Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi - the Feast of the Body & Blood of Christ. We thank God for the great gift of the Eucharist, the means by which Jesus becomes truly present among us each and every time we celebrate the Holy Mass. Our belief in the bread made the Body and the wine made the Blood is beautifully reflected in our practices concerning Holy Communion.

BEFORE COMMUNION: By making a Confession if serious sin has touched our lives, we open our souls to receive and benefit from Eucharistic grace - removing the barriers that would otherwise obstruct it.

By fasting for one hour before Mass (consuming only water or medicine) we demonstrate our belief in Jesus' true presence in the Eucharist by setting aside earthly food in preparation to receive the very bread come down from heaven.

By listening to the Mass Scripture Readings before Communion, we open and prepare ourselves to receive the Lord in Holy Communion. If we enter a Mass after all readings are done (i.e. after the Gospel), we refrain from receiving Communion at that Mass. The celebration of Word and Sacrament are *never* separated. We listen to Him before receiving Him.

AT COMMUNION: By saying "The Body of Christ" when we approach for Communion, the priest or minister is asking us to profess our faith in the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. We do so in word by answering, "Amen" - a Latin word meaning "verily", or "it is so."

AFTER RECEIVING COMMUNION: Actions speak louder than words, so after saying "Amen" we then demonstrate our belief that it is really Jesus we have received by returning to our pew to spend time with Him in silent or sung prayer - to "commune" with the Lord. This precious time spent praying after receiving Communion is the closest we shall ever come to Jesus in this life before we meet Him face to face in the life to come. St. Francis de Sales advised the following: "When you have received Him, stir up your heart to do Him homage; speak to Him about your spiritual life, gazing upon Him in your soul where He is present for your happiness; and welcome Him as warmly as possible."

Some Catholic parishes have experienced the problem of people walking right out the door after receiving Holy Communion. Today's Feast provides a good opportunity to consider why such an act is inconsistent with our belief in the Holy Eucharist. With the obvious exceptions of illness or other emergency, walking out the door after receiving Communion should be avoided for the following reasons. First, it steals from the communicant the chance to pray with the One they have just received; depriving them also of the grace that prayer would bring. At the very moment the communicant's thoughts should be turned heavenward, those thoughts instead turn toward worldly matters, i.e. driving, where they are going next, talking to other people instead of to God, etc.

Walking out the door after receiving Communion also fractures the worshipping community at the very part of the Mass that it is meant to be most perfectly united by the Eucharist and prayer. Such an act denies the "Amen" just spoken; for if one truly believes they have just received Jesus, would they not then want to spend time with Him in prayer? The Eucharist is Someone - not something. It is a Person to be spoken to in immediate prayer, not a spiritual pill that once consumed will do its work regardless of whether or not we pay it any further attention.

The Mass itself is named after the "Missa" - the prayer of sending forth at the very end of Mass ("The Mass is ended, go in peace.") In a very real sense, anyone who departs the church building before the "Missa" can be said to have missed the Mass. Certainly they have missed the meaning of the Mass, and stolen from themselves the most valuable time of prayer afforded us therein.

AFTER MASS: After the Mass is over, we demonstrate our belief in the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist most importantly of all by the way we live our lives. Everyone we meet between one Sunday and the next should be able to experience the Eucharist - Christ now within us - by our love, by our compassion and by our willingness to forgive others even as we have been forgiven in Christ Jesus.

DAY 5, Sunday, June 22 - Apostolate, an encounter with Jesus who sends us out.

OPENING PRAYER

Sacred Heart of Jesus, source of true love, living sign of the tenderness of God who becomes flesh, who draws near and gives himself without reserve. In you we discover the deepest truth of our existence: that we were created out of love, for love, and that our life is a constant call to embrace that love and give it to others.



O Sacred Heart, help us to remain in you. May we, listening to your heartbeat, experience the sweetness of your love. May your fire transform us and send us out. May the blood and water that flow from your side be a source of life and nourishment for our souls. Amen.

