Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord - a Feast that marks the last day of the Christmas Season and the first day of Ordinary time. In Baptism, it is said that the water makes us holy. But at His Baptism it was Jesus who made the water holy, so that we all might be baptized into Him. Being sinless, Jesus had no need to be baptized. But as in all things, He showed us the way by His own example. He demonstrated that He never asks us to do anything that He Himself was not willing to humbly undergo.

Today's Gospel tells us that at His Baptism, Jesus rose from the waters and "heaven was opened." To fully understand the significance of this, we must remember that the ancient Jews saw heaven and earth as being separated by a barrier. Heaven and earth, God and man, these things were divided and apart. The prophet Isaiah, for instance, had prayed to God begging "Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down." (IS 64:1) This prayer was answered nine months before Christmas, when Jesus came down from heaven and took up residence in Mary's womb. And then, on the day of Jesus' Baptism, the heavens are torn open again - not this time so that God can come down, but so that through Baptism all mankind may ascend.

To be baptized is to die with Christ and receive the promise of eternal life in Him. It is to be washed clean of the inheritance of original sin, and adopted by God Himself. The inheritance of God's children is eternal life. This is shown beautifully in chapter seven of the Acts of the Apostles, where we find recorded the very first death of a baptized Christian. Stephen, in the midst of being martyred by stoning, lifts his eyes and says, "Behold, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God." Just as the heavens were opened at Jesus' Baptism, so the heavens open again as Jesus' follower Stephen is dying. That is Baptism's great gift and promise. That when we die, the way to heaven will not be closed. There will be no barrier between us and God. Rather, when the light of life fades, we shall see only Jesus, and the heavens opening above.



Love has always been associated with the heart, so it was only natural that the love of God became represented by a heart, the heart of his Son Jesus. In him, God the



Father revealed his infinite love for us. The Church was born from the pierced heart of Jesus on the cross. In the first creation, Eve was born from the side of Adam. In the new creation, the Church was born from the side of Jesus. The Bride from the Heart of the Bridegroom! When the soldier thrust his lance into Jesus' side, immediately blood and water flowed out.

Saint John Chrysostom had this to say about this passage: "Beloved, do not pass over this mystery without thought; it has yet another hidden meaning, which I will explain to you. I said that water and blood symbolized baptism and the holy eucharist. From these two sacraments the Church is born: from baptism, the cleansing water that gives rebirth and renewal through the Holy Spirit, and from the holy eucharist. Since the symbols of baptism and the eucharist flowed from his side, it was from his side that Christ fashioned the Church, as he had fashioned Eve from the side of Adam ... As God took a rib from Adam's side to fashion a woman, so Christ has given us blood and water from his side to fashion the Church. God took the rib when Adam was in a deep sleep, and in the same way Christ gave us the blood and the water after his own death."

Since the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, from his Sacred Heart, this should have great meaning for us. In prayer, we contemplate the pierced Heart of our Savior. We contemplate his incredible love. We reflect on the mercy, compassion and love that God has bestowed upon us. We become enthralled by Christ, like Saint Paul, who prayed that Christ might dwell in the hearts of the Ephesian Christians through faith and that they might know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge.

When Christ dwells in our hearts, when we know his love deeply, in our minds and hearts, we are moved to live the great commandments of love of God and neighbor. We are motivated by the Sacred Heart of Jesus to open our hearts to him so that they are filled with love for our brothers and sisters. In this way, we learn to live Jesus' commandment: Love one another as I have loved you.
