THE HOLLISTON PANTRY SHELF SUPPLIES FOOD FREE OF CHARGE TO HOLLISTON

RESIDENTS IN NEED: We offer a grocerv store shopping experience where Holliston residents are able to select from close to 500 quality food items, including: milk, beef, chicken, fish, pork, seasonal produce, eggs, cheese, yogurt, canned soups, beans, pastas, cereals, coffee, snacks, and much more. We also offer personal care items like shampoo, laundry detergent, soap and toothpaste. The Holliston Pantry Shelf offers complete privacy and confidentiality for our neighbors who need temporary or longer term help meeting their grocery needs. Shoppers need to only obtain a Pantry ID card through the Town Clerk's office at the Town Hall. Personal financial information is not required. Proof of residency in Holliston is required. The Holliston Pantry Shelf is a 501 (c) 3 non-profit corporation. It receives no municipal, state or federal funding, and is operated by more than 120 unpaid volunteers. All monetary donations to the Holliston Pantry Shelf go directly toward the purchase of food or maintaining our Pantry space. The Holliston Pantry Shelf is open 5 days a week including two evenings a week.

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today John the Baptist fulfills the prophecy of Isaiah, becoming a voice of one crying out in the desert, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." In ancient times when a king planned to visit a distant part of his kingdom, he would send a herald ahead to announce his coming. As the dirt roads were often in poor condition, the king's subjects in that area were expected to carry out repairs in anticipation of his arrival.

Just so in this Advent Season, we are all being invited to effect spiritual repairs to smooth the way for God's coming anew into our lives. This is the time to fill in the potholes of resentment, the cracks of jealousy, and whatever other fractures sin has caused to mar the surface of our souls.

Always the key to a joyful and graced Christmas - one where you really feel the "Christmas Spirit" if you will is an Advent spent in real preparation. Look around for opportunities to make the necessary repairs. You know where the need for healing lies in your own family and circle of friends. You know where there is loneliness and heartache. You know where there is a need to return to prayer.

Last weekend all our Second Graders prepared the way for Jesus by making their very First Confessions. They have set a good example for all of us, reminding us of the sacrament that like no other can return us to innocence and a childlike wonder of the Lord. If you do nothing else this Advent to prepare spiritually for Christ's coming, experience the Sacrament of Confession, available here each Saturday from Noon to 12:45 PM, and also each Monday of Advent from 7-8 PM with Adoration in the Church.

In today's Psalm we asked God to "show us His kindness." And one of the most awesome ways He has done this is by giving us the means to have our sins forgiven in Confession. God has shown us the way, but as always we choose whether or not to accept His invitations to grace.

May the Lord of Our Advent Journey continue to bless you and yours.

TWO REMAINING MONDAYS IN ADVENT ~ **ADORATION & CONFESSION:** Mondays, December 11, and 18 from 7 - 8 PM. Bring your day to a restful end by basking in the True Presence of our Eucharistic Lord. Clear and quiet your soul from all that has come between you and God by making a good Confession – especially if it has been awhile. Confession is a healing encounter with Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins. The Lord's mercy, healing, and grace are given to us through this encounter. In it Jesus also strengthens us to resist future or ongoing temptation. The Sacrament of Confession is a moment of accountability for us before the Lord. The Lord's forgiveness and mercy is infinite. Nothing we have done can ever separate us from experiencing God's forgiveness through this sacrament. Confession will also continue to be offered Saturdays in the church from Noon to 12:45 PM, <u>except on December 23</u>.

WISDOM FROM THE SAINTS: "The liturgy of Advent...helps us to understand fully the value and meaning of the mystery of Christmas. It is not just about commemorating the historical event, which occurred some 2,000 years ago in a little village of Judea. Instead, it is necessary to understand that the whole of our life must be an 'advent,' a vigilant awaiting of the final coming of Christ. To predispose our mind to welcome the Lord who, as we say in the Creed, one day will come to judge the living and the dead, we must learn to recognize him as present in the events of daily life. Therefore, Advent is, so to speak, an intense training that directs us decisively toward him who already came, who will come, and who comes continuously." – Pope Saint John Paul II

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN THE 4th SUNDAY OF ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS EVE ARE THE SAME DAY?

The Sunday Mass Obligation for the Weekend of Saturday, December 23 and Sunday, December 24 remains. The 4th Sunday of Advent is a distinct and essential part of our spiritual journey to Christmas, even though Christmas Eve is that same Sunday afternoon.

This year Catholics should therefore plan to attend Mass either Saturday afternoon or Sunday morning for the 4^{th} Sunday of Advent, *in addition* to whatever Christmas Mass they attend. Those who choose to attend Mass twice on Sunday – in the morning for Advent and then later that day for Christmas, are permitted to receive Communion twice in the same day. God bless you!
