Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Happy New Year! Advent marks the beginning of a new year in the Church calendar, as we recall the First Coming of Jesus among us as the Babe of Bethlehem, and as we look forward to His Second Coming as the King of Glory.

The Advent Mass readings today through December 16 focus on Jesus' return at the Last Judgment, then on December 17 shift to His birth 2,000 years ago. In a real sense, the Advent readings capture the way a faithful Christian lives – reflecting on the Jesus Who once walked among us as man, and also preparing to meet Him face to face one day.

The shift in Church seasons is evident in our worship space in several ways today. For Advent the sanctuary draperies have been changed to purple, the Church's color of penance and preparation. Likewise the priest's and deacon's vestments are purple – the darker "royal" purple of Jesus the newborn King or returning triumphant King. This is different from the more "violet" purple of Lent, the redder tint of which suggests the blood spilt for us by Jesus on Calvary. For this same reason the Advent vestments are much richer in ornamentation than the simple vestments worn during Lent.

To the right of the sanctuary stands the St. Mary's Advent wreath, the candles of which will count down for us the weeks until Christmas, even as time itself counts down to the return and final judgment of Jesus. We hope that an Advent wreath will grace your own family table tonight, as it is a beautiful way to bring prayer into your home and teach children about the two comings of Jesus.

As we look at the way our church building has been transformed for Advent, we are each invited to consider the transformation that God is calling us to in these four short weeks of grace. How can we move from fear to courage, doubt to trust, covetousness to generosity, sorrow to joy, and loneliness to the sure knowledge that GOD IS WITH US in the person of Jesus Christ? How can we make sure that Christmas finds us spiritually closer to God than we are right now today?

Prayer is always the foundation of our relationship with God, and Advent prayer books have been made available at the church entrances for you to take home. We hope they will enrich both your four-week journey to

Christmas and your greater journey to God. Monday Adoration and extra Confession times are also available this season. A good Confession, especially if it's been awhile since we last experienced the healing grace of that sacrament, can help us open up and allow Jesus to come anew into our hearts like few things can.

In the end, Advent invites each of us to look honestly at our relationships with God and neighbor so as to make whatever changes and fresh starts are needed to be more faithful disciples. Above all, we must avoid the trap of spending all our time and energy on external Christmas preparations, and none on our interior / spiritual life.

May the Lord of Our Advent Journey bless you and yours.

# Why do we do this?

At the presentation of the gifts, the faithful present the gifts of bread and wine to the priest, symbolizing an offering of creation and themselves back to the Father. This also gives an exterior sign of our internal offerings – we offer our prayers and ourselves in the same way that we offer these mere gifts of bread and wine, hoping that just as they are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ, so may we be transformed by His grace.

# WHAT HAPPENS WHEN THE 4<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY OF ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS EVE ARE THE SAME DAY? ~

The Sunday Mass Obligation for the Weekend of Saturday, December 23 and Sunday, December 24 remains. The 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent is a distinct and essential part of our spiritual journey to Christmas, even though Christmas Eve is that same Sunday afternoon.

This year Catholics should therefore plan to attend Mass either Saturday Afternoon or Sunday Morning for the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent, *in addition* to whatever Christmas Mass they attend. Those who choose to attend Mass twice on Sunday – in the morning for Advent and then later that day for Christmas, are permitted to receive Communion twice in the same day. God bless you!

### TIMELY ADVENT WISDOM FROM POPE SAINT JOHN PAUL II:

Dearest Brothers and Sisters! With today's first Sunday of Advent, a new liturgical year begins. The Church takes up her journey again, and invites us to reflect more intensely on the mystery of Christ, a mystery that is always new and that time cannot exhaust. Christ is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. Thanks to him, the history of humanity proceeds as a pilgrimage toward the fulfilment of the Kingdom which he inaugurated with his Incarnation and victory over sin and death.

For this reason, Advent is synonymous with hope: not the vain waiting for a faceless God, but concrete and certain trust in the return of Him who has already visited us, of the "Spouse" who with His blood has sealed with humanity a pact that is an eternal covenant. It is a hope that stimulates vigilance, the characteristic virtue of this special liturgical season. Vigilance in prayer, fostered by a loving expectation; vigilance in the dynamics of concrete charity, aware that the Kingdom of God comes close whenever men learn to live as brothers.

The Christian community begins Advent with these resolutions, keeping the spirit vigilant, the better to receive the message of the Word of God. We recall the famous and wonderful oracle of the Prophet Isaiah, spoken at a time of crisis in the history of Israel. "In the days to come, the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills. All nations shall stream toward it;... they shall beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again" (cf. Isaiah 2,1-5).

These words contain a promise of peace that is more urgent than ever for humanity and, in particular, for the Holy Land, from where even today, unfortunately, sad and worrying news reaches us. May the words of the Prophet Isaiah inspire the minds and hearts of believers and of all men and women of good will ... to create a more serene and solidary climate in the world.

I entrust this invocation for peace to Mary, vigilant Virgin and Mother of hope. In a few days, with renewed faith we will celebrate the Solemnity of her Immaculate Conception. May she guide us on the way, helping every human person and nation to look to the "mountain of the Lord", an image of the final triumph of Christ and the advent of his Kingdom of peace.
