Recently there has been confusion at some Masses about when to stand for the Gospel. Some have been standing as soon as the instrumental **music** of the Alleluia begins, others when the **word** Alleluia is sung.

The correct time to stand is when the *word* Alleluia is sung. What exactly does Alleluia mean? A Hebrew acclamation, Alleluia literally means "Praise God!" It occurs in twenty Psalms in the Old Testament. The early Christians sang Alleluia as a response to the Psalms. The earliest record of its use is found in The Apostolic Tradition by Hippolytus (c.170 - c.236).

The creation of the Roman Proper of the Mass in the late seventh century established the Alleluia chant as an independent rite, acclaiming the arrival of the Gospel.

Today, the Alleluia, or an alternate acclamation during Lent, is the primary Gospel acclamation of the assembly in the Liturgy of the Word. By its very nature it is a song, and should be sung by all while standing and awaiting the Gospel.

January 15, 2023 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

A dramatic change greets us as we enter the church building this weekend. Gone are the evergreens, poinsettias, and lights of the Christmas Season. In their place is the simplicity of Ordinary Time. The term "ordinary" comes from the word "ordinal," meaning "counted". Ordinary Time then, means "counted time," not time that is common or mundane. The count began anew this past Monday with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and will continue uninterrupted until Ash Wednesday, February 22. We might think of it as a countdown to salvation and the day we stand face to face with God. May we make the best and most generous use of the limited time each of us possesses in this passing life as we prepare for the eternal life to come.

The green color worn during these days of Ordinary Time has traditionally been associated with new life and growth. In Hebrew, for instance, the same word for the color "green" also means "young." Some may remember the beautiful prayer with which the priest and people used to begin every Mass: "Introibo ad altare Dei. Ad deum qui laetificat juventutem meam." "I will go in to the altar of God. To God Who gives joy to my youth." By His Birth, Life, Death and Resurrection, Christ has remade and revitalized the whole world, making us all young in our hope for eternal life in Him.

Today we hear John the Baptist cry out, "Behold the Lamb of God." This phrase appears in Latin in our St. Mary's church window of John the Baptist, "Ecce Agnus Dei." And of course it appears in our liturgy, when the priest holds up the Eucharistic Host – reminding us that the very same Jesus to Whom John pointed at the riverside, has now come down among us in the Body and the Blood.

It would have been easy for John to feel jealous of Jesus, Who would supplant his own ministry. After all, before Jesus arrived, John was the one who drew huge crowds to hear God's Word and invitation to repentance. But John had the precious gift of humility. He realized that by making room for Jesus, and trying to bring others to know Jesus as the Lamb of God, he was fulfilling the noblest work possible.

How do we react when someone comes along whose own gifts outshine our own? Do we feel threatened or jealous? Or do we pray for them, encourage them, and celebrate what they have to offer? Doing so is possible only if we are confident in our own worth as sons and daughters of God. When we remember that the phrase "Lamb of God," is a sacrificial one. And that Jesus valued each and every one of us enough to lay down His life to save us from our sins.

May the Lord of Our Journey continue to bless you and yours.

ST. MARY'S CEMETERY POLICIES REMINDER: A scanned copy of St. Mary's Cemetery Policies is provided on the next bulletin page. While most of the cemetery is compliant, the new section has seen many installations of benches, trees, and other prohibited items. It is no longer possible to access some graves for burials without removing these items. <u>We therefore urge you to remove any such items yourself as soon as possible</u>. Burials happen with little notice, and we are not always able to reach you. Thank you!

St. Mary's Cemetery Policies

One full size grave can have three cremations and/or one full size burial.

The maximum monument (headstone) size for the number of graves purchased is as follows: single grave (2×1) under 3 feet in height; two graves (3×1) ; three graves (4×1) ; four graves (4×1) . The only exception is in the older sections of the Cemetery.

Flowers may be planted within 12 inches directly in front of the stone.

Bushes may be planted on either side of the monument (never to exceed two feet in height) and must be kept pruned by the planter accordingly. Rose Bushes are not allowed.

No planting of trees.

No planting or any other alterations in the back of the headstone.

No fences, borders, curbing, statues, chairs, hedges or hardscapes shall be erected.

Benches may be placed only if serving also as the grave headstone and located accordingly at the head of the grave.

Seasonal flowers may be placed on graves with the understanding that the cemetery staff will remove them if they interfere with maintenance of the area.

No glass containers may be left on graves as they are a safety hazard.

The Parish reserves the right to change, alter and or amend any of the above policies or to add new ones at any time without notice.
