Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

"Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future.

If not you can cut it down."


This Sunday of Lent Jesus presents us with His parable of the fig tree. The garden owner is God the Father, who sees that the tree has born no fruit for years and is ready to cut it down. The gardener is Jesus, who asks for time to work with the fig tree - to work with us - that with His help we can begin to bear the fruit of holiness.

This parable reveals the mercy and love of Jesus - the totality of His commitment to us. But it also reminds us that our time in this earthly garden is limited. Like the fig tree, we all eventually need to account for what we do with the years we are given. Are we spiritually barren? Or do good works abound in our lives? Have we lived only for ourselves? Or do we strive to consider the needs and happiness of those God has "planted" around us?

Like the Ash Wednesday admonition that "We are dust and unto dust we shall return," the parable of the fig tree is meant to show that we do not have limitless time to serve God well and glorify Him by our lives. This truth is not meant to inspire fear, but a new urgency in our Christian discipleship. It also invites us to look toward heaven as our life's goal.

Sometimes, for instance, I encounter parents who lavish every temporal advantage on their children - the very best food, clothes, educations, every possible advantage except one - the opportunity to know and serve Christ. These are good people who love their children. But they have forgotten that the greatest gift they can give them is the gift of faith.

How many young people today, for instance, spend each Sunday looking up at the goalposts of a football or soccer field instead of raising their eyes to see the Cross of Christ? How many parents talk to their children all the time about the sport they



play, but never teach their children how to pray, or check in on their spiritual health? Sports are fine. But a soccer ball did not die to save us from our sins. A basketball net was not raised on Calvary's hill.

For all of us, the great test of whether we are focused on worldly happiness or eternal joy is when God's law conflicts with our earthly desires. I remember a woman once saying to me (in reference to a family member's lifestyle), "but doesn't she deserve to be happy?" The answer of course is yes. But it is eternal happiness that Christ died to offer us. And if we reject His moral teachings in order to live as we wish on earth, we jeopardize the possibility of eternal and perfect joy in His presence.

Yes, Our Lord is merciful. But He also told us that we must be ready to "pick up our cross daily" if we would follow Him. We all have something that is hard for us in the moral teachings of our faith, something that requires a real sacrifice in this life and a great deal of trust in Jesus. But it is in the struggle to accept and carry those crosses that we draw closer to Him, and that our faith is tried and tempered and made strong enough to face what is to come. It is when we choose Christ above all other goods, that we bear fruit that lasts.

May the Lord of Our Lenten Journey continue to bless you and yours.

FASTING: Catholics over eighteen and up to the beginning of their sixtieth year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted; liquids, including milk and juices are allowed.

ABSTINENCE: Catholics over fourteen years of age are bound to the obligations of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. On abstinence days, meat may not be used at all. Regarding other weekdays of Lent, participation in daily Mass and the voluntary observance of fasting is recommended. Commendable, is generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing our abundance, the traditional Lenten Devotions and all the self-denial summed up in the concept of "mortification."


