Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

A quick reminder that there are no Confessions on Holy Saturday, April 19. This is because, except in danger of death, no other sacraments are celebrated once the Sacred Triduum has begun. Throughout Lent, in addition to the usual Saturday Confessions at noon, we are also offering them from 7 - 8 PM every Thursday evening.

In Luke Chapter 15, when Jesus was criticized for His ministry to sinners, He offered the parable of the Prodigal Son in reply. This parable remains the model for Jesus' continued forgiveness of sin today through the Sacrament of Confession.

- 1) Contrition: The prodigal son, reduced to herding pigs and coveting their food scraps, realizes that he has sinned. Similarly today, Reconciliation begins with realizing and admitting sin to ourselves.
- 2) Confession: The prodigal son undertakes a physical journey to see his father and confess his sins aloud to him. Similarly today, the penitent Catholic undertakes a journey to the Church, the earthly House of Our Heavenly Father. Once there, the penitent confesses his or her sins aloud to the priest.
- 3) Satisfaction: In confessing his sins, the prodigal son expresses a willingness to do anything to make up for his transgressions (i.e. becoming the least of his father's slaves). In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a penance, usually of prayer, is assigned by the confessor.
- 4) Absolution: The father of the prodigal son bestowed rich gifts upon him; sandals, a robe, and a ring. Similarly, God showers the fullness of His mercy and healing grace upon us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Further, He fortifies us to resist future temptation. The great feast thrown by the prodigal son's father upon his return reminds us that sin is never a private affair. When we sin, it damages not just our relationship with God, but also with the Church. Our celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation is the Church's equivalent of the parable's great feast, with the whole Church community spiritually involved.


5) The Older Brother: In the parable, the prodigal son's older brother denies the need for a public celebration over his return. Similarly, today some deny the need for receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, proposing that a silent, private admission of sin between an individual and God directly is adequate. This idea is gravely lacking, as it does not take into account the effect of sin on one's relationship to the Church. It further ignores the chief consequence of sin, which is that it leaves us wounded and incapacitated.

The sinners' inability to deal with sin on their own is represented scripturally by the "nakedness" of Adam and Eve, and in the case of the prodigal son by his tattered robes and shoeless feet. To have sinned is to have been made helpless, and only the healing power of Jesus Christ available today through His holy sacraments can bring about true forgiveness and a full restoration to grace. It was for this reason that Jesus specifically gave His apostles the authority to forgive sins after Him (John 20:21-23, Matt. 9:8, Matt. 18:18, 2 Cor. 5:18). Thank you Lord, for so precious a gift.

LAETARE SUNDAY: This weekend we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent, known also as "Laetare", or "Rejoicing" Sunday. The forty days of Lent are a time of fasting, abstinence, repentance, penance, almsgiving, and intense prayer.

On Laetare Sunday, however, the Church pauses to remember that all these Lenten practices are meant to ready us for Easter joy. As of today, Lent is halfway over, and so we start to anticipate the Resurrection of the Lord. Lenten sorrow is tempered by Easter gladness.

The Church's color for Lenten repentance is violet, but on this one Sunday of Lent the color is changed to rose. This custom dates back to the 13th century, with the rose color vestments standing for "subdued joy", or "relieved repentance". The rose color suggests a lightening of Lenten violet by the joyful white worn at Easter.



Because of the Rose-colored vestments worn this Sunday, it is also sometimes referred to as "Rose" Sunday. The image of the rose itself reminds us of how joy and sorrow are so often linked within the human heart. For instance, when a loved one dies, we are saddened by their loss, yet joyful that their earthly suffering is over, and the peace of heaven won. The rose bush, like life, first bears thorns. But from these thorns the most beautiful flower in the world can grow.



THURSDAY LENTEN ADORATION WITH CONFESSION: In addition to the usual Saturday Noon to 12:45 PM Confession time, during Lent St. Mary's Thursday night Eucharistic Holy Hours will also have the opportunity for Confession, from 7 - 8 PM in the church. Each Lenten Holy Hour includes an intention which we ask you kindly to add during your time before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. **This Thursday, April 3:** Please pray for Freedom from Addictions.

A LENTEN EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE: Is provided in this weekend's bulletin.

REMEMBER: There are no Confessions on Holy Saturday, April 19, due to the Sacred Triduum.

FASTING: Catholics over eighteen and up to the beginning of their sixtieth year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted; liquids, including milk and juices are allowed.

ABSTINENCE: Catholics over fourteen years of age are bound to the obligations of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. On abstinence days, meat may not be used at all. Regarding other weekdays

of Lent, participation in daily Mass and the voluntary observance of fasting is recommended. Commendable, is generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing our abundance, the traditional Lenten Devotions and all the self-denial summed up in the concept of "mortification."



FRIDAY LENTEN SUPPERS - ONLY TWO LEFT!: Join us for a great meal, prayer and deepening your community connection to your St. Mary's Family! **Fridays at 6 PM: April 4** (this one night beginning at 5:30 PM as the St. Paul's Boy Choir performs at 7 PM), **and April 11.** Our Lenten Suppers take place in Fr. Haley Hall and include a range of food options while observing Friday's abstinence from meat - as well as child-friendly food.

Families with young children are encouraged to come and not feel burdened about bringing a meal, please let your St. Mary's community lift you up. This also applies to any individual / couple / family feeling burdened where bringing a meal would prevent you from attending. We are all in different seasons of life, let your St. Mary's family be a safe landing spot for you this Lent! If you'd like to help, please email Natalie Pomarico at st.maryslentensuppers@gmail.com. You will be added to the Lenten Supper Volunteer Group. A weekly 'Sign Up Genius' goes out via email to the volunteer base and individuals sign up for available food / drink slots. 

