Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Yesterday we laid to rest our dear and faithful sister Therese Stewart. Known to many in Holliston as "Madame Stewart," from her years teaching in the French Immersion Program, Terri was a devoted Catholic and a true pillar of our parish. Firm in her beliefs, she was an incredibly kind and supportive woman. I will miss her very much. Please keep Terry and her loved ones in your prayers.

As we celebrate this week the birth of our nation, I invite us also to pray for our country's leaders. May God guide, inspire and empower them to serve His people well. Our nation was founded by men and women of faith fleeing other lands where they were forced to live in ways contrary to their moral convictions. For that reason, religious freedom is part of the very foundation of our United States, a precious right which every generation must cherish and protect.

Religious freedom is never about forcing people to live according to another's faith, but rather making sure that government never forces people of faith to compromise their beliefs in the way they live, work or worship. Many would like to see religion locked up in church on Sunday and kept as a strictly private matter, when in fact true faith becomes part of every aspect of one's life. It is the light which guides us, and the ruler against which we measure every choice that life presents. In the words of George Washington, "Of all the dispositions and habits which lead to political prosperity, Religion and morality are indispensable supports. In vain would that man claim the tribute of Patriotism who should labour to subvert these great Pillars of human happiness, these firmest buttresses of the duties of Men and citizens."

In recent years, the question of what Religious Freedom does and does not mean, has been very much part of the public debate. I therefore share as food for thought the following insights from PBS's "Rediscovering George Washington" Series.

"Given the importance of religion to Washington and the other Founders, it is difficult to understand the common view today that government should merely tolerate but never support or promote religion. Nothing could be further from the intentions of the Founders, as can be seen by simply looking at the First Amendment. The First Amendment states, 'Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof...'

In writing the First Amendment, the Founders had two concerns. The first was that in America there would be no established church like in 18<sup>th</sup> century Britain, France, and other European countries where one's political rights were protected only if one belonged to the official religion of the government. But the Founders never for a moment suggested that government ought not promote religion and morality generally.

Many people today think the First Amendment is built upon the idea that there is or should be a 'wall of separation between church and state.' That phrase is found not in the First Amendment, but in a letter Thomas Jefferson wrote while he was President of the United States to a group of Baptists (who were often persecuted in colonial times for their religious beliefs and practices). Jefferson wrote to assure them that their religious liberty would be protected.

When Jefferson wrote of the 'wall of separation between church and state,' he did not mean that religion must be kept entirely out of politics, or law. If he had meant that, he would have violated the 'wall of separation' at the very time he declared it. For, at the end of the letter to the Baptists, Jefferson, acting in his official capacity as President, concluded with a prayer: 'I reciprocate your kind prayers for the protection and blessing of the common Father and Creator of man.'

For the Founders, government support of religion is not the same as an 'establishment' of religion. How could it be, when the Founders themselves believed our natural rights to be gifts of God? In September 1789, the House of Representatives authorized the first official Thanksgiving. The resolution they passed called for 'a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God.' Moreover, they passed this on the very same day they passed the First Amendment, which said 'Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion.' Clearly those in the first Congress did not see any conflict between the First Amendment's prohibition on an established religion, and government sanctioning an official day of thanksgiving to God."

CARDINAL O'MALLEY'S STATEMENT ON NEWTON, MA TRAGEDY: "As priests, we serve to minister to people in times of great loss and tragedy. Often words are not enough to help families and friends come to terms with the loss of a loved one. We look to God for answers. We seek to understand. Often, we simply cannot make sense of what has happened. But our faith sustains us, and in this moment of enormous pain, we know that God is with us always. This week and for the weeks, months, and years ahead, the brutal and senseless murders of Gilda D'Amore, her husband, Bruno D'Amore, and Gilda's mother, Lucia Arpino, will stay with us as we come to terms with this unimaginable loss. They loved Christ and the Church. On the day of their murders, Gilda and Bruno were to celebrate their 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary at Our Lady Help of Christians. They lived their Catholic faith proudly and in service to the Church. I am currently in Rome and will offer Mass for Gilda, Bruno, and Lucia at St. Peter's Basilica. In our prayers, we will also remember the parishioners of Our Lady Help of Christians Parish and their sister parish Sacred Heart, their pastor Father Dan Riley, the parish staff and the entire community of Newton. We give thanks for the parish community of Our Lady Help of Christians and the surrounding Catholic communities coming together to support and care for each other. With God's help, we will remember the gift of the lives of Gilda, Bruno and Lucia."





WHAT IS THAT PLANT? Several parishioners have asked what the plant is growing at the corner of our parking lot exit onto Church Street. The plant appeared there last year, but this summer has grown many feet tall and is now starting to bloom and flower. The plant is a "Great Mullein," a biennial wildflower plant that spends its first year as a rosette of furry leaves, and produces its flowers in its second year, between June and August. The yellow, candle-like flower spikes of the Great Mullein can reach up to 6.5 feet in height, making it an impressive plant. The grey-green, oval, leaves of Great Mullein are covered in woolly hairs and appear in whorls around the tall stems. The flower spike appears at the top of the stem - the flowers themselves are small, but they form dense, yellow clusters around the spike.
