August 1, 2021 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

When confronted by the hunger, and grumbling, of the Israelites, God sends them the gift of manna. This heavenly bread comes to them through the morning dew. We read in today's Mass:

"In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground. On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, "What is this?" for they did not know what it was. But Moses told them, 'This is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat.'"

In the Second Eucharistic Prayer (which I use more often than not), one of the lines in the Missal reads:

"Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dewfall, so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ."

By using the phrase "like the dewfall," the new translation invokes the events of Exodus, where through the dewfall God provided bread to the Israelites, even as at Mass He provides the Eucharistic Bread to His people. The manna in the desert fed the Israelites' stomachs. But in today's Gospel, Jesus challenges the people to "not work for food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life." He then identifies Himself as the Bread of Life.

Each week then, when we hear the phrase "like the dewfall," we are being invited to remember the ways that in the past God has supported us by sending graces and blessings into our lives. For truly every good thing has its source in Him. We should also consider our priorities — whether we are placing more value on earthly, material things that will fade — or on spiritual goods that endure unto eternal life. In the end we can only take with us from this world the love we have shown to others; our goodness, our kindness, our generosity, our willingness to forgive. Like dew when the warming sun rises, all earthly illusion will evaporate before the light of God's face. Only that which is real and holy, that which is of Christ, will then remain.

IMPORTANT CORI AND PGC

INFORMATION: The Archdiocese of Boston has issued a statement regarding CORI forms: "The State of Emergency order is lifted in Massachusetts and one can no longer complete a CORI verification via zoom or teleconference. Photocopies of a license will no longer be accepted to verify at a later time. **Verification must be completed in person**. Please remember **ANY** person who will be conducting virtual education programs for members of our parish are required to submit a CORI. As of July 1 only the 2022 CORI Form will be available for renewals and new volunteers.

Feast of St. John Vianney ~ August 4 Patron of Parish Priests



John Baptist Vianney was born at Dardilly, France on May 8, 1786 into a very humble and Christian family. His mother, a very religious woman, led her son at a very early age, to a life of profound devotion to God which consumed him completely. He was quoted as saying "I owe a debt to my mother. Virtue goes easily from mothers into the hearts of their children, who willingly do what they see being done."

St. John Vianney wanted to become a priest, however being raised during the French Revolution and its aftermath made learning, especially Latin grammar, almost inaccessible. Without a proper education, St. John Vianney struggled through his years in the seminary. He was ordained a priest on August 13, 1815 primarily through his strong reputation for goodness and holiness. The vicar general was quoted as saying "The Church wants not only learned priests but, even more, holy ones."

In 1818 St. John Vianney was assigned the parish priest of Ars where he remained for 41 years until he died. His effect on this tiny village was remarkable for he changed it from a village of spiritual indifference to one alive with Christian spirit. The transformation took ten years of patience, personal example, and Divine grace. St. John Vianney was very serious about his religious obligations and expected as much or more of himself than of the village people. Over time the people of Ars realized that St. John Vianney practiced what he preached.

The transformation of the people in Ars became well known and soon people from all over France, Belgium, England, and even America came to Ars to have their confessions heard by St. John Vianney and to receive his spiritual guidance. Because of his strong desire to save souls, he endured anywhere from 12 to 17 hours a day in the confessional and could often tell a person's sins even when they were withheld. The instructions he gave were often short and simple, yet they sustained the deep faith and love of God that was the main principle of his life.
