Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today Jesus presents us with a parable about a steward who is dishonest, yet shrewd. Rather than praising his misconduct, the Lord draws our attention to the man's foresight and determination. Jesus says, "The children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light."

There's a quiet challenge here for all of us. We who walk by faith, who know the promises of eternal life, are sometimes less focused and purposeful about our spiritual journey than those who chase after the things of this world. Why is that?

Perhaps it is because we forget how precious and limited our time really is. We forget that every day and every breath is a gift. We forget that we are stewards, not owners. Our lives, our time, our resources, and even our relationships are gifts from God. And one day, like the steward in the parable, we will be called to give an account of how we have tended all He has given us.

Whether you are a parent raising children, a student navigating school life, someone caring for an elderly parent, or simply trying to live quietly and faithfully in your vocation, you have been given a sacred task. What you do matters. How you love matters. What you choose to prioritize, even in the hidden corners of your heart, matters deeply to God.

Jesus ends today's Gospel with a clear teaching: "You cannot serve both God and Mammon." The word "Mammon," means the spirit of wealth and worldliness. It refers to anything we can begin to serve as a goal unto itself, instead of putting it at the service of God. Money, success, comfort, these things are not evil in themselves. But when they begin to rule us, we forget who we are and to Whom we belong.

Jesus is not just offering a warning. He is inviting us to live freely by placing God at the very center of our lives

In the words of St. John Vianney, "You either belong wholly to the world, or wholly to God."

So how do we live out this Gospel? We begin by asking the Lord to shape in us a heart of generosity not just with our wallets, but with our time, our attention, and our mercy. We are called to be wise stewards who care for others and for creation as if it all truly belongs to God. Because it does.

The responsibility we take for those who are in need is one of the surest signs that we are serving God, not Mammon. Today the prophet Amos speaks directly to this, warning against any form of injustice that crushes the poor or forgets the dignity of others. God sees the heart. And what He desires is not just our offerings, but our compassion.

May God remind us this day of our true riches - our faith, our relationships, our daily opportunities to encounter Him in others. In this remember that you are not alone. The Lord sees your efforts, your quiet sacrifices, and your desire to walk with Him.






PANTRY SHELF BACK TO SCHOOL HELP:
