### From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today is the Feast of the Assumption of Mary into heaven. It was that glorious moment when, at the end of her earthly life, Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven. The Assumption reminds us that suffering and death were never part of God's plan for us. Mary, by the miracle of the Immaculate Conception, was specially protected by God from any touch or trace of original sin. That's why we call Mary the "New Eve," because she was created just like our first parents were – before sin and without sin. Unlike our first parents Adam and Eve, Mary never broke God's law. She could have – like them she had free will – but always she used her freedom to say to God – not my will, but THY will, be done. And because Mary was created free of sin – and never chose sin in her life – death had no claim on her. So when Mary's earthly journey was finished, death could not hold her. Instead, she was the first of us to share in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The important point here is the connection between sin and death. We read in the Book of Wisdom: "God did not create death – nor does He delight in the suffering of the living. Rather, it was through sin, that death entered the world." The world is not now as God originally intended it to be. God created us for life, and death became part of our reality only when God's will was violated. When this world was broken. A brokenness that still touches all of us except for Mary, who was without sin and whom the grave, therefore, could not hold. We read in Jeremiah: "I know the plans I have for you" says the Lord. Plans of goodness, not of harm. To give you a future. And a home." In the glorious Assumption of Mary into heaven we see proof of God's good plan for us. We catch a glimpse of what we were always meant to be. And what we can be again through Jesus, Mary's Son and Savior of us all.

**IMPORTANT CORI AND PGC INFORMATION:** The Archdiocese of Boston has issued a statement regarding CORI forms: "The State of Emergency order is lifted in Massachusetts and one can no longer complete a CORI verification via zoom or teleconference. Photocopies of a license will no longer be accepted to verify at a later time. **Verification must be completed in person**. Please remember **ANY** person who will be conducting virtual education programs for members of our parish are required to submit a CORI. As of July 1 only the 2022 CORI Form will be available for renewals and new volunteers.

# FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY



### **TODAY ~ AUGUST 15**

When Mary fell into her earthy sleep, her soul and spirit were taken into heaven and then her body was united with her soul and spirit in complete glorification. Mary, the young girl whom God chose to fulfill His plan for our salvation, longed to be reunited with her beloved Son, our King, Jesus Christ.

We honor and celebrate Mary's trust and confidence in accepting God's will when she said, "Yes" to the message of the Archangel Gabriel so long ago. So young, innocent, and pure of heart, Mary was conceived without original sin and gifted with sanctifying grace throughout her life. She cooperated with God's grace completely and lived in a state of Holy love, accepting all the difficulties in her life as God's will for her.

Mary experienced many difficulties in her life such as when they presented Jesus in the Temple and she heard the prophesy of Simeon regarding Jesus (Luke 2:34-35); when they had to flee into Egypt to avoid King Herod's search for the child Jesus (Matthew 2:13-21); when they went to celebrate the feast day in Jerusalem and lost Jesus for three days (Luke 2:41-50); when Mary witnessed Jesus carrying the wooden Cross to Calvary (John 19:17); when Mary was at the foot of the Cross (John 19:18-30); when Jesus was taken down from the Cross and she held her Son's lifeless body in her arms (John 19:39-40); and lastly, when Jesus was laid in the tomb (John 19:39-42).

Mary accepts us as her children. She is our spiritual and heavenly Mother who brings our prayers before the throne of our Divine Majesty. She returns the graces she receives from God to her children on earth. Mary is the unsullied channel of God's grace, the purest of springs and the fairest of roses. Pray to her daily, especially the Rosary.
