Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today is Respect Life Sunday, a time we are called to reflect on the value of each and every human life from the moment of conception in the womb, to the moment of natural death. It may seem, and even be true, that in the Respect Life conversation we focus most on the innocent unborn. This is from the simple fact that they are so vulnerable, so under threat in the name of choice, and that they are unable to speak for themselves. Throughout His earthly ministry, Jesus spoke powerfully and urgently in defense of the weak and the helpless, and as His Living Body today the Church must imitate His example and continue His advocacy for those without standing in society. We do this not just by proclaiming the inherent value of all human life, but by promoting life in practical and helpful ways.

The Catholic Church in Boston offers tremendous support and resources to those in crisis pregnancies through Pregnancy Help (617-782-5151). This organization offers health care, housing, job training, counseling, adoption referral, nutrition, and practical baby needs to parents who without such help might consider terminating a pregnancy. Our annual "Baby Shower for the Unborn" will be held on October 22/23, collecting new baby items for Pregnancy Help. For women and men whose lives have been scarred by the experience of abortion, a powerful opportunity for healing and reconciliation is available through Project Rachel (508-651-3100).

Here at St. Mary's, we also have the weekly Rose for Life and maintain in our Parish Center lobby a whole board of resource materials and contact numbers. On Mother's Day we will have the annual Carnation Sale for Birthright of Framingham. Thank you to Deacon John Barry, Rosemary Rainsford and our Respect Life Committee for these efforts. It is so very important that we offer both spiritual and material support to parents in very difficult and painful situations.

Our efforts to respect life also must extend beyond the unborn to include all vulnerable persons - the poor, the condemned, the victims of war and terrorism, the elderly and the sick. To respect life is to acknowledge Christ in every person. During my twenty-eight years of priesthood I have presided at the funerals of far too many children and teens, a number of them from St. Mary's. I look at the untimely passing of these young people and wish that I could give them life. The gift of life, however, is beyond our power to bestow. All that we can do is to respect and defend the lives of those still with us, whether born or unborn, young or old, healthy or sick, innocent or guilty. We cannot give life where we choose, so let us never dare for any reason to take the miracle of life away from another person.

What is RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the way people are initiated into the Christian way of life, specifically in the Roman Catholic tradition. It is a journey of discovery, where participants come to know Jesus Christ. It is a process of awakening to what it means to be a Catholic Christian. It is an opportunity to explore the Catholic faith. It is a period of discernment to help each individual freely decide if the Catholic Church can be the place to call home. The RCIA is a focused experience of the everdeepening journey into the life of faith, which is the task of a lifetime.

Who is RCIA for?

RCIA is for adults who have never been baptized, those who have been baptized in another Christian denomination, and even those baptized as a Catholic who were unable to continuing learning about the faith.

So, what do we do on this journey?

We pray, learn about prayer and how to pray. We enter into a journey of discovery into the sacramental and prayer life of the Church, most especially the Mass. We learn about Scripture; in fact, the Bible is our primary "text book". We learn how to "be" Catholic as we discover the moral and prayer life of the Church. We develop relationships, within our group, but also within the parish and the community.

How much does the program cost?

Nothing. All expenses are covered by the parish.
