April 4, 2021 Easter Sunday

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Easter Greetings in the Lord! What a joy to gather as God's family on this holiest of days. Before us stands the newly blessed Easter Candle – its flame a symbol of the light of Jesus' Resurrection dispelling forever the darkness of sin and death. We can participate in the victory of Jesus by receiving Him in faith. "*If you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your hearts that God raised Him from the dead, you shall be saved*." (Romans 10:9) When a person sincerely receives Jesus Christ in faith, they begin to experience an inner transformation and spiritual growth begins. "*If anyone is in Christ, he or she is a new creation; the old has passed away, the new has come.*" (2 Corinthians 5:17)

For many of us, the joy of this Holy Week was shadowed by the start of the George Floyd murder trial and seeing again those awful nine minutes and twenty-nine seconds. Then there was the video of the latest attack on Asians in our country, an elderly woman viciously assaulted while walking to church in New York City. It is clear that we as a society need to be "transformed" and "re-created" when it comes to matters of race. Our Lord saw the humanity and the presence of God in all people – Gentile or Jew, man or woman, rich or poor – even the gravest sinners had value in His sight. And we are not truly alive in Christ until we can acknowledge and respect the innate dignity and worth of every human being regardless of race or other distinction.

Reflecting our geographic community, St. Mary's is not a very racially diverse parish. That is why when we searched for a Sister Parish to join with as part of our 150th Anniversary year, we deliberately chose one where the people do not look like us, speak a different language, and enjoy a history and culture other than our own. It is our hope that as our connection and personal ties to the people of Our Lady's in Beit Sahour grow, so will our appreciation for the beautiful diversity that exists among the children of God - each one created in His image. Let us as individuals also find new ways to connect to racial groups outside our own. For no matter how great the differences may seem, Jesus loved and died for us all.

Seven are still sick, next Wednesday all of them will finish the quarantine. I hope that the situation is still good until all the people get vaccinated.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATIONS FOR

2021-2022: Registrations will be sent out by April 15 with a return deadline of June 15, 2021. We are planning for a normal opening of classes in late September or early October with the condition that if any Archdiocesan or state restrictions are imposed again due to the pandemic with social distance limitations, our program will have to adapt to any safety mandates which may require using a virtual model for classes once again. If any family is new to Holliston or has children entering Grades K or 1 in September, go to the parish website at www.stmarysholliston.com after April 15 and download a copy of the 2021-2022 registration form under Register / Parish Forms.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CLASSES 2021: Classes will continue remotely until the Archdiocese of Boston states that it is safe to allow small group gatherings.

GUARDIAN OF THE REDEEMER



Continued from last week: Pope John Paul II's (JPII) Apostolic Exhortation "Guardian of the Redeemer", the person and Mission of Saint Joseph in the Life of Christ.

And so Jesus' way back to Nazareth from Bethlehem passed through Egypt. Just as Israel had followed the path of the Exodus "from the condition of slavery" in order to begin the Old Covenant, so Joseph, guardian and cooperator in the providential mystery of God, even in exile watched over the One Who brings about the New Covenant.

Jesus' stay in the Temple: From the time of the Annunciation, both Joseph and Mary found themselves, in a certain sense, at the heart of the mystery hidden for ages in the mind of God, a mystery which had taken on Flesh: "The Word became Flesh and dwelt among us" (Jn 1:14). He dwelt among men surrounded by the Holy Family in Nazareth – one of many families of the land of Israel. There Jesus "grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon Him" (Lk 2:40).

The Gospels summarize in a few words the long period of the "hidden" life, during which Jesus prepared Himself for His messianic mission. Only one episode from this "hidden time" is described in the Gospel of Luke: the Passover in Jerusalem when Jesus was twelve years old. Together with Mary and Joseph, Jesus took part in the feast as a young pilgrim. "And when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it" (Lk 2:43). After a day's journey they noticed His absence and began to search "among their kinsfolk and acquaintances." "After three days they found Him in the Temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions; and all who heard Him were amazed at His understanding and His answers" (Lk 2:47). Mary asked, "Son why have You treated us so? Behold your father and I have been looking for you anxiously" (Lk 2:48). The answer Jesus gave was such that "they did not understand the saying which He spoke to them." He has said, "How is it that you sought Me? Continued next week.

IMPORTANT CORI AND PGC INFORMATION

FY2021 CORI VOLUNTEER RENEWAL ALERT:

Ministry Leaders must make sure that **all** their active volunteers (18 years and older) renew and complete a **FY 2021 CORI.** If you are planning to volunteer in any ministry, you must complete a **2021 CORI** form. You can scan in your license and completed 2021 CORI form and send it to <u>st.marysre1870@gmail.com</u>. Please call the Religious Education Office at 508-429-6076 if you need a **2021 CORI** form. Everyone must fill in all sections of the CORI form marked with an asterisk where it pertains to important information. Incomplete CORI forms may result in processing delays for volunteers who serve in various ministries at St. Mary's.

NOTICE: Due to the current restrictions and health concerns presented by the pandemic, the office of Risk Management at the Archdiocese has made the following **temporary adjustments** to their adult child protection training requirements. All employees and all volunteers who may have contact with children are required to complete Protecting God's Children training. However, due to our current inability to gather together for live trainings, volunteers can currently meet this requirement through participation in two online trainings: VIRTUS online PGC training and Massachusetts online Mandated Reporter training.

To complete the online PGC training, volunteers should go to <u>www.virtusonline.org</u>.

Click on "First time registrant."

On the next page click on "Begin the registration process."

Select "Boston" from the drop down list of dioceses and complete the registration process.

Once the registration is complete, you will be directed to an <u>online PGC training through VIRTUS</u>. Upon completion of that training, individuals will be directed to a link to an <u>additional online training on mandated</u> reporting in Massachusetts. <u>Both online trainings must</u> <u>be completed to be in compliance with child protection</u> <u>requirements</u>.

The mandated reporter training can be found at: <u>http://51a.middlesexcac.org/</u>. Copies of the mandated reported certificates should **be** sent to Michelle Gee at <u>MGee@rcab.org</u>. It is not necessary to submit a copy of the PGC certificate. Anyone with questions can contact Vivian Soper at <u>VSoper@rcab.org</u> or at 617-746-5995. While staff are working from home, email and phone messages are checked at least hourly during normal work hours.
