Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Please keep in your prayers Mary Soares, Gene Decamp, and John Hanna Jr., all of whom had Funeral Masses celebrated here this past week.

We also hold up to God's mercy our fellow citizens who have perished in the terrible fires on the island of Maui. May God speed them into His peace, and console those who are mourning such a loss.

Last Sunday, on the Feast of the Transfiguration, I preached on Peter's desire to stay on that mountaintop where faith was easy and untested. Today again Jesus invites Peter to leave his comfort zone, calling him to step out of the boat and walk on the water with Him.

Is there some familiar and comfortable place, habit or situation that Jesus is calling you to abandon? Is there a grudge, a vice, or a prejudice that He is inviting you to step away from? Is there a ministry or volunteer position He is asking you to take on, but that you find intimidating?

If so, take heart from our Gospel verse. Remember that when Peter accepted the challenge and left the boat, Jesus was there to support and uphold him when things got rough. And it was in that very moment that Peter touched the Lord, just as it is in the times our faith is tested that we too come closer to Jesus.

Have you ever fallen? Have you denied Jesus in order to be safe, or curry favor with the world? Are you feeling cut off from Jesus, and watery in your love of God?

Then pray the prayer that Peter did, when he was sinking beneath the waves. The shortest prayer he ever spoke, but a prayer that says it all. "Lord, SAVE ME!" And He will.

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church.

We find homilies on the Assumption going back to the 6th century. In following centuries, the Eastern Churches held steadily to the doctrine, but some authors in the West were hesitant. However, by the 13th century there was universal agreement. The feast was celebrated under various names - Commemoration, Dormition, Assumption - from at least the fifth or sixth century. Today it is celebrated as a Solemnity, and a Holy Day of Obligation for Catholics.




