January 9, 2022 Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is a transitional celebration – marking both the conclusion of the Christmas Season, and the start of Ordinary Time. Whereas the commercial / secular world would have Christmas start the day after Thanksgiving and then be promptly extinguished on December 26, in the Church we do not begin to anticipate Christmas until December 17, and then we bask in the joy of it through today's Feast. I congratulate those who kept their outdoor Christmas lights on all the way to this weekend!

In Baptism, it is said that the water makes us holy. But at His Baptism it was Jesus who made the water holy, so that we all might be baptized into Him. Being sinless, Jesus had no need to be baptized. But as in all things, He showed us the way by His own example. He demonstrated that He never asks us to do anything that He Himself was not willing to humbly undergo. In Baptism, one is immersed into the mystery of Christ's own life, death and resurrection. In the waters of Baptism original sin is washed from the soul, as we are reborn in the Lord.

On this last day of the Christmas Season, let us each consider our own Baptismal commitment to the Lord. Let us seek even more fervently to be His faithful sons and daughters – living, loving and forgiving as Jesus taught. There is no better time. For as author Howard Thurman so beautifully expressed ...

"When the song of the angels is stilled,
When the star in the sky is gone,
When the kings and princes are home,
When the shepherds are back with their flocks,
The work of Christmas begins:
To find the lost,
To heal the broken,
To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoner,
To rebuild the nations,
To bring peace among brothers,
To make music in the heart."
