Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

This Wednesday, we enter Our Lady's Month of May, a time when flowers start to bloom and new life springs forth all around us. This time of year reminds us of the new life that Mary welcomed into her womb at the Annunciation, and the new life that Jesus her Son won for the whole world.

Mary was chosen by God to be the Mother of Jesus, but at the Cross Jesus gave her to all of us, saying to the beloved disciple, "Son, there is your mother," and to Mary, "Mother, there is your son." One of Jesus' final acts was to share His own mother with us, so that in her we might always have a strong advocate and avenue to His divine love.

This May I invite you to reclaim Mary as your own spiritual mother. Lay your troubles before her in prayer, even as once the hosts of the wedding at Cana made Mary aware that the wine was running out. Be confident that just as Mary took that situation to Jesus, so she will carry your challenges, hurts, hopes and deepest needs to the One Who at Cana turned water into wine.

Especially if your faith has been running dry – if you have stopped praying, if you have stopped feeling the nearness and constancy and love of God in your life – let Mary help you. Ask her to help bring you back to her Son, that He might transform the water of your doubts into the rich wine of faith.

A hallmark of Catholic prayer is the rosary, and there is no better way to embrace your Blessed Mother and ask her aid than by praying the holy rosary, especially if you have fallen out of the habit. It was at Fatima that the Blessed Mother asked Catholics to pray the rosary each and every day for the intention of peace in the world, a prayer we are certainly in need of today.

Additionally, the rosary has great power to bring unity and peace to those families who pray it together, and I hope that every family of our parish will pray the rosary at least once together during Mary's month.

Let us all continue to pray that Our Lady might take us under the protection of her mantle and intercede powerfully for us in our time of need.

MAY 8 AND 9, SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION ~ A Holy Day of Obligation

Vigil Mass, Wednesday, May 8, at 7:00 PM Feast Day Masses, Thursday, May 9, at 9:00 AM & 6:30 PM

The Feast of the Ascension of Jesus Christ is celebrated each year on the fortieth day after the Feast of Pascha (Easter). Since the date of Pascha changes each year, the date of the Feast of the Ascension also changes. The Feast is always celebrated on a Thursday and marks an event of such importance that it is a Holy Day of Obligation. This means that Catholics attend Mass this day as on a Sunday. The Feast itself commemorates when, on the fortieth day after His Resurrection, Jesus led His disciples to the Mount of Olives, and after blessing them and asking them to wait for the fulfillment of the promise of the Holy Spirit, He ascended into heaven. Where He has gone, we hope one day to follow!

MAY 12, MOTHER'S DAY: A special Blessing of Mothers will take place at all Masses this weekend.

Social Host Liability Law

- Massachusetts' legal drinking age is 21.
 'Social host liability' means you can be held financially and/or civilly responsible if your guest harms, injures, or kills another person after having consumed alcohol at your home.
- Parents who give permission for their underage child to drink alcohol could also be civilly liable.
- Anyone who furnishes alcohol to a minor risks a fine of up to \$2,000 and a one-year jail sentence.

Talk With Your Teen

- Personal safety and a safe prom night/graduation is everyone's priority.
- Teens crave clear and consistent limits and want to know expectations and consequences; this is a big stress relief for them.
- You are the strongest influence on your teen.

 Talk with them early and often this prom
 and graduation season about the dangers
 of drinking, drugs, and peer pressure.
- Give teens the opportunity to share their thoughts with open-ended questions jumpstart with: What are you excited about? Is anything causing you stress? Are you feeling pressure about prom/graduation? What myths have you heard about prom/graduation parties? When you think of prom/graduation what peer pressure comes to mind? It is also good to share your thoughts as well as how you might manage different situations.
- Talk with other parents/caregivers most are not okay with parties that involve alcohol or drugs.
- Binge drinking is a set up for teens to make bad decisions and to lose control when it comes to sexual behavior, criminal mischief, violent behavior, or using illicit drugs.

Fully charge phones for safety and selfies!

Prom and graduation are to be celebrated! Most students make healthy lifestyle choices throughout their school experience which includes these very events. Encourage accountability and safety through the "buddy-system" to support healthy and fun celebrations.

Trusting your teen is key! Part of giving trust is discussing pre- and post- prom/graduation party plans. Let your teen know they can call or text anytime for any reason – you can discuss details later. Have a code, emoji, or word they can share to ask for help especially if they are in an unsafe situation. You and your teen can think ahead, plan for potentially tricky situations, and determine ways that can keep them, their friends, and all kids safe.

Be Aware! Potentially Deadly Consequences...

- Right now, the dangerous and alarming presence of the powerful synthetic opioid fentanyl is being mixed with almost every street drug - including marijuana, cocaine, and pills made to look like Adderall or other prescription medicine.
- More deaths of Americans under age 50 are related to fentanyl more than any other cause of death including heart disease, cancer, homicide, suicide, and other accidents. (*DEA, 2023)
- Fentanyl's extreme potency makes drugs cheaper, more powerful, more addictive, and more dangerous; even deadly. Please talk to your teens! The risk is REAL!
