Life of Passion Life of Love! March 5, 6 & 7 from 7-8 PM in the church. Tuesday is followed by a reception in Fr. Haley Hall.

In this three-night Parish Mission, National Catholic Speaker and Family Life Director Adam Storey will show how a life of passion must be rooted in a loving relationship with Jesus Christ. It is in Jesus where we encounter the most passionate love conceivable. It is in Him where we find fulfillment of the heart's deepest desires. This vision might sound appealing, but what does this relationship actually look like, what things tend to hold us back, and how can a passionate life be pursued in the midst of the daily grind?

Adam will explore this vision and these questions in depth, and he'll offer practical and simple ways for everyone to grow in this most precious relationship with God.

SUNDAY, MARCH 5 - FIRST NIGHT, PASSIONATE HEARTS:

The heart of the Christian life is about entering into a loving relationship with God - who first seeks us. During this first evening, Adam will explore why we must open our hearts to God, helping participants see that He is what our hearts most long for - for it is in this relationship where we are most alive. Using the lives of the saints and personal stories, Adam will show that our relationship with God truly has the power to transform us.

MONDAY, MARCH 6 - SECOND NIGHT, WHEN THE RUBBER

MEETS THE ROAD: It's easy to think that a vibrant relationship with Jesus is a gift only offered to a few. Not so. In this talk, Adam will show that developing and nurturing this relationship with Jesus is accessible to all of us. We'll explore in depth the lay vocation, and how each of us can grow in holiness precisely in the hustle and bustle of daily life.

In this second evening, Adam will explore common misconceptions and challenges every Catholic faces, including struggling to find time, feeling awkward, and attempts to hide ourselves from God, and what we can do about it.

TUESDAY, MARCH 7 - THIRD NIGHT, LET'S GET REAL:

Every love story is different, and so is every relationship with the Lord. However, there are small patterns of holiness every Christian can embrace each day. Drawing from the spiritual riches of the Church, in this final evening Adam will offer five simple and concrete disciplines a disciple of the Lord Jesus can incorporate into their day, helping them grow as disciples and deepen their Faith. **This final Mission evening is followed by a reception in Fr. Haley Hall**.

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

What was Jesus doing on the mountaintop before the spiritual pyrotechnics of today's gospel occurred? Matthew is silent, but Luke's telling of this story includes the important detail that Jesus went up the mountain to pray. Jesus' transfiguration, the appearance of Moses and Elijah, the Voice of God – all these things were unleashed by the power of prayer. Together with fasting and almsgiving, prayer is one of the three pillars of our own Lenten experience. During these forty days we pray for forgiveness, for guidance, for strength, for patience and for help in becoming more like Jesus Himself.

PRAYER: This coming Friday, I and thirty-five St. Mary's Parishioners will depart on Pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Know that we will pray faithfully every single day the nearly 300 intentions you wrote down and entrusted to us on the First Sunday of Lent. That includes at our Mass on Mount Tabor, where today's Gospel took place. Please pray also for us!

FASTING: Please be advised that on Friday, March 17, Cardinal O'Malley has waived the requirement to abstain from meat. This is in honor of the Feast of St. Patrick, who is the patron saint of the Archdiocese of Boston. However, Catholics are encouraged to select another weekday to fast from meat instead.

ALMSGIVING: Today kicks off the 2023 Catholic Appeal. St. Mary's goal is \$87,486 – our same goal as last year which was achieved. The Appeal makes possible the many good works of our Catholic Church, providing essential services to the poor and other vulnerable persons. It supports, for instance, the work of Pregnancy Help, assisting women in crisis pregnancies. It also funds the Child Safety Office, which runs safety education programs and assures parish compliance in this important area. These are just a few examples of the good accomplished by the Appeal.

I especially ask that those who did not support the Appeal last year make a special effort to participate in 2023. None of us is asked to give more than we can. But we should all try to do something, in a manner reflective of the means with which God has blessed us.



FASTING: Catholics over eighteen and up to the beginning of their sixtieth year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.

ABSTINENCE: Catholics over fourteen years of age are bound to the obligations of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. On abstinence days, meat may not be used at all. Regarding other weekdays of Lent, participation in daily Mass and the voluntary observance of fasting is recommended. Commendable, is generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing our abundance, the traditional Lenten Devotions and all the self-denial summed up in the concept of "mortification."



By coming to adoration, we are handing Him the keys to our hearts, allowing the rays of His love and grace to bathe our souls in the light of His Presence, as the rays of the sun bathe our bodies in light.

LENTEN THURSDAY: In addition to the usual Saturday Noon to 12:45 PM Confession time, during Lent St. Mary's Thursday night Eucharistic Holy Hours will also have the opportunity for Confession, from 7-8 PM in the church. Each Lenten Holy Hour includes an intention for which we ask you kindly to pray during your time before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament:

March 9:	Pray for those experiencing addiction, and their loves ones.
March 16:	Pray for Catholics who have fallen away from their faith.
March: 23:	Pray for married couples in difficulty.
March 30:	Pray for those fighting cancer or other serious illness.

FORTY HOURS DEVOTION: In celebrating this devotion, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the altar at St. Mary's for forty continuous hours. The church will be open throughout and people may stop in at any time to visit with the Lord in prayer. The Forty Hours Devotion nurtures the love of the faithful for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Additionally, three special dimensions surround this devotion:

- the protection from evil and temptation;
- reparation for our own sins and for the Poor Souls in Purgatory;
- and deliverance from political, material, or spiritual calamities.
