Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

I love the story of Simeon in the temple. In fact, today's Gospel is the one I have assigned for my own Funeral Mass someday. Mary and Joseph have brought the infant Christ child to be purified in the great temple in Jerusalem, according to Jewish law. There in the temple is Simeon – a holy man, to whom God had made a promise: that he would not die before he had seen the Messiah. And on this glorious day, God's promise to Simeon is fulfilled. He sees Mary and Joseph with their baby. He recognizes the presence of God – and gathers the Infant Christ into his arms. Then, with tears in his eyes, Simeon looks up to heaven and says:

"Lord, now let your servant go in peace; Your word has been fulfilled. My eyes have seen the salvation You have prepared in the sight of every people; A light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people, Israel."

I want this Gospel Reading, because I hope that I will be like Simeon when my time comes to depart this earth. Not necessarily very old, like Simeon was. But FULFILLED, like Simeon was. The reason that Simeon was able to raise his eyes to heaven and tell God that he was ready to die, was because Simeon was fulfilled. He was totally at peace, with God and neighbor. "Lord, now let your servant go in peace."

I hope that like Simeon, I may deserve one day to be called a faithful servant of the Lord. Because when this passing life ends, our fidelity to God is the only thing that will matter. The way that we have served God by loving God and neighbor is what will count, when at last we stand before Him. "Lord, now let your servant go in peace."

Simeon was promised that he would not die before he had seen the messiah – the Christ of God. And in Baptism, we have been promised that we will not die without seeing Jesus' face. No longer the tiny face of an infant. But the face of the Good Shepherd. The risen and triumphant Lord Who broke the chains of death on Easter Day. And Who faces down death again, and again, and again – when any member of His flock passes from this life to the next.

It occurs to me that at times Simeon's faith in the promises of God must have been sorely tested. At first, he was probably very excited to be promised a glimpse of the Messiah. But as days became months, and months became years without it actually happening — he must have wondered if the promise was true. Imagine if

Simeon had given up! If that day he had decided not to go to the temple to pray. If the day Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus to the temple – Simeon was someplace else – putting other matters ahead of his faith. But Simeon was there that day. He kept faith with God even when it must have appeared that God was not keeping faith with him. And Simeon's perseverance was rewarded.

We should note that God's word to Simeon was not fulfilled as he expected. Most likely, like others of his time, Simeon was on the lookout for a great general – a military Messiah, to lead Israel to freedom and greatness. Instead, Simeon was shown an infant. An innocent. Who would lead the whole human race out of darkness. To be a light for all the nations, and the glory of God's people, Israel.

Just so will it be for you and me at certain hard times of life. We may doubt the promises of God. But if we keep faith with God, He will keep faith with us. Not in the time we expect perhaps; not in the way we might choose. But in a manner far beyond anything we could have imagined. For in the words of St. Paul, "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, and no mind has conceived the things that God has prepared for those who love him."

WHY DO WE SING AT MASS? St. Augustine once proclaimed that "Singing is for the one who loves (Sermon 336, 1)." Indeed, no one sings about anything unless they are moved by a strong emotion. In the context of our creation, we see quickly that God has given us music as a gift of expression. In giving us music, God gives us a sign of His love for us. With music, we can express our love for God. Our love for Him can be expressed personally, as in a devotional song, or communally in chant or a congregational hymn. By our Baptism, God dwells within us as in a temple. And so, when we pray through song, the Holy Spirit is stirring up the music within us.

Even before the Church began, music has always been a key part of worship. The Jewish tradition of music, which has been inherited by Christianity, includes, for example, the immeasurable treasure trove of the Psalms of King David. There are also other hymns and songs throughout the Old Testament and some in the New Testament as well. The written Word of God is the basis of our music as Christians because the words give us the reality of God's love for us and the expression of that love to God by the Chosen People of Israel. Even if we do not have the words of all the hymns and songs which were sung, we know that there was a lot of singing. The Last Supper, as a Passover meal, would have had numerous songs which were part of the liturgical celebration. After the Cross and Resurrection, whenever the Church gathered, there would be singing.

Whether our faith is strong or weak, we are emboldened by the singing of hymns in gratitude to God. As Pope Pius XII wrote in Musicae Sacrae Disciplina, music can "make the liturgical prayers of the Christian community more alive and fervent so that everyone can praise and beseech the Triune God more powerfully, more intently and more effectively (MSD, 31; cf. 33)."

Every day, blood donors help patients of all ages - accident and burn victims, heart surgery and organ transplant patients, and those battling cancer. In fact, every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood.

Why is it Important to Donate Blood?

About 328 million people currently live in the U.S. Each year, approximately 6.8 million people in the U.S donate blood. Annually, this adds up to about 13.6 million units of whole blood collected for donation in the U.S. The Red Cross provides about 40% of our nation's blood and blood cell components to donors. Your blood donations are used for patients in need of surgery, cancer treatment and transfusions for blood loss from traumatic injuries. Want to know more about the blood supply in the U.S.?

Why Cancer Patients Need Blood:

For cancer patients, blood transfusions can act as a resource to implement platelets back into the body after heavy treatments such as chemo or radiation therapy. For cancer patients, blood cells that are made in the bone marrow are often at risk. This lack of blood cell production can cause chronic diseases over time which may affect organs such as the kidneys, spleen and liver.

The Importance of Diversity in the Blood Supply:

Maintaining diversity in the blood supply is essential. Some blood types are quite rare and are likeliest to be found among people with shared ancestral origins.

The Mass will be offered for the souls of every child lost before receiving the Sacrament of Baptism. By commending these children to Jesus, Whose tenderness toward them caused Him to say: "Let the children come to Me, do not hinder them," (CCC1261) we will be surrendering our grief, and the hope that God, Who desires that all people should be saved, will see to it that His precious children, and ours, may soon share His joy in heaven. If you have lost a child prior to baptism, know someone who has, or just want to show your solidarity for grieving families, come to our special Mass on January 8. Add your voice to theirs in Communion with our Lord.


