more time with their families than usual, let us take time to share with them our own stories of faith. Let us talk with our loved ones about those times when the Lord touched our lives with His power, His presence, His love. Maybe it was in a difficult moment, as when Jesus came to walk with the two grieving, sorrowful disciples on the Emmaus road. Maybe it was in a joyful moment, when a new opportunity opened up for us, or a prayer was answered more awesomely than we had ever thought possible.

Let us in particular speak of our personal faith with our children and teens, who are still trying to recognize the Lord and find the life's path to which He is calling them. *"While they were still speaking, Jesus appeared and stood in their midst,"* said our Gospel verse. And when we speak of the Lord, we not only bring Him to others, we receive Him anew ourselves. By sharing, we reflect on and come to better appreciate Who Jesus has been for us, and how He has blessed our journey home to God.

All of our life journeys inevitably include times of loss and sorrow. During this pandemic some have experienced the greatest loss, that of a loved one. Students have lost the experience of school - high school and college seniors will miss out on the ceremonies of graduation. All have lost the freedom to live and work as they desire. Walking with those disciples on the road to Emmaus, Jesus teaches us something very important about how to support those who have experienced loss. He does not identify Himself. He does not start reassuring the disciples that He is alive and that all will be well. Instead, Jesus just accompanies them and *listens* as they pour out their pain at the events of Good Friday.

Just so, if you are trying to help someone in this time of so many losses – speak less and listen more. Allow those who are in pain to tell you their difficulties. Then once they have poured out the sorrows of their heart, you will be better able to comfort them. And they will be better prepared to receive your words of consolation. Finally, if you yourself are hurting, then do what those disciples did on the road. Tell your troubles to Jesus. Yes He already knows them, just as He already knew so intimately what was bothering those disciples. But it is in the sharing that you invite Jesus to walk with you and uphold you in your need.

As you know, due to the Pandemic Church Closings, St. Mary's has lost her Mass Collection income. This has understandably led to some significant Offertory Shortfalls:

Sanctify it all, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. May all we do here be to Your glory. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

At this time, light your candle.

COMMUNION TIME: If watching Mass, make an Act of Spiritual Communion at Communion time.

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

CONFIRMATION I AND II: Classes are suspended. Jake will be sending out materials for the students to continue studies at home.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION 2020:

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred by Bishop Reed on Saturday, September 26 at 10:30 AM and 1:30 PM. Because of likely social distancing concerns, candidates will be assigned which Confirmation they will attend. This will assure a 50/50 split between the two celebrations. For this reason, candidates should keep the times of both Confirmations free on their calendar. All candidates must turn in their completed Mass Reflection Sheets to the Pastor by the end of May in order to be recommended for the Sacrament.

THE EUCHARIST IN THE ECONOMY OF SALVATION: Part III - The Institution of the

Eucharist. For a short review, Jesus spoke the following words, "Do this in memory of Me." This command of Jesus to repeat His actions and words "until He comes" is directed to the liturgical celebration by the apostles and their successors, of the memorial of Christ, of His life, of His death, of His Resurrection, and of His intercession in the presence of the Father (CCC 1341). From the beginning the Church has been faithful to the Lord's command. Of the Church in Jerusalem it is written; They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship. to the breaking of bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts (CCC 1342). It was above all, "the first day of the week," Sunday, the day of Jesus' resurrection, that the Christians met "to break bread." From that time on down to our own day the celebration of the Eucharist has been continued so that today we encounter it everywhere in the Church with the same fundamental structure. It remains the center of the Church's life (CCC 1343). Thus from celebration to celebration, as they proclaim the Paschal Mystery of Jesus, "until He comes," the Pilgrim People of God advances, "following the narrow way of the Cross," toward the heavenly banquet, when all the elect will be seated at the table of the kingdom (CCC 1344). Just to pause and contemplate the magnificent gift God has given to us

in the Eucharist to gain the merits of heaven. The Eucharist holds the treasure of grace, God's love, mercy and unity -a means to communion with the living God.

The Secret of the Rosary As Revealed by Saint Louis De Montfort Part I

According to Saint Louis De Montfort, the Rosary is a veritable school of Christian life. He sees the Rosary as essentially the meditation of the mysteries of the life, death and glory of Jesus and Mary, with a view of honoring and imitating their virtues. For Montfort the Rosary was the most effective tool and weapon in his apostolic work.

• A White Rose for Priests: The Rosary is a priceless treasure which is inspired by God. Almighty God has given this to priests because He wants priests to use it as a means to convert the most hardened sinners and the most obstinate unbelievers. God has attached to it graces in this life and glory in the next. The saints have prayed it faithfully and the Popes have endorsed it. When the Holy Spirit has revealed this secret to a priest and director of souls, how blessed is that priest! If a priest understands this secret, he will pray the Rosary every day and encourage others to say it.

• The Red Rose to Sinners: For us sinners, the Precious Blood of Jesus has fallen on it. Please God that it will bring true fragrance into your lives - but above all may it save you from the danger that you are in. Everyday unbelievers and unrepentant sinners cry: "Let us crown ourselves with roses" (Wisdom 2:8). But our cry should be: "Let us crown ourselves with the roses of the Most High Rosary." Their roses are the pleasures of the flesh, worldly honors and passing riches which wilt and decay in no time, but ours, which are the Our Father and Hail Mary which we have said devoutly over and over again to which we have added good penitential acts. will never wilt or die and they will be just as exquisite thousands of years from now as they are today. Montfort reveals that by praying the complete Rosary every day (all three mysteries) you honor the three crowns of Jesus and Mary - Jesus' crown of grace at the time of His Incarnation, His crown of thorns during His passion and His crown of glory in heaven, and of course the three-fold crown which the Most blessed Trinity gave Mary in heaven. If we pray the Rosary faithfully until death, I do assure you that, in spite of the gravity of your sins "you shall receive a never fading crown of glory" (1 Peter 5:4).
