MISSION SUPPORT FOR THE ARCHDIOCESE OF TORORO UGANDA

(Supported by today's Second Collection)

The Archdiocese of Tororo, covering an approximate area of 8,500 square miles, serves an estimated population of 3.6 million people, about 1.2 million of whom are Catholic. These are some of our needs.

1) Parishes: Caring for 45 parishes (this number will increase to 47 by the end of this year as two more parishes will be opened), 984 missions or sub-parishes.

2) Formation of pastoral ministers:

- Currently we have about <u>335 minor seminarians</u>, about a quarter of whom will proceed on to the major seminary. We have about <u>48 seminarians</u> studying in the philosophical and theological seminaries.
- We currently have <u>123 native diocesan priests</u> and <u>14 religious priests</u>. Once ordained, our priests need to continue their formation, especially by attending educational workshops and spiritual retreats.
- The <u>1340 catechists</u> serve the mission churches (sub-parishes).

3) Transportation of pastoral ministers: The priests and catechists need to travel to and from the mission churches, usually by scooters and bicycles.

4) Education: In collaboration with the Government of Uganda, the Archdiocese runs several Primary, Secondary and Technical schools. Most of these schools, run by our <u>16 native religious brothers</u> and <u>243 native religious sisters</u>, are in rural settings where there is no electricity, no computers and not enough textbooks and laboratory equipment. The teaching and learning process becomes very difficult in such an environment.

5) Health: The Archdiocese has <u>one hospital, three sub-hospitals and twelve small medical facilities</u> through which we try to fulfill Christ's ministry of physical healing. These facilities, usually run by the religious sisters are not funded by the Government and must depend on user fees to purchase drugs and equipment and cover the cost of personnel.

6) Economic development: The Archdiocese of Tororo, through its development arm CARITAS, empowers the laity with skills that can improve their economic base. 69% of the people are peasant farmers with small plots of land on which to cultivate their crops. Because of this, most of them live from hand to mouth, which has an adverse impact on their income. Through CARITAS-Tororo, the Archdiocese runs programs, especially in the area of improved agricultural methods, so that families can sustain themselves better economically.

7) Women: Archdiocesan Women's Desk focuses on the realities of women. When empowered, women can do a great deal to improve their families' economic situation as well as the sanitary condition of their homes.

8) Water: Our Five-Year Strategic Plan includes a program to increase access to clean, safe water. Presently only 72% of our people have access to improved water sources; the rest have to rely on unprotected springs and wells.

The Maltese are among the oldest Christian peoples in the world, as St. Paul brought them the faith when he was shipwrecked there as a captive enroute to Rome in 60 A.D. If we let Him, how often God turns the calamities life throws at us to a good purpose!

Having just celebrated the Solemnity of the Assumption with you all on August 15, I am especially looking forward to praying in one of Malta's most beautiful churches – the Church of the Assumption in Mosta (photo below). Please know that I will hold up all our parishioners in this historic church dedicated to Our Blessed Mother.



Today, St. Mary's gets a glimpse of the wider Catholic Church through the preaching and witness of Fr. Pius Okumu of the Archdiocese of Tororo, Uganda, who will be celebrating all St. Mary's Masses this weekend. This is his first visit to the United States, and I know that the good people of St. Mary's will make him feel welcome.

In today's Gospel, Jesus names Peter as "the rock" on which He will build His Church. Thank you for your generosity to today's annual Mission Appeal, which will "build" up and strengthen the Catholic Church in Uganda.

THOU ART PETER ...

"[After quoting Matthew 16:18f; John 21:15ff]... On Peter Christ builds the Church, and to him He gives the command to feed the sheep; and although He assigned a like power to all the Apostles, yet he founded a single Chair, and He established by His own authority a source and an intrinsic reason for that unity.

