FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

HAPPY BIRTHDAY! Today is the Feast of Pentecost, often called the "Birthday of the Church." This was the day when Jesus took a group of frightened, unsure disciples and transformed them into fearless witnesses of His Gospel. This was accomplished by the Holy Spirit, which as described in today's Gospel Jesus sent upon His disciples with the sound of wind and the form of fire.

Perhaps take a moment today to look at the Holy Spirit window in the St. Mary transept of our own church. In it the Holy Spirit is shown as a dove, surrounded by the very tongues of flame that descended on the disciples on Pentecost. Like candles touched by fire, the disciples were set ablaze – powered now by the Spirit's sevenfold gifts to bring light to a darkened world.

The gifts of the Holy Spirit, also depicted on our window, are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude (strength), knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. They were poured out on each of us in the Sacrament of Confirmation through the ministry of the bishop, who prayed the following words:

"All powerful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by water and the Holy Spirit you freed your sons and daughters from sin and gave them new life. Send your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and guide. Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence. Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in your presence. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen."

Then the bishop, making the sign of the cross with Holy Chrism upon our forehead, said, "Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Once Confirmed, the Gifts of the Holy Spirit are ever present and accessible to us by prayer. They are God's own gifts, meant to empower us for Christian living and for the work of sharing with others the Gospel of Christ's love.

I invite you on this Feast of Pentecost to reflect on the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, and to consider which one you feel the greatest need for at this moment of your journey home to God. Then by prayer ask God to breathe upon the embers of that gift already glowing within your soul, that it might burst into new flame and power in your life. In closing, I would like to thank all those who contributed to St. Mary's presence in last weekend's 300th Anniversary of Holliston Parade. This includes the individuals and families who walked and the St. Mary's Knights of Columbus. Special thanks to our float designers and builders – Billy Hanson, Bill and Mary Lou Dolan, Dave DeStefano, Bill Duffy and Lisa Dufault. St. Mary's is "only" 154 years old, but we are by far the largest religious organization in town and our people are a true blessing to the community. Again, thank you to all who represented us so well!

May the Lord of Our Journey continue to bless you and yours.


FIRST COMMUNION TEEN VOLUNTEERS ARE
