This Sunday Evening, March 17, from 6 – 8 PM in Fr. Haley Hall.



Spiritual points are made about praying, intercession, and healing.

Emphasis is on the Gospel message of healing to bring people to encounter Jesus.

There is no cost, but a free will offering basket will be available to support the Relic Ministry.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be available during the Relic Exposition for anyone facing serious illness – mental or physical.

This weekend the Holy Relics of more than one hundred saints will be Exposed for Veneration at St. Mary's.

They include relics of St. Francis of Assisi, St. Therese of Lisieux (the Little Flower), and St. Anthony of Padua.

Some of the rarest relics of the Passion will also be present, including relics of the True Cross and Crown of Thorns.

The Exposition will begin with a presentation and teaching about relics that is aimed at answering the guests' questions.

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Thank you to all the St. Mary's men, women, and children who spent time visiting with the Lord during our parish's Forty Hours Devotion this past few days. It was wonderful to see at times as many as twenty people in the church at once, including whole families spending an hour together with Jesus. I especially commend the parents who brought their children and teens to visit with Christ in Adoration, a beautiful example that will remain with them and hopefully move them to seek out Christ in this way when they have a need of His Presence and grace. Unlike all the other sacraments, the Eucharist does not just lead us to God, it is God Himself. By visiting the church to adore the Eucharist exposed on the altar, we put ourselves in the very presence of the Almighty, allowing His grace to come upon us whether visibly and quick-felt - or secretly, and unfolding only in the fullness of God's time.

"Create a clean heart in me, O God," we sing as our Psalm Response today. And as we enter these final few weeks of Lent, we remember the awesome cleansing grace available to us in the Sacrament of Confession. In this holy sacrament, Jesus frees us from the bonds of sin and death, giving us a new life in Him. To make a good Confession is to be called forth from the darkness of guilt and hurt into the light of God's merciful love.

During a recent Religious Ed. Class, one of the seventh grade girls asked me if priests were allowed to hear their own confessions. I told her no, that in fact such an act is specifically forbidden by Church law. Just think of the trouble one might get into if they had the easy route of hearing their own confession! There would be no humility, no setting aside of pride to admit one's faults aloud to another. Perhaps most terribly, a priest confessing to himself would not get to hear spoken to him those awesome words of forgiveness – "I absolve you of your sin."

Only in confessing our sins to a priest, do any of us get to actually hear out loud God's response to our sins. As anyone who has ever stood in need of forgiveness knows, there is a part of us that can only be truly healed when the offended party tells us that they forgive us. In the Sacrament of Confession, we remember that all sins against others or even ourselves, are also hurtful to God – God Who always stands ready to forgive if we are humble and trusting enough, to ask for His mercy.


"I am Patrick, yes a sinner and indeed untaught; yet I am established here in Ireland where I profess myself bishop. I am certain in

The Mass concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose in Father Haley Hall, where Adoration will continue until 10:00 PM. At Mass a collection will be taken up for the Holliston Food Pantry.

The 7:00 PM Lord's Passion Celebration is the official Good Friday Liturgy that continues the three day Triduum Celebration begun on Holy Thursday and concluding at Easter. It consists of the Liturgy of the Passion, Veneration of the Cross, and Holy Communion. The Noon Stations are designed for younger children K – Grade 5, (accompanied by parents), and utilize a living tableau and special station prayers to help young children discover Jesus' love for them in the here and now.

Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence from meat. In every single Catholic parish around the world this day, a collection is taken up to maintain the Shrines and struggling Christian communities in the Holy Land. This collection is taken up at both the Stations and Passion Services.
