Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today, we hear in the Gospel (Luke 17:11-19) the familiar and moving story of Jesus healing ten lepers. Yet only one, a Samaritan, returns to give thanks. Jesus' response still echoes through the ages. "Where are the other nine?"

This Gospel invites us to reflect deeply on the spiritual power of gratitude. While all ten were physically healed, only the one who returned in thanksgiving was made whole. He was saved not just in body, but in spirit. True gratitude does more than say "thank you." It opens our hearts to grace, deepens our relationship with God, and leads us to humility and conversion.

This is also Columbus Day Weekend, a federal holiday that invites us to reflect on the journeys that shaped our world and the legacy they have left behind. As Catholics, we are called to look at history with both clarity and compassion.

Christopher Columbus' voyage in 1492 undeniably changed the course of history, including the introduction of Christianity to the Americas. Yet we must also acknowledge the suffering that followed for many indigenous peoples - a legacy that calls us to repentance, reconciliation, and a renewed commitment to justice.

Like the ten lepers, our ancestors - explorers, settlers, and indigenous communities alike - were all seeking a better future. And like the Samaritan, we are moved to return to the Lord with gratitude for His blessings, while recognizing the ongoing need for healing in our history and in our hearts.

Let this day be one of thanksgiving, not just for what we have received, but for the mission we are entrusted with: to be instruments of reconciliation in our world. In the words of St. Junípero Serra, a missionary to the Americas, "Always go forward, never turn back."

May we go forward boldly, proclaiming the Gospel with our lives, healing what is broken, and always giving thanks.

Today I would like to give thanks in a special way for St. Mary's Knights of Columbus Council #14224. By their prayer and charitable endeavors, they are an incredible blessing to our parish and community. May God bless you in your beautiful works!

Today we also give thanks for the young people in our St. Mary's Altar Server Ministry. The campaign reflects the Knights of Columbus' longstanding commitment to charity and community service. 

# FOR DEEPER REFLECTION

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus is journeying toward Jerusalem, passing between Samaria and Galilee - a borderland not just geographically, but socially and religiously. The ten lepers who approach Him stand at a distance, as required by Jewish law (Leviticus 13:45-46), since leprosy rendered them ritually unclean and excluded from the community. Remarkably, among the ten is a Samaritan, a member of a group despised by the Jews for their mixed ancestry and divergent worship practices. Yet in their shared suffering, these men, normally divided by ethnicity and religion, are united. Jesus' command, "Go, show yourselves to the priests," follows the Mosaic Law's prescription for verifying healing (Leviticus 14), and it is in their act of obedience, while on the way, that they are cleansed. This emphasizes the power of faith-in-action and Jesus' authority over both physical illness and the Law. However, only one returns, and he is the Samaritan. His return is a profound act of worship. Luke uses the language of the Psalms, "praising God in a loud voice," to describe his gratitude, signaling the man's spiritual insight. Jesus' response, "Your faith has saved you" (Luke 17:19), uses the Greek word sozo, which can mean both physical healing and salvation. While all ten are healed, only the Samaritan receives the deeper gift of salvation through his faith and thanksgiving. This encounter prefigures the inclusion of the Gentiles in the New Covenant and challenges the faithful to see gratitude not just as a virtue, but as a doorway into deeper communion with God. It also invites us, especially in the Eucharist (which literally means "thanksgiving"), to return to Christ again and again with hearts full of faith and praise.

#### OCTOBER HAPPENINGS IN THE ATRIUM:

Each child was greeted by Mrs. Krenselewski as they arrived in the Atrium. The children were taken into the Atrium to see their new sacred space and the first movement for the children was to prepare the prayer table. The children slowly placed the green prayer cloth over the table letting the children know that we are now in Ordinary time on the Liturgical calendar. The Bible was enthroned on a soft pillow by two children while other children placed prayer items on the prayer table.
