Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

A dramatic change greets us as we enter the church building this weekend. Gone are the evergreens, poinsettias, and lights of Christmas. In their place is the simplicity of Ordinary Time, as our liturgical calendar skips thirty years from Christ's infancy to the start of His public ministry.

The fact that most of Jesus' life was spent in obscurity allows us each to "fill in the blanks". We can imagine Him as a boy, running and playing with the other children of Nazareth. In our mind's eye we can see Jesus at Joseph's side, learning to cut and shape wood to useful purpose. We can be comforted by the fact that most of Jesus' life was quite ordinary. He lived as we do, growing in body, mind, and spirit. He knew the same joys and sorrows, likes and dislikes, that we do. Most importantly, He grew in understanding of His Heavenly Father's will. By living most of His years in unremarkable fashion, Jesus has truly made all that is ordinary rich in the grace of God.

This weekend our Scriptures share the common theme of "God's call". Samuel is called by God to serve Him as a prophet. The Psalmist cries out his willingness to submit his life to God's plan. St. Paul reminds us that we are all called to keep our minds and bodies pure as dwelling places for the Holy Spirit, while Andrew and Peter answer Jesus' call to "come and see" where He is staying. Occasionally God's call is dramatic and unmistakable. More often it is subtle and needs to be discerned through prayer. But the fact is that God never stops calling each of us to holiness, to particular paths, and to the unique peace that comes from knowing and accomplishing His will.




