From the > Pastor's Desk

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today's readings reflect on the Commandments of God. Jesus says in the Gospel that He has come not to abolish "but to fulfill" the Law. In the first reading, Sirach reminds us that obedience to the Law is the way to life – but that such obedience must be given freely by us. God wants us to choose His way, rather than being forced into it. In the end, the Commandments of God are not meant to take away our freedom or happiness. Rather, they are the way to true freedom and lasting happiness.

When considering the Commandments, it is important to look beyond the prohibitions to the call to action they imply. For instance, we might read the Commandment, "Thou shalt not steal," and think simply that we should not take the property of others. In fact, this commandment also encompasses our responsibility to give to others – especially to the poor. In the words of St. John Chrysostom, "Not to share one's wealth with the poor is to steal from them and to take away their livelihood. For it is not our own goods which we hold, but theirs."

As we strive like Jesus to "fulfill" God's Law, let us consider not just what God calls us to avoid, but the actions He is calling us to pursue. And if we are finding a particular aspect of God's to be difficult or onerous, let us remember that God made us, and that He knows us better even than we know ourselves. He knows what will truly satisfy and save us. Today's second reading reminds us that God's wisdom is superior to that of men. That is why following God's Law leads to life, and why we can never really break God's Law, but only break ourselves against it.

HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER MISSION TRIP TO FLORIDA: In 2022, St. Mary's High School teens traveled to Mississippi to spend a week serving others and bringing Christ to them. This mission trip not only greatly impacted the lives of those living in Mississippi, but the lives of our teens and chaperones. THIS YEAR, our 2023 Mission Trip will take place on July 16 - July 23 and we will be serving in FLORIDA helping those affected by two devastating hurricanes. Hurricane Ian slammed Southwest Florida on September 28, producing widespread damage and significant storm surge in Lee and Charlotte counties. Forty-three days later, Hurricane Nicole made its landfall. Almost 200 people died in the storms, and roughly 3.8 billion dollars in damage was done to homes and businesses. Now the rebuilding begins!



BLACK CATHOLIC SAINTS: In honor of Black History Month, St. Mary's is profiling and celebrating different Black Catholic Saints in February. May their example of holiness inspire us, and may we all do our part to promote racial amity and equality for all God's children. Today's saint is Saint Martin de Porres.

ST. MARTIN DE PORRES - (December 9, 1579 – November 3, 1639)

Martin was born in Peru, the illegitimate son of a Spanish soldier and a freed slave. His father was so unhappy that Martin had inherited his mother's dark complexion that he refused to acknowledge him for years. After the birth of a baby girl, Martin's father abandoned the family altogether, leaving them in dire poverty. Despite having almost nothing himself, Martin gave generously to those who had less than he. When he was mocked for his illegitimacy and race, he responded by doing kind things for the very people who made fun of him.

As a man, Martin wanted to join the Dominican Order. Peruvian law did not allow people of color to enter religious life, but the Dominicans allowed him to work as a servant, sweeping the floors and answering the door. He did so joyfully, and after years of good works and miraculous cures at his hands, the Dominicans worked around the law, allowing him to become a lay brother. Martin eventually founded orphanages for homeless children and cared for lonely African slaves who had been forced to come to Lima. When he died, everyone in Lima mourned him, even bishops and members of the royal court. He is the patron Saint of persons of mixed race and of those who suffer from discrimination.
