Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today we join the nation in mourning the victims of Wednesday's Georgia school shooting. We commend to the hands of God students Mason Schermerhorn and Christian Angulo, both 14, and teachers Richard Aspinwall and Cristina Irimie. We ask His strength and blessing upon their grieving loved ones. And we ask for healing for the nine injured during the shooting.

Whenever evil touches our lives, as individuals or as a nation, it is an opportunity to be strengthened in our own Christian identity. With contrast can come clarity. I remember reading, for instance, how as a young man Pope Benedict XVI observed firsthand the violence and hatred of the Nazi regime. He saw his own parish priest badly beaten by Nazi soldiers. He heard the rhetoric of intolerance proclaimed by Nazi propagandists. In stark contrast to all this, however, the future pope saw the Church standing up for the oppressed and proclaiming God's love for all people and the universal offer of salvation. This made on him a profound impression.

Just as Pope Benedict's experience of the evils of Nazism made him more determined to commit himself to the good work of Christ's Church, so the evils of violence like Wednesday's should make us more committed to the good of our Catholic faith. Central to that faith is the belief that all human life has an innate dignity, being created in the image and likeness of God. For this reason, Catholics consider all human life to be sacred – from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death.

If there is one way above all that we should honor the memory of those whose lives were taken at Apalachee High School, it is by reaffirming the value of all human life regardless of race, creed, politics, or even personal guilt or innocence. Every time we act to defend human life – especially where it is most vulnerable or threatened – that is when we offer worthy tribute to the victims. In the end, it is our respect for the sanctity of all human life that forever separates us from those who take human life for any reason.

### 2024 MINISTRY SECTION

Our parish offers many opportunities to grow in God's Spirit and to serve others in our own community and beyond the boundaries of Holliston as well. This booklet offers brief descriptions of ministries here at St. Mary's and ways you can be involved. Please consider how you can contribute your time and talent to the life of our parish community and respond as you are able to this call for volunteers. Thank you for your participation in and support of our parish life. Let us all pray for our parish's continued growth as a community of Jesus' disciples, called to love and serve the Lord and each other.

**MUSIC MINISTRY:** The Music Ministry at St. Mary's Parish involves people of many ages and the music of varied traditions. All our music, though, shares the same purpose – to give glory to God, and to help our people experience Him through the power and beauty of sacred song.

St. Mary's is blessed to have a wonderfully active music program. Our Adult Choir is a dedicated and warm group with a passion for traditional music. They sing for the 11:30 AM Mass every Sunday, enriching the liturgy with a variety of choral anthems ranging from Gregorian chant to modern compositions, both a cappella and accompanied, aided by the help of professional section leaders. This choir rehearses on Thursday evenings.

Our St. Mary's Children and Youth Choirs are particularly seeking more singers! These choirs prepare anthems for the Sunday 9:30 AM Mass every few weeks, providing a wonderful chance for children and youth to bond through musical growth and worshipful song. Both groups rehearse on Wednesday afternoons.

Whether you are an experienced musician, or totally new to music, there is a place for you in St. Mary's Music Ministry!

Adult Choir: Begins September 5. Open to all voices ages 13 and older. Sings every Sunday at 11:30 AM Mass (warmups 10:45 AM). Rehearses Thursday from 7:00 - 9:00 PM in the Lower Church.

Youth Choir: Begins September 4. Open to all voices grades 6 and up. Sings every few Sundays at 9:30 AM Mass (call time 8:50 AM). Rehearses Wednesday from 4:00 - 5:00 PM in the Lower Church.

Children's Choir: Begins September 4. Open to all voices grades 3 - 5. Sings every few Sundays at 9:30 AM Mass (call time 8:50 AM). Rehearses Wednesday from 3:30 - 4:20 PM in the Lower Church.

HOSPITALITY/WELCOMING COMMITTEE: This committee helps new members of St. Mary's feel welcome in their new parish. We host a Welcome Gathering, aka Donuts, Juice and Coffee (DJ&C) fellowship hour after the 9:30 AM Mass the First Sunday of the month. All are welcome and are encouraged to introduce themselves to the new families. New parishioners receive an invitation to an upcoming "DJ&C". This enjoyable event fosters goodwill and fellowship among St. Mary's parishioners.

**USHERS:** Do you attend the same Mass time most weekends? Then please consider being an usher. Your collection work literally keeps the lights on! Annual CORI's apply.



**MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH GROUP:** Faithful adults are needed to help out as trip chaperones and at Monthly Youth Group Meetings for this huge and thriving ministry. Meetings are just once a month, anchoring this program of prayer, faith, friendship and fun. Be part of the joy!

**HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH GROUP (TGIF):** After our amazing Mississippi Mission Trip, we now look forward to a new year of growing in faith, service and friendship together. Parents are needed for Meetings and Trip help.

**ADULT VOLUNTEER MEETING ~ MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH GROUP:** Monday, September 23 at 7 PM in Father Haley Hall. Any adult parishioner who attends Mass weekly at St. Mary's, and who is living a life in harmony with the moral teachings of the Catholic faith, may volunteer to be part of this joyful ministry. With Monthly Meetings averaging 90 - 199 teens, and many well attended trips of over 100 teens each, we need many adults to assure safety and to guide our young people into faith, friendship, service and fun. **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION:** Our parish Religious Education Program assists parents in the formation of their children and teens in the Catholic Faith and Traditions. Through religious instruction and preparation for the Sacraments, a continuous spiral approach to faith formation for each grade offers a foundation upon which to build a lifelong relationship with Jesus Christ. Our program depends solely on faith filled volunteer teachers from Pre-K through Grade 10. Please call 508-429-6076 if you can take part in our teaching ministry. *See the back page of this bulletin for details.* 

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD: CLOW is held during the 9:30 AM Mass on Sunday mornings. It offers children from Kindergarten and beyond the opportunity to have their own celebration of the Liturgy of the Word. Children leave the main assembly to hear the readings proclaimed from the Catholic Children's Lectionary. They are able to participate in a "dialogue homily." Right now new leaders are urgently needed, and will be welcomed and mentored in the ministry. Materials are provided in advance of the celebrations. Adult Monitors from within the congregation are essential to assist the children's safe movement from the main church to the lower hall.





**ALTAR SERVERS:** The St. Mary's Altar Servers minister at Sunday and Holy Day Masses, as well as at First Communions, weddings and other parish liturgical celebrations. Their presence in the sanctuary is a reminder that the young are an important part of the church, and that Catholics of all ages have gifts to offer to God and to our community. Any boy or girl in the 4th to 12th grade may become a server. We need about nine new servers this year!

**ART AND ENVIRONMENT:** This ministry is responsible for the liturgical decoration of the church, including flowers and plants inside the church, and planting and general upkeep of the flowers around the church. The exterior work entails seasonal plantings, clean up and weeding, pruning and dead heading. The interior work entails the care of the green plants in the trough behind the altar and seasonal arrangements of plants and flowers.

ST. MARY'S MARRIAGE FELLOWSHIP: This is a parish ministry that provides opportunities for married couples to connect and grow together spiritually. The ministry meets monthly for fellowship and a brief reflection on topics related to marriage, raising children, faith formation, and service. Whether you are newly married or have been together for many years, we'd love to meet you! Free onsite childcare will be provided by teen volunteers from St. Mary's Confirmation program for couples who have young children. Please plan to bring an appetizer or dessert to share and be certain children have already eaten dinner. We hope you can join us!

**ST. MARY'S NEWSLETTER COMMITTEE:** A group of volunteers meet to share light refreshments and socialize as they help to get timely parish information out to all registered parishioners by labeling and sealing approximately 2,000 Newsletters. The Newsletters are composed according to the Liturgical Calendar, and not on a regular monthly schedule. We meet in Fr. Haley Hall, on select Mondays after the 9 AM daily mass. An email is sent out to all volunteers a week or two prior to the event. Your participation can be as full as you prefer. Many hands make light work – please consider joining us!

**PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY:** Have you ever wanted to give your fellow parishioners a hug? PSALM (Prayer Shawls and Lots More) knits and crochets shawls, wraps, and lap blankets for people who are dealing with illness, bereavement, or a change in circumstances. If you can knit or crochet, or want to learn, join us in this tangible sign of support.

**LECTORS:** At Mass, the lector, or reader, proclaims the Word of God, the Old and New Testament readings, and presents the petitions during the Prayer of the Faithful. Lectors are men, women and teens of good faith, eager to serve their community. While lectors need not be professionally trained in public communication, certain basic abilities for public speaking are necessary for the lector to proclaim the Word of God in an effective manner to the liturgical assembly. Lectors participate in initial and ongoing skill training and support.

**MINISTRY TO THE HOMEBOUND:** One way in which our parish ministers to those who are "homebound" is to provide the opportunity for regular pastoral visits and the reception of Holy Communion. Pastoral visitors provide support to the homebound person through their presence and careful attention, as well as with prayer and communion. Volunteers are needed for this important ministry.

**EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS:** The Eucharistic Minister is a person of faith called to bring the Body and Blood of Christ to his or her fellow Catholic Christians. Eucharistic Ministers serve at all of our weekend Masses and on all Holy Days of Obligation. Preparation for this ministry includes both practical training and ongoing spiritual formation.

**YOUTH LECTORS:** The St. Mary's Youth Lector program allows youths in 7th grade or higher to proclaim the Word of God at Mass and at other liturgical celebrations. Youth Lectors are most often assigned to the Sunday 9:30 AM Family Mass, so that the young may minister to their peers. Otherwise, the character of the ministry is very much the same as for adult lectors.

**PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL:** The Parish Pastoral Council is an advisory group that acts as the "voice" of the people of St. Mary's. Its members assist the pastor by making him aware of the needs, ideas, concerns, and dreams of our parishioners - and helps develop plans to address them. The Council meets several times a year from 7:00 to 8:30 PM in person or via Zoom. Please consider nominating yourself or someone you know to the Council. To be sure we represent our parish, we welcome adults of all ages, married or single, with or without children, who have a love for St. Mary's and our faith.

**VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL:** VBS is a weeklong celebration of faith. Through song, prayer, arts & crafts, movies, drama and scripture, the children grow in their understanding of God's love. VBS takes place for one week each year in late July, Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM. Exact dates are announced in the spring in the Parish Bulletin and Parish Newsletter.

**ST. MARY'S MOM'S PRAYER GROUP:** There will be a MOM'S GROUP every Tuesday, 9:45-11 AM starting this week, September 10 in Fr. Haley Hall. Every week, we will pray together, read reflections according to the liturgical season, and share prayer intentions. Children of all ages are welcome and there will be a few toys and coloring activities available. Coffee and snacks will be provided. Contact Meghan Krenselewski at 978-421-5795.

WINGS: Women in God's Spirit (WINGS) offers encouragement and enrichment for women of all ages who seek to deepen their faith and grow in their relationship with God and one another. We host 3 six week seasons (Fall, Winter, Spring) on Wednesday mornings in Fr. Haley Hall and via Zoom. Our meetings include fellowship, prayer, presentations from inspiring speakers and time for questions and discussion. Loving childcare is available. Women are welcome even if not registered or unable to come on a regular basis. In addition to our attendees, we have a core team that develops and delivers these wonderful programs. The core team is always looking for women who want to enrich the ministry by sharing their talents. **ST. MARY'S CATHOLIC WOMEN'S GROUP:** Warm and friendly prayers and companionship are shared by a wonderful and intimate group called "St. Mary's Catholic Women's Group". This is one of the other groups for Women, with a different focus than WINGS. They meet on the second Wednesday of the month in March, April, September, October, November and December at 12:00 noon for lunch and friendship. Their activities are nonprofit and they raise funds for various projects and groups. Welcome all who'd like to spend time with some wonderful women of God.

**KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS:** St. Mary's Knights of Columbus Council #14224 is a fraternal organization open to Catholic men ages 18 and older. The Knights is a service organization whose members commit to pledging volunteer hours of service by helping the Church, our families, and local community. Our core principles are charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. We sponsor local charities and youth programs and strive to meet parish needs and other worthy causes through fundraising and service. Meetings are held monthly, and new members are always welcome.

**RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE:** This committee promotes an awareness of the value of human life from conception to natural death. Some of the activities that the group sponsors are the parish's participation in the October "Respect Life Walk", the Rose for Life remembrance, Pennies from Heaven Lenten collection for children and the "Baby Shower" as well as the Respect Life resource board in the Center Hall lobby.

**LENTEN SUPPERS:** Friday evenings during Lent, St. Mary's offers parishioners the opportunity to gather together in faith for community prayer, a meal and reflection as a way of observing this holy season. We need volunteers to help with these wonderful weekly suppers as they are getting larger with each coming season of Lent. When you sign up for this ministry, you are added to the "Lenten Supper Volunteer" email database. There is no mandatory commitment. Weekly emails of a "Sign Up Genius" list get sent out with slots for drinks/food that make up each Friday night meal. Examples of slots consist of bread/salad, soup, pizza, side dishes, main courses and a dessert (for the kids to eat while the reflection is being lead). If you would like to join our volunteer list we would love to add you! Volunteers sign up sometimes just once during the season and some commit to a sign up for multiple or all six weeks.
