June 6, 2020 Feast of Corpus Christi

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. We remember that the Eucharist is not something but someone – the True and Living Presence of Jesus in our midst. One of the great hardships of the pandemic for Catholics was being deprived for so long of the spiritual sustenance of Holy Communion and the intimate encounter with Jesus that receiving His Body makes possible. It is a true joy that so many can now take their places again at the Table of the Lord.

A true story comes from the old West, about a group of Apache Indians who attacked a US Army Cavalry unit. During the attack, the Apaches managed to capture the paymaster's safe. They had never seen a safe before, but they knew it contained gold. So they tried all they could think of to open it. They beat the safe with tomahawks. They dragged it over the ground with their horses. They heated it on a fire. They tried to blast it open with gunpowder. Finally, they dropped it off a cliff into a deep ravine. In spite of their best efforts, however, the safe held tight. Finally, the Apaches gave up, and left it behind.

A few days later, the army found the abandoned safe. The paymaster immediately rushed to it, turned the combination, and within a few minutes had it open. For all practical purposes, the gold inside was inaccessible, until someone was found who knew the combination.

On this Feast of Corpus Christi, we remember that the Eucharist is like that U.S. Calvary safe. It contains gold. It holds for us a great treasure – which is the power, and the grace and the True Presence, of Jesus Christ. So how do we access the gold? Just receiving Holy Communion is not enough. Receiving Communion gives us the safe, but how do we access the treasure inside? For that, we need the combination. And the combination, is this: To pray. To walk back to our pew after we have received Communion, and to pray. To pray in silence. To pray in song. To pray for our loved ones, to pray for our enemies. To pray for forgiveness, for guidance, for help in time of need. To open up the treasure which is the Eucharist, by talking, to the Lord Jesus Whom we have just received.

I remember when I was a little boy, my mother taught my brother and sisters this wisdom when it came to praying after receiving Communion. She said, "If you find yourself watching other people receive, then it means your attention has drifted away from prayer. If that happens, close your eyes, and try to think of nothing but Jesus, and of the love He has for you. And that will get your prayer back on track."

My mother is a smart woman. And she is in some pretty good company: St. Theresa of Ávila urged her daughters to treasure the opportunity for praying after Communion. She said that, "In Communion, Jesus rests upon the soul as on a throne of grace, and He says to the soul: 'What do you want that I should do for you?' And then He waits for the soul's prayerful answer."

St. Faustina said that she received this word from Jesus, who told her: "My great delight is to unite myself with souls...
When I come to a human heart in Communion, my hands are filled with graces which I want to give to souls. But souls do not pay attention to me: they leave me to myself and busy themselves with other things. They do not recognize love."

On this Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, let us recommit ourselves, as individuals and as a parish, to "recognize love." To offer Jesus, each week, together, after Communion, the prayer that He is due. To avoid exiting the Mass early except in the case of illness or other emergency. To set a good example of Communion prayer for the children at Mass with us. And by our prayer, to "open up" the great treasure that is the Eucharist - the True and Living Presence of Jesus Christ Himself.

### The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ



Today, June 6, 2021 is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as the Feast of Corpus Christi.

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church. The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Sacrament of the Eucharist. The opening prayer at Mass moves our attention to Jesus' suffering and death and our worship of Him, especially in the Eucharist.

At every Mass we are called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in this august Sacrament, while the secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ (God's people) as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with His Church, His Bride. He expresses this in the Gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head.

This Solemnity honors Jesus Christ, Really, Truly and Substantially Present under the appearances of bread and wine. Christ's Presence happens through the change which the Church calls transubstantiation ("change of substance"), when at the Consecration of the Mass, the priest says the words of institution which Christ Himself pronounced over bread and wine at the Last Supper, "This is My Body," "This is the chalice of My Blood," "Do this in remembrance of Me.

Jesus said to [the Jews], "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For My Flesh is true food, and My Blood is true drink. Whoever eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn. 6:53-56).

### **FY2021 CORI VOLUNTEER RENEWAL ALERT:**

Ministry Leaders must make sure that **all** their active volunteers (18 years and older) renew and complete a **FY 2021 CORI.** If you are planning to volunteer in any ministry, you must complete a **2021 CORI** form. You can scan in your license and completed 2021 CORI form and send it to <a href="mailto:st.marysre1870@gmail.com">st.marysre1870@gmail.com</a>. Please call the Religious Education Office at 508-429-6076 if you need a **2021 CORI** Form. Everyone must fill in all sections of the CORI form marked with an asterisk where it pertains to important information. Incomplete CORI forms may result in processing delays for volunteers who serve in various ministries at St. Mary's.

NOTICE: Due to the current restrictions and health concerns presented by the pandemic, the office of Risk Management at the Archdiocese has made the following temporary adjustment to their adult child protection training requirements. All employees and all volunteers who may have contact with children are required to complete Protecting God's Children training. However, due to our current inability to gather together for live trainings, volunteers can currently meet this requirement through participation in two online trainings: VIRTUS online PGC training and Massachusetts online Mandated Reporter training.

### To complete the online PGC training, volunteers should go to www.virtusonline.org.

Click on "First time registrant."

On the next page click on "Begin the registration process."

Select "Boston" from the drop down list of dioceses And complete the registration process.

Once the registration is complete you will be directed to an <u>online PGC training through VIRTUS</u>. Upon completion of that training, individuals will be directed to a link to an <u>additional online training on mandated reporting in Massachusetts</u>. Both online trainings must be completed to be in compliance with child protection requirements.

While staff are working from home, email and phone messages are checked at least hourly during normal work hours.