GOSPEL

(John 20:21) [Jesus] said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

REFLECTION

The flames of love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus also expand through the Church's missionary outreach, which proclaims the message of God's love revealed in Christ. (...) Mission, as a radiation of the love of the heart of Christ, requires missionaries who are themselves in love and who, enthralled by Christ, feel bound to share this love that has changed their lives. (*Dilexit Nos*, 207 and 209)

CLOSING PRAYER

Lord Jesus, teach us to look at the world with your eyes and to love it with your heart, so that, sharing your sentiments, we may not remain indifferent to its needs and may respond with joy: "Here I am, send me" (Isaiah 6:8).



Join Pastoral Associate and Parishioner Leo Racine, as we receive this beautiful gift from the late Holy Father.





OPENING PRAYER

Sacred Heart of Jesus, source of true love, living sign of the tenderness of God who becomes flesh, who draws near and gives himself without reserve. In you we discover the deepest truth of our existence: that we were created out of love, for love, and that our life is a constant call to embrace that love and give it to others.





GOSPEL

(Luke 24:32) Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning [within us] while he spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us?"

REFLECTION

Christ shows that God is closeness, compassion and tender love. Whenever Jesus healed someone, he preferred to do it, not from a distance but in close proximity: "He stretched out his hand and touched him" (Mt 8:3). "He touched her hand" (Mt 8:15). "He touched their eyes" (Mt 9:29). Once he even stopped to cure a deaf man with his own saliva (cf. Mk 7:33), as a mother would do, so that people would not think of him as removed from their lives. "The Lord knows the fine science of the caress. In his compassion, God does not love us with words; he comes forth to meet us and, by his closeness, he shows us the depth of his tender love". (*Dilexit Nos*, 35-36).

CLOSING PRAYER

Lord Jesus, open our eyes so that we may discover you at our side, renewing the most essential calling at every moment: the call to holiness, to live a life of communion with you in love.

Sacred Heart of Jesus, make my heart like yours. Amen.

DAY 7, Tuesday, June 24 - Formation, an encounter with Jesus that lets us acquire his mind and heart.

OPENING PRAYER

Sacred Heart of Jesus, source of true love, living sign of the tenderness of God who becomes flesh, who draws near and gives himself without reserve. In you we discover the deepest truth of our existence: that we were created out of love, for love, and that our life is a constant call to embrace that love and give it to others.



O Sacred Heart, help us to remain in you. May we, listening to your heartbeat, experience the sweetness of your love. May your fire transform us and send us out. May the blood and water that flow from your side be a source of life and nourishment for our souls. Amen.

GOSPEL

(Matthew 11:29) Take my yoke upon you and **learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart**; and you will find rest for yourselves.

REFLECTION

Love for our brothers and sisters is not simply the fruit of our own efforts; it demands the transformation of our selfish hearts. This realization gave rise to the oft-repeated prayer: "Jesus, make our hearts more like your own". Saint Paul, for his part, urged his hearers to pray not for the strength to do good works, but "to have the same mind among you that was in Christ Jesus" (Phil 2:5). (*Dilexit Nos*, 168)

CLOSING PRAYER

Lord Jesus, transform us with your love and gentleness. Help us to humbly recognize our smallness so that, abandoned to you, you may love and work in us, uniting our minds and hearts to yours.

Sacred Heart of Jesus, make my heart like yours. Amen.

DAY 8, Wednesday, June 25 - Team life and community, an encounter with Jesus who calls us together.

OPENING PRAYER

Sacred Heart of Jesus, source of true love, living sign of the tenderness of God who becomes flesh, who draws near and gives himself without reserve. In you we discover the deepest truth of our existence: that we were created out of love, for love, and that our life is a constant call to embrace that love and give it to others.



O Sacred Heart, help us to remain in you. May we, listening to your heartbeat, experience the sweetness of your love. May your fire transform us and send us out. May the blood and water that flow from your side be a source of life and nourishment for our souls. Amen.

GOSPEL

(Matthew 18:20) For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.

