## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today's Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross commemorates three events. The discovery of the True Cross in 326 by St. Helena. Its exaltation for public veneration in 335. And its recovery from the Persians in 628.

To "exalt" the Cross, to "uncover it," to see it as an instrument of "triumph" - reveals a truth at the very heart of our Catholic faith. To the world, the Cross may look like a sign of defeat, shame, and sorrow.

But to us - the people of the Resurrection - the Cross is our victory, our glory, and our hope. It is through the wood of the Cross that sin was shattered, death was conquered, and eternal life was opened to us.

This feast invites us not just to look at the Cross, but to lift it up - in our homes, in our hearts, and in our daily lives. To lift high the Cross is to proclaim with boldness:

*"Love has triumphed. God has not abandoned us. Suffering is not the end of the story."*

In our own lives, we each carry crosses - some visible, some hidden. They may come in the form of illness, broken relationships, financial strain, anxiety, or grief. But Christ has gone before us. He has transformed the Cross from an instrument of torture into the greatest sign of love the world has ever known.

So let us not be afraid to draw near to the Cross. Let us embrace it - not for its pain, but for its power. Because in the Cross, we find a Savior who knows our wounds, walks with us in our trials, and lifts us up when we fall.

As St. Paul reminds us, *"We preach Christ crucified... the power of God and the wisdom of God"* (1 Cor 1:23-24). May this feast renew in us a deep love for Jesus crucified - and risen - and give us the courage to follow Him more faithfully wherever He leads.

I encourage you this week to take a moment in prayer before a crucifix in your home or here in the church. Let the gaze of Christ on the Cross speak to your heart. Bring Him your burdens. Let Him remind you: *"This is how much I love you."*

May Mary, Mother of Sorrows, who stood at the foot of the Cross, pray for us and teach us to stay close to her Son - in suffering and in glory.

### LIGHT IN THE SHADOW OF TRAGEDY

This past week, we have once again been confronted with heartbreaking violence in our nation - a tragic

assassination at Utah Valley University, and a devastating school shooting at Evergreen High School in Colorado. These acts of hatred and senseless destruction pierce our hearts and leave us asking the age-old question: *"Where is God in all of this?"*

As followers of Christ, we do not shy away from suffering. The Cross is central to our faith - not as a symbol of defeat, but of redemptive love. In the midst of evil, we remember that Jesus too was the victim of injustice and violence. Yet through His Death and Resurrection, love triumphed over hatred, and life conquered death.

Our Catholic response must be more than sorrow - it must be love in action. Let us pray for the victims, their families, the wounded, and even those who caused this harm. As hard as it is, we are called to pray for peace - not only in the world, but in the hearts of those who are consumed by the darkness that leads to violence.

In moments like these, we must be witnesses to hope. Let us remember that every act of kindness, every word of truth, every gesture of compassion becomes a beam of light in this shadowed world. Christ calls us to be peacemakers - to speak up when others are silent, to reach out when others pull away, and to bring healing where there is division.

May the Lord grant eternal rest to the slain, comfort to the grieving, and wisdom to our leaders and communities. And may we, as the Body of Christ, rise to meet the challenge of our times - with courage, love, and unwavering faith. Amen.
