March 21, 2021 5th Sunday of Lent

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

This past week saw the tragic murders of eight people in Atlanta. We pray for the repose of their souls and the consolation of their loved ones. We also reaffirm our belief in the sanctity of every human life – without distinction – from the moment of conception in the womb to the moment of natural death.

In today's Gospel, Jesus proclaims that "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains but a single grain; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." When Jesus talked about sowing seeds, He was referring to His own burial. He was trying to help His disciples understand that true life, eternal life, could only be had through death. Jesus died, was buried, and rose again so that we could do the same. For truly those who die in the Lord are like a precious seed – watered in Baptism and warmed by the Son of God.

The image of the fallen seed is also one of sacrificial love. In this same passage Jesus speaks of those who love their lives losing them. Those who live first for themselves – their own pleasure, success and happiness – these are the ones who "love" their lives. They become spiritually dead, focused on themselves instead of God and neighbor. The ones who "hate" their lives, are the ones who look first to the needs and wellbeing of others - their families, the suffering, and the poor. In putting the other first, especially the hurting other, we become alive in Christ and receive an eternal reward.

One person who has truly put the needs of others first is our Confirmation Coordinator and Youth Minister Jake Thiringer. Jake moved to Massachusetts three years ago to minister here at St. Mary's. Since then, he has faithfully and humbly poured himself out in dedicated service to the young people of our parish, sharing and witnessing the love of the Lord in countless ways. Having completed his three year commitment here, Jake will be moving back home at the end of May to take up ministry in a parish closer to his family. We thank him for his fine work here, and ask God's good blessing upon him. He will be missed!

Many thanks to all who took part in last weekend's Forty Hours Devotion. This was St. Mary's sixteenth straight year of celebrating this Devotion of Adoration before Our Eucharistic Lord. It would not have been possible without the generosity of so many men, women, and teens who signed up to cover an hour as needed – even in darkest night. Each Forty Hours participant began and ended their hour by offering the prayer provided below.

Sign-Up Links for all Holy Week Celebrations will go up on the St. Mary's Website, <u>https://stmarysholliston.com/</u>, this coming Wednesday, March 24. They will look like this:



SIGN-UPS: To make sure no one was turned away, at Christmas we did a "By Sign-Up Only," approach. But then many people did not show up for the seats they reserved, causing others to miss out. So for Easter we will allow walk-ins if there are still unreserved seats at a Mass. If a Mass is fully reserved, but there are still empty seats once it begins, then those seats will go to any walk-ins present. <u>Those who Sign-Up in</u> <u>advance will have a seat reserved for them only until Mass begins – so plan an early arrival if possible</u>. We highly recommend Signing-Up for Mass since we can now only use 140 of our 600 seats.

Two requests. To avoid a repeat of Christmas, please do not sign up for an Easter Mass until you are sure you can commit to it (see above). Also, at Christmas a few families reserved seats at multiple Masses to "keep their options open," causing Masses to look full that were not. Out of fairness to all, please avoid this practice. Thank you!



Amen.



FASTING: Catholics over eighteen and up to the beginning of their sixtieth year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.

ABSTINENCE: Catholics over fourteen years of age are bound to the obligations of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. On abstinence days, meat may not be used at all. Regarding other weekdays of Lent, participation in daily Mass and the voluntary observance of fasting is recommended. Commendable, particularly during Lent, is generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing our abundance, the traditional Lenten Devotions and all the self-denial summed up in the concept of "mortification."



SAFETY PROCEDURES TO ATTEND WEEKEND MASS ~

(Daily Mass is exactly the same, except that there is no preregistration or sign in upon arrival. To save cleaning, only nave seating will be used on weekdays. To allow deep cleaning, the Saturday 9 AM Mass is suspended).

Please note that these rules have been mandated for all churches for health safety compliance. We did not devise them, but we must follow them in order to reopen. For their protection, the elderly and those with underlying health vulnerabilities are discouraged from attending in Phase One. Anyone with a fever or other symptoms of illness should also not attend.

1) Pre-sign up for a Mass via Sign Up Genius. After taping the church pews apart by 6 feet, our allowed capacity is now 140 people per Mass (usually 600). Sign Ups are here: <u>https://stmarysholliston.com/</u>

2) Bring hand sanitizer with you and wear a mask at all times. Children under the age of two should not wear masks. Parents should judge for children between the ages of two and five whether they should wear a mask.

3) Bring a printout of the Mass Bible Readings if desired. T o avoid possible cross-contamination, we are not permitted to provide missals or handouts. You may find the readings easily at: <u>http://www.usccb.org/bible/</u> by calendar date. You can also access these on your smartphone, but please shut that ringer off for Mass! :)

4) Enter the church through the front center door facing the Town Hall, or the elevator if handicapped. Only these entrances will be accessible. If using the elevator, PLEASE hand sanitize before touching the glass entry door handles and elevator push buttons.

