

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

Today we observe the Feast of All Souls, a day set aside to pray for all the faithful departed. This includes those we have known and loved, and those who have no one left to pray for them by name.

Almost all of us have lost someone to death - parents, grandparents, children, friends, neighbors. Today, and throughout this month, we lovingly carry them in prayer, entrusting them to the mercy and tenderness of God.

It is natural to feel sorrow in remembering those we have lost. Grief is the price of love, and our hearts ache because they mattered deeply. But our Catholic faith does not leave us in grief, it raises us up in hope. The Feast of All Souls teaches us that death is not the end, but rather a passage. Those who have died in Christ are still alive in Him, and we remain united in the mystery of His Body, the Church - on earth, in purgatory, and in heaven.

We pray for the souls in purgatory not because we doubt God's love, but because we believe in His justice and His purifying mercy. These prayers are acts of love, gentle offerings that help prepare our loved ones to see God face to face. The Church invites us to become intercessors, offering Masses, rosaries, sacrifices, and acts of charity on their behalf.

St. Catherine of Genoa, a great mystic of purgatory, once wrote: "The souls in purgatory are entirely content with the ways of God, and suffer more from love than from pain... they are drawn to Him with such a force of love that nothing can stop them."

How beautiful to know that purgatory is not a place of despair, but of deep longing and growing closeness to God. It is the soul's final purification before entering into perfect joy. Our prayers, then, are like lamps in the night, helping illuminate their way home.

Let this season be one of deep spiritual companionship. Visit a cemetery with prayerful reverence. Inscribe your departed loved one's names in our St. Mary's Book of Remembrance. Speak their names aloud and speak to them in prayer. And above all, have an Intentioned Mass offered for them - the most powerful prayer we can make for their peace and rest.

As St. John Vianney once said: "If we knew what power one Mass has for the souls in purgatory, we would sacrifice everything to have more celebrated."



Dear Fellow Parishioners,

For the past 65 years, St. Mary's, Holliston has relied on the Grand Annual - a once a year special collection that goes entirely toward parish operating costs. In combination with the weekly offertory, the Grand Annual allows St. Mary's to pay her staff and maintain her four buildings, three of which are well over 100 years old.

As you know, the Grand Annual always takes place in November. The 2025 St. Mary's Grand Annual Collection is November 15 & 16. The goal is \$150,000 - the same as the 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024 Grand Annuals, which through your good stewardship were all achieved.

The most expensive item is the installation of two industrial HVAC Units to replace the forty-six-year-old original units on the Parish Center Roof, which are both failing. The most visible facilities item is the upholstering of the wooden pew seats in the church. The hard wood can be difficult for older parishioners and others with medical conditions to sit on for the length of a Mass, concert, or other event. The new cushioned seats are custom designed to rest on the curve of our pews and should be in place before January 2026.

The Grand Annual will also cover major concrete repairs to the front and side entrances to the church, as well as the replacement of the stage spot lighting in Fr. Haley Hall. (One track was removed when it stopped working). Also, if you have felt lately that the back of the church has gotten darker, you are correct. After forty years, multiple high fixtures in the nave are so worn and cracked that they can no longer accept bulbs and must be replaced. New lighting is also needed in the Parish Center Lobby, where we are going through a bulb a week from failing fixtures.

While St. Mary's is blessed to have good handicap access via our elevator, those in wheelchairs, walkers, or crutches have difficulty opening the exterior parking lot glass door to access the elevator. We will soon be installing a push panel, automatic door system for them.

As you know from your Newsletter, St. Mary's Youth Ministry Programs have exploded in popularity in recent years. Associated costs have gone up significantly, and we hope to designate part of the Grand Annual to fund these programs that we know are so valued by our people. A complete Grand Annual breakdown follows:

\$47,000	Replacement of both failing industrial HVAC units on the Parish Center Hall roof.
\$17,000	Middle and High School Youth Ministry Programs.
\$14,000	Installation of pew seat upholstery throughout the church.
\$ 8,000	Lighting Fixtures for Hall Stage, Church Nave plus, and Lobby.
\$ 5,500	Concrete Repairs - demolition and new pouring.
\$ 5,500	Exterior Rectory and Church, Interior Sr. Ricci House, Painting and Repairs.
\$ 4,000	Handicap push plate door system for parking lot elevator entry.

The remaining Grand Annual amount is applied to our six full-time staff salaries (\$49,000).

Since successfully paying off the last of her \$1.2 million loan debts in the fall of 2010, St. Mary's has been able to pay her bills and remains debt free. Your generous support of St. Mary's 2025 Grand Annual will assure that the hard-won financial health of our parish continues. We realize that these current economic times are difficult for many. But if we all do what we can according to our means, then the 2025 Grand Annual will be a success. Thank you in advance for your generosity. And thank you for the many ways you personally help to build up our beautiful parish family.

FOR REFLECTION

On this Feast of All Souls, one verse of our Mass Responsorial Psalm (23), resonates more deeply than ever. "Though I walk in the valley of darkness, I fear no evil, for You are with me." These words are one of the most profound articulations of faith amid adversity. They capture the paradox of divine companionship within the human experience of suffering.

The Hebrew text speaks of the "valley of tsalmavet," literally "the valley of deep shadow" or "shadow of death," evoking not merely physical peril but the trials of the soul. The "valley of darkness" is not merely a place of external peril, but the interior landscape of fear, grief, and uncertainty through which every soul must at some point journey. Yet the psalmist's assurance, "I fear no evil," is not born of denial, but of deep trust. It is the recognition that God's presence transforms the very nature of the valley. What was once a place of dread becomes a passage toward grace.

This verse teaches that courage does not arise from the absence of danger, but from the nearness of the Divine. In its cadence lies the pastoral wisdom that faith does not always remove the shadows but illumines them from within. To walk in darkness and yet be unafraid is the essence of spiritual maturity - a quiet confidence that love accompanies us even where light seems lost, and that no valley is truly empty when the Shepherd walks beside us.