Indeed, the others were that also which Peter was; but a primacy is given to Peter, whereby it is made clear that there is but one Church and one Chair. So too, all are shepherds, and the flock is shown to be one, fed by all the Apostles in single-minded accord. If someone does not hold fast to this unity of Peter, can he imagine that he still holds the faith? If he desert the chair of Peter upon whom the Church was built, can he still be confident that he is in the Church?" (Cyprian, The Unity of the Catholic Church [first edition] 4, c. AD 251)

"The Lord made Simon alone, whom he named Peter, the "rock" of his Church. He gave him the keys of his Church and instituted him shepherd of the whole flock. "The office of binding and loosing which was given to Peter was also assigned to the college of apostles united to its head." This pastoral office of Peter and the other apostles belongs to the Church's very foundation and is continued by the bishops under the primacy of the Pope." Catechsim of the Catholic Church, art. 881.

PETER THE ROCK (by Rev. Dennis Hamm): Petros, the masculine form of the Greek word petra ("rock" - reflected in our English words "petrify" and "petroleum," oil from rock rather than olives), translates the Aramaic kepha ("rock"). Kepha, or Peter, is a special name that Jesus gives Simon bar Jonah to signify his appointed mission.

Why Rock? We might call someone Rocky today to refer to his physical toughness. In Simon's case the name more likely has biblical roots. First, there is the precedent of Isaiah 51:1-2, where the founding ancestors of the people of Israel, Abraham and Sarah, are called, respectively, "the rock from which you were hewn" and "the pit from which you were quarried." Then there is the fact that the expected messiah was to be the builder of a new temple, just as in 2 Samuel 7 the son of David was to build a temple; and even though the first son of David, Solomon, built the first temple, the end-time Messiah was also expected to build the temple of the messianic age. When Jesus speaks of "building" his Church on the rock of Simon, he is of course speaking of a community, but the image is that of a physical structure, a temple. And temple does indeed become a favorite image of the early Church to describe itself (as in 1 Cor 3:10-16, 1 Pet 2:2-8, and Eph 2:19-22).

But, yes, the Church can be pictured as temple, but it is also a household. That image comes into play when Jesus speaks of giving Peter the keys to the kingdom. Isaiah 22, the First Reading this Sunday, provides the background. King Hezekiah's steward has abused his office and the prophet mediates the divine command that the king is to dismiss him and bestow the key of the house of David upon Eliakim. With the language of "keys to the kingdom," Jesus appoints Peter as steward of the Church, now imaged as household - indeed, the spiritual household of the ultimate Son of David.

A further image comes into play when Jesus speaks of "binding and loosing" to describe Peter's authority. Binding and loosing refers to the authority of the chief rabbi of a community. Sometimes it referred to the application of the Torah to a particular case (the apparent reference here). Sometimes it referred to the power to include or exclude a member of the community (see Mt 18:18). Thus, Jesus makes Peter, in effect, chief rabbi of the community of the Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

is one of the three sacraments of initiation into the Catholic Church (together with Baptism and Holy Communion).

This special anointing given by the bishop or priest has the effect of increasing, deepening, and strengthening the sanctifying grace of God given to us at our baptism; while baptism removes from our souls the stain of original sin, Confirmation pours into our souls the power of the Holy Spirit and his seven gifts - just like the Apostles received at Pentecost. Confirmation is, therefore, the sacrament most closely identified with the special outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit. (Acts 8:14-17)

If baptism is like a seed of Divine life in the soul, then Confirmation makes that seed come to full bloom. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1303) below are the five real spiritual effects that happen to Christians through the anointing of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

- 1. Roots us more deeply in the divine filiation [being adopted as sons and daughters of God the Father] which makes us cry, "Abba! Father!"
- 2. Unites us more firmly to Jesus Christ.
- 3. Increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us (see the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit).
- 4. Renders our bond with the Church [the Body of Christ] more perfect.
- **5.** Gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross.

For those soon to be Confirmed, these five things are points of reflection to better prepare for the receiving of such a marvelous gift of the Holy Spirit. For those who have already been Confirmed, this list can inspire the following question in our hearts: Am I fully living according to the grace of the Holy Spirit bestowed on me at my Confirmation?
