Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today we receive one of the most important lessons of Christian life - the call to humility. Jesus offers us a parable about two men who go up to the temple to pray. One is a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. Both are believers, both approach the sacred space, both lift their voices in prayer. But only one is heard by God. Why? Because only one of them prays from a place of humility.

The Pharisee, though religiously observant, stands centered on himself. He lists his spiritual accomplishments and compares himself to others, especially the sinful. His prayer, though addressed to God, revolves around his own virtue.

In contrast, the tax collector stands at a distance, not daring to lift his eyes. His words are few, but his heart is open as he says, "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This is the prayer of humility, the prayer that pierces through to heaven.

Humility is often misunderstood. It is not weakness, self-hatred, or low self-esteem. True humility is living in the truth of who we are before God. It is the quiet strength to say, "I am not perfect. I am not the center. I am not the Savior. But I know the One who is." Humility opens the door for God to be God in our lives.

The world often rewards the proud, the accomplished, and the polished. But God draws close to the lowly, the honest, the contrite. He is not scandalized by our sins or impressed by our successes. He is drawn to the humble heart that trusts in His mercy. That is the only posture that allows grace to flow freely.

St. Augustine once said: "Do you wish to rise? Begin by descending. You plan a tower that will pierce the clouds? Lay first the foundation of humility. The higher your structure is to be, the deeper must be its foundation. Do not be afraid of humility; it is not the destruction of your dignity, but its protection. For God dwells with the lowly, and from their smallness He builds His glory. The soul that bends low before God will one day stand upright before His throne."

We cannot build a life with God unless we begin on humility's foundation. Without it, even our good deeds risk becoming self-serving. But with humility, even our smallest prayers and acts are filled with grace. As we come to Mass this weekend, we may bring many things - joys, worries, regrets, hopes. But let us also bring a humble heart. Let us pray like the tax collector, not from fear or shame, but from trust. Trust that God sees us completely and loves us anyway. Trust that His love burns above all for those who are contrite and humble of heart.

The Church teaches that these souls, though saved, are not yet fully ready to enter the presence of God and benefit from our prayers, sacrifices, and Masses offered on their behalf. This feast expresses the deep communion between the Church on earth, the souls in purgatory, and the saints in heaven.

FOR DEEPER REFLECTION

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C (2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18)

This Sunday's readings call us to a faith that is humble, enduring, and rooted in trust. In the Gospel (Luke 18:9–14), Jesus praises the tax collector who prays with a bowed heart, while in the second reading, Saint Paul - writing from prison - offers his final testimony of faith and surrender. Together they show us what it means to stand before God not in pride, but in the quiet strength of those who rely on His mercy.

The Second Letter to Timothy is Saint Paul's final letter - a spiritual testament written in the stillness of a Roman prison. The missionary journeys are behind him now; the crowds have faded; the oncebusy apostle waits in solitude. And yet, his words are not heavy with sorrow. They shine with peace.

"I am already being poured out like a libation," he writes, "and the time of my departure is at hand." Paul's life, once driven by zeal, now becomes a quiet offering, poured out in love for Christ.

There is a deep tenderness in these verses. Paul looks back not with regret, but with gratitude: "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." The victory he speaks of is not earthly success, but fidelity - a heart that has remained steadfast through suffering and misunderstanding. What matters most to Paul is not what he has accomplished, but Who has accompanied him.

Then, with striking honesty, he confides: "At my first defense no one appeared on my behalf, but all deserted me." Yet even in that painful solitude, Paul discovers the unshakable nearness of Christ: "The Lord stood by me and gave me strength." What a quiet miracle this is - that in the places where human companionship fails, divine companionship deepens. The same Christ who once stood alone before Pilate now stands beside His servant in a Roman cell.

Paul's experience is not far from our own. There are times in life when we, too, feel abandoned or weary in our efforts to do good. Yet in those moments, the Lord stands by us still. His strength does not always remove the cross, but it transforms it from a burden into a bridge, from darkness into light.



Paul sees beyond the prison walls to the promise that awaits him: "The Lord will rescue me from every evil and bring me safely to His heavenly

kingdom." The crown of righteousness he awaits is not a trophy of merit, but the embrace of God's love - a gift prepared for all who have longed for His appearing.

This week, as we hear Paul's final words alongside the humble prayer of the tax collector, we are invited to live with that same humility and confidence. May our own lives, like Paul's, become quiet offerings of faith. And may we find peace in knowing that whatever comes, the Lord will always stand beside us - strengthening, guiding, and leading us home.