5) Sanitize your hands immediately upon entering the church. We have a limited supply of sanitizer for anyone who forgets to bring some, but please try to bring your own.

6) Sign in with the door volunteers at the Mass for which you preregistered.

7) Upon entering the church proper, keep your mask on at all times and follow 6 foot social distancing - except for families who may sit together as a group. Every other pew is taped off, and blue tape in each pew center marks out a 6 foot area between opposite ends of the same pew.

8) Please refrain from singing – spoken responses only.

9) For Holy Communion, follow the blue arrows which are spaced 6 feet apart. Receive with your mask on, in the hands only. Then step away from the Communion table. Once 6 feet from the priest or minister, standing on the double arrows, remove your mask, place the Host in your mouth, and then immediately put your mask back in place.


10) Participants at Mass are asked to leave the church when their pew is dismissed at the end of the Mass so as to allow time for cleaning the church before the next Mass. No social gatherings are permitted after Mass.

12) Please remove any papers or trash from your pew when you exit and place it in the receptacles provided at the church entrances. Please do not leave anything in the pew where a cleaner would have to touch it.

13) Shared collection baskets are not permitted, so no collection can be taken up at Mass. Please continue to make your weekly offertory support via Automatic Giving, WeShare, or by mailing in or dropping off your envelope via the rectory mail-slot. Thank you!

Set your laptop, iPad or phone into a good position on a table. Clear everything else off.

If you have a candle, put that near you. An Icon, Cross, or Statue of Mary is great, too.





GUARDIAN OF THE REDEEMER



Continued from last week: Pope John Paul II's (JPII) Apostolic Exhortation "Guardian of the Redeemer", the person and Mission of Saint Joseph in the Life of Christ.

The Birth at Bethlehem: As guardian of the Mystery "hidden for ages in the mind of God," which begins to unfold before His eyes "in the fullness of time," Joseph, together with Mary, is a privileged witness to the birth of the Son of God into the world on Christmas night in Bethlehem. Luke writes: "And while they were there, the time came for her to be delivered. And she gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn" (Lk 2:6-7). Joseph was an eyewitness to this holy birth, which took place in conditions that were, humanly speaking, embarrassing—a first announcement of that "self-emptying" which Christ freely accepted for the forgiveness of sins (cf. Phil 2:5-8).

Joseph also witnessed the adoration of the shepherds who arrived at Jesus' birthplace after the angel had brought them the great and happy news (cf. Lk 2:15-16)... and he witnessed the homage of the magi from the East (cf. Mt 2:11).

The Circumcision: A son's circumcision was the first religious obligation of the father, and with this ceremony (cf. Lk 2:21) Joseph exercised his right and duty with regard to Jesus. . . . God's covenant with Abraham, of which circumcision was the sign (cf. Gn 17:13), reaches the full effect and realization in Jesus, Who is the "yes" of all the ancient promises (cf. 2 Cor 1:20).

Conferral of the Name: At the circumcision Joseph names the child "Jesus." This is the only Name in which there is salvation (cf. Acts 4:12). Its significance had been revealed to Joseph at the moment of His "Annunciation": "You shall call the Child Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins" (cf. Mt 1:21). In conferring the Name, Joseph declares his own legal fatherhood over Jesus, and in speaking the Name proclaims the Child's mission as Savior.

FY2021 CORI VOLUNTEER RENEWAL ALERT:

Ministry Leaders must make sure that **all** their active volunteers (18 years and older) renew and complete a **FY 2021 CORI.** If you are planning to volunteer in any ministry, you must complete a **2021 CORI** form. You can scan in your license and completed 2021 CORI form and send it to <u>st.marysre1870@gmail.com</u>. Please call the Religious Education Office at 508-429-6076 if you need a **2021 CORI** Form. Everyone must fill in all sections of the CORI form marked with an asterisk where it pertains to important information. Incomplete CORI forms may result in processing delays for volunteers who serve in various ministries at St. Mary's.

NOTICE: Due to the current restrictions and health concerns presented by the pandemic, the office of Risk Management at the Archdiocese has made the following **temporary adjustments** to their adult child protection training requirements. All employees and all volunteers who may have contact with children are required to complete Protecting God's Children training. However, due to our current inability to gather together for live trainings, volunteers can currently meet this requirement through participation in two online trainings: VIRTUS online PGC training and Massachusetts online Mandated Reporter training.

To complete the online PGC training, volunteers should go to <u>www.virtusonline.org</u>.

Click on "First time registrant."

On the next page click on "Begin the registration process."

Select "Boston" from the drop down list of dioceses and complete the registration process.

Once the registration is complete, you will be directed to an <u>online PGC training through VIRTUS</u>. Upon completion of that training, individuals will be directed to a link to an <u>additional online training on mandated</u> <u>reporting in Massachusetts</u>. <u>Both online trainings must</u> <u>be completed to be in compliance with child protection</u> <u>requirements</u>.

While staff are working from home, email and phone messages are checked at least hourly during normal work hours.