A LENTEN EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE FOR ADULTS

An Examination of Conscience is a tool to assist one in preparing to make a good Confession. Just as accurately sharing symptoms of illness with our doctor helps physical healing, so a thorough and complete Confession of sin speeds spiritual healing. In Confession, Jesus is the great physician of our souls. As He once said, "Those who are healthy do not need a doctor, but the sick do. I have not come to call the righteous to repentance but sinners." Lk 5

I. I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before me.

- •Do I strive to love God with my whole heart, mind, soul and strength?
- •Do I give Him the priority in my life that He deserves as my Creator and Lord or rather do I make compromises on my love for God for the sake of pride, pleasure or the avoidance of a necessary sacrifice? Do I spend time in prayer daily?
- •Have I had any direct involvement with the occult, witchcraft, wicca, ouija boards, séances, tarot cards, new age crystals, fortune telling, or the like? Have I put faith in horoscopes?
- •Have I received Holy Communion in the state of mortal sin?
- •Have I abused the Sacrament of Reconciliation by deliberately lying to the priest or deliberately choosing not to confess a mortal sin?
- •Have I publicly denied a truth of the faith out of concern for the respect and opinion of others? Have I denied my faith?

II. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

•We would never think of using the name of a friend in an irreverent way. Have we always treated the allholy name of God with the greatest possible reverence and awe?

- •Have I deliberately cursed or shown contempt for or ridiculed God, Sacred Scripture, the Church, Mary, the saints, or sacred places or things? Did I cause scandal by doing this in the presence of others?
- •Have I failed to keep the promises/oaths made in the presence of God and while invoking His Name? •Did I curse or swear? Do I use profane language?

III. Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.

- •Have I deliberately missed Mass on a Sunday or Holy Day of obligation without a serious reason such as illness, severe weather, or lack of transportation?
- •Have I deliberately come late or left early from Mass? Have I disrespected the Eucharist and the Church community by walking out the door right after receiving Holy Communion, instead of praying with them?
- •Do I try to keep Sunday as a day of rest and relaxation by avoiding unnecessary work?
- •Have I deliberately allowed my children to miss Mass without a serious reason?
- •Was I easily distracted at Mass?

IV. Honor your father and your mother.

- •Do I honor, respect, and obey my parents?
- •Have I deliberately harmed my parents by word or by deed? Have I spoken badly of them in the presence of others?
- •Do I treat my children with love, respect, and affection?
- •Am I concerned about the well being (physical, spiritual, mental) of all family members?
- •Have I neglected my family responsibilities?
- •Do I respect and obey my legitimate superiors?

V. You shall not kill.

- •Have I intentionally harmed anyone?
- •Have I had an abortion or encouraged or helped someone to have an abortion?
- •Have I abused drugs or alcohol? Have I gotten high or drunk?
- •Have I attempted suicide or given deliberate consent to the idea? Have I neglected my spiritual, physical or mental health or tried to harm myself?
- •Have I ever led anyone to sin through bad example or through direct encouragement?
- •Have I gossiped, made fun of, or harmed someone's reputation by my words?

- •Have I harbored grudges or refused to forgive someone who has hurt me?
- •Have I refused to help someone who was really in need?
- •Have I been angry, resentful, or kept hatred in my heart?
- •Have I failed to correct my transgressions through charity?

VI. You shall not commit adultery.

- •Am I faithful to my spouse in thought and in action?
- •If unmarried, have I engaged in any kind of sexual activity with anyone of either sex?
- •Have I viewed pornographic magazines, videos, or Internet websites?
- •Have I masturbated or fornicated?
- •Do I dress modestly (i.e. does my dress reflect my dignity as a child of God and preserve my body as a temple of the Holy Spirit or could I lead others to sinful thoughts by my dress)?
- •Have I looked lustfully at someone or used impure speech in speaking of another? Have I led others to impure thoughts or actions by my own example?
- •Do I avoid laziness, gluttony, idleness, and the occasions of impurity?

VII. You shall not steal.

- •Have I stolen or accepted stolen goods?
- •Have I deliberately destroyed the property of others?
- •Have I cheated anyone of what I owe? Do I pay my debts promptly?
- •Have I cheated on my taxes?
- •Do I gamble excessively? Am I stingy? Do I share what I have with the poor?
- •Do I support the good works of my church according to my means?
- •Have I returned or made equal restitution for anything obtained immorally?

VIII. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

- •Have I lied? Have I sworn falsely? Have I gossiped? Have I plagiarized or been academically dishonest?
- •Have I revealed secrets or confidential information without good reason?
- •Have I ruined anyone's reputation by spreading lies or maliciously revealing their faults and sins?
- •Am I critical, negative or uncharitable in my talk? Am I sincere?

IX. You shall not desire your neighbor's wife.

- •Have I deliberately and consciously entertained sexual thoughts about anyone beside a spouse?
- •Do I guard my imagination and senses?
- •Have I watched shows, plays, pictures, or movies that contain impure scenes with the deliberate intention of being aroused by them? Am I responsible about what I read?
- •Do I pray at once to banish impure thoughts and temptations?

X. You shall not desire your neighbor's goods.

- •Am I envious or excessively desirous of the possessions, abilities, talents, beauty or success of others?
- •Have I been sorrowful over another's good fortune? Have I been happy when someone was hurt?
- •Am I moody, gloomy, sad or sour? Do I work, study and keep busy to counter idle thoughts?
- •Is my heart set on earthly possessions or on the true treasures in Heaven?

TOMORROW, MONDAY, MARCH 31 ~ GRADE 5 ROSARY GENERAL