REFLECTION

We should not think of this mission of sharing Christ as something only between Jesus and me. Mission is experienced in fellowship with our communities and with the whole Church. If we turn aside from the community, we will be turning aside from Jesus. If we turn our back on the community, our friendship with Jesus will grow cold. This is a fact, and we must never forget it. Love for the brothers and sisters of our communities - religious, parochial, diocesan and others - is a kind of fuel that feeds our friendship with Jesus. Our acts of love for our brothers and sisters in community may well be the best and, at times, the only way that we can witness to others our love for Jesus Christ. He himself said, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (Jn 13:35). (Dilexit Nos, 212)

CLOSING PRAYER

Lord Jesus, aware that faith is not lived in solitude, help us to form communities of apostles in love with your heart, who live in communion and are joyful witnesses of your love.

Sacred Heart of Jesus, make my heart like yours. Amen.

DAY 9, Thursday, June 26 - Jesus Christ, the call made flesh.

OPENING PRAYER

Sacred Heart of Jesus, source of true love, living sign of the tenderness of God who becomes flesh, who draws near and gives himself without reserve. In you we discover the deepest truth of our existence: that we were created out of love, for love, and that our life is a constant call to embrace that love and give it to others.



O Sacred Heart, help us to remain in you. May we, listening to your heartbeat, experience the sweetness of your love. May your fire transform us and send us out. May the blood and water that flow from your side be a source of life and nourishment for our souls. Amen.

GOSPEL

(John 19:30) When Jesus had taken the wine, he said, "It is finished." And bowing his head, he handed over the spirit.

REFLECTION

The wound in Christ's side, the wellspring of living water, remains open in the risen body of the Saviour. The deep wound inflicted by the lance and the wounds of the crown of thorns that customarily appear in representations of the Sacred Heart are an inseparable part of this devotion, in which we contemplate the love of Christ who offered himself in sacrifice to the very end. The wounded side of Christ continues to pour forth that stream which is never exhausted, never passes away, but offers itself time and time again to all those who wish to love as he did. For his love alone can bring about a new humanity. (*Dilexit Nos*, n.n. 151 y 219).

CLOSING PRAYER

Lord Jesus, you are the call *par excellence*, the "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). Help us understand that only in you will we find the concrete path to our fulfillment, and teach us to drink from the overflowing fountain of your pierced heart, from which your love pours out into the world.

FOR PEACE

As war in the Middle East continues to spread, Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, has offered us this prayer for a just and lasting peace. Let us join with him in asking God to show us the way to that precious gift.

"O God of peace, 'You are the same yesterday, today, and forever' (Heb 13:8)," the prayer reads. "You have said: 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid' (Jn 14:27)."

"We lift our weary hearts to you, Lord, longing for your light amid the shadows of fear and unrest," the prayer continues. "Teach us to be peacemakers, for 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God' (Mt 5:9). Sow in us the seeds of reconciliation, and make us instruments of your peace in a wounded world."

"Grant us the grace to live as you have commanded: 'If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all' (Rom 12:18). Let there be in our cities and lands: 'Peace within your walls and security within your towers' (Ps 122:7). In the midst of trouble, we proclaim: 'The Lord is my light and my salvation: Whom shall I fear?' (Ps 27:1). CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD, NEW THIS FALL!

FOR THREE-YEAR-OLD, PRE-K, AND KINDERGARTEN CHILDREN: Children who are 3 years old by September 1, 2025 or are in Pre-K or Kindergarten will be eligible to register. We will be implementing a new Program for young children called the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS). This Montessori-based curriculum helps children and their teachers develop a personal relationship with Jesus. In a sacred space called the Atrium, children work with concrete materials that help them learn about the life and teachings of Jesus with particular emphasis on the parable of the Good Shepherd. An Atrium will be created in the upper rooms of the Sister Ricci House. Sessions will meet **twice a month for about 90 minutes.** Catechists in the CGS program have special training. We are looking for good people to be trained as CGS Catechists. If you are interested in participating in this new program, please contact the Religious Education Office at
