Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today we hear a quiet but powerful conversation between Jesus and His disciples. They say to Him, "Increase our faith!"

It's a short, urgent plea that echoes in every heart that has ever struggled to believe in times of doubt or difficulty. And what does Jesus say in return?

He speaks of mustard seeds.

Of small beginnings.

Of how even the tiniest spark of real faith carries within it the power to uproot and transform.

The Lord reminds us that faith is not measured by quantity, but by surrender. Not by certainty, but by trust. It is not something we can conquer or create by our own effort. It is a gift, given and grown in the quiet soil of daily life.

There is a mystical beauty here. Faith is not always a blazing light. Sometimes it is a candle flickering, or a seed buried in the dark earth. And yet, in God's mysterious design, those small, hidden things become the very vessels of grace.

St. John of the Cross once wrote, "Faith is the union of God with the soul. It is God Himself Who secretly teaches the soul and instructs it in perfect love." What a humbling truth. When we live in faith, even when we do not feel it, we are already being drawn into the very heart of God.

We may not see the fruits right away. But He is at work - gently, quietly, and faithfully. So often we long for visible signs, dramatic answers, or immediate peace. But Christ invites us into something deeper.

To serve without seeking reward. To pray without needing to feel. To love without understanding fully. This is the path of true discipleship.

And so, if you find yourself today praying the Gospel prayer, "Lord, increase my faith," know that you are not alone. The saints prayed it too. The apostles lived it. And Christ honors it always.

Let us encourage one another to remain faithful in the small things. To be servants of the Gospel with joy and humility. To believe, even when we cannot yet see.

Because the God who plants the seed is also the God who brings in the harvest. In the way and in the time that will reap the greatest spiritual fruit for those who place their trust in Him.

## RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY 2025

This weekend, as we observe Respect Life Sunday, we are confronted not only with our call to defend the dignity of every human life, but also with a painful reminder of how fragile life can be. On last Sunday, September 28, a horrifying attack struck a Mormon place of worship in Grand Blanc, Michigan. A gunman rammed a vehicle into a church during services, opened fire, and set the building ablaze, leaving several dead and many more wounded.

A church should be among the safest spaces in our world, where hearts are lifted in prayer, not threatened by violence. The events in Michigan echo the tragedy at the Annunciation Catholic School Mass this summer in Minneapolis. Such events violate not only the sanctity of physical church buildings but the very spirit of what it means to be a people of faith.

Respect Life Sunday is meant to draw our attention to the defenseless: the unborn, the marginalized, the suffering, the elderly, the disenfranchised. But it must also include those whose lives are cut short by violence - those threatened by hatred and fear.

In the face of such darkness, we are called to three responses:

- 1. Prayer and Compassion. Let us lift up in prayer all those harmed in the Michigan tragedy the families of the deceased, the wounded, first responders, and an entire community traumatized by this attack. Let us pray also for the conversion of hearts, that we may break the cycles of anger and violence. We remember Christ's own words, "Blessed are the peacemakers." (Matthew 5:9)
- 2. A Firm Defense of Every Human Life. To respect life is to defend life from conception to natural death, and also to protect life from violence and injustice. As a Church, we must insist on policies that reduce gun violence, promote mental health care, and build communities of compassion. We must vigorously resist arguments that treat human lives as expendable.
- **3. Renewed Hope and Active Charity.** In a world shaken by tragedy, we are called to be agents of hope and healing. Let us strengthen ministries of accompaniment, support for victims of violence, and efforts to foster reconciliation. Let us strive to build safe neighborhoods, invest in youth, and reinforce the bonds of community.

On this Respect Life Sunday, let us allow our sorrow to fuel resolve. Let the horror of what happened in Michigan and Minnesota move us beyond grief into bolder advocacy and more generous love. In these ways, we become signs of the Gospel's power to transform wounds into mercy, fear into courage, and death into life.

May the Lord give us the strength to protect the vulnerable and comfort the brokenhearted. May we proclaim with ever greater clarity that every life is sacred, every person precious, and violence has no place in the kingdom of God.

Nothing can diminish the priceless worth of any human life.


WEEKEND: This week's second collection in every parish is the Holy Father's "Peter's Pence" collection. It funds the Holy Father's outreach to suffering communities around the





### COR ~ ST. MARY'S FAITH ENRICHMENT PROGRAM FOR




## ST. MARY'S MARRIAGE FELLOWSHIP:

The standard of morality then becomes the individual feeling of what is beautiful, instead of the rational estimate of what is right.
