FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

One of the great discoveries of the Christian life is that God is more generous than we can imagine. That is the surprise at the heart of today's Gospel. Jesus tells us about a landowner who goes out looking for workers for his vineyard. Some begin early in the morning. Others come later. Some arrive when the working day is almost finished. Yet when evening comes, the landowner gives coin equally - a generosity that no one expected.

Jesus is showing us something about the heart of God. God is not stingy with grace. He does not measure out His love with an eyedropper or keep a ledger calculating whether we have earned another portion. He gives because giving is part of Who He is. He gives us life. He gives us people to love. He gives us forgiveness when we have failed. He gives us His Word, His Church, His Sacraments, and even His own Son. And when we wander away from Him, He goes looking for us again.

I find that especially beautiful to consider this week because next Saturday ninety-seven teenagers of Saint Mary's Parish will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

There is so much that I hope for them. I hope they will remain close to the Holy Mass. I hope they will pray. I hope they will serve the poor, defend what is good, forgive generously, and have the courage to live their Catholic faith when doing so is not easy. But perhaps most of all, I hope that over the years ahead they will discover for themselves the awesome generosity of God.

At their age, they cannot yet know all the places life will take them. They do not know the joys that await them, the disappointments they will face, the people they will love, the decisions they will make, or the particular work God will ask of them. But wherever life takes them, the Lord of the Vineyard will be there.

And next Saturday He will give them a truly extraordinary gift: the fullness of the Holy Spirit.

Confirmation is not simply something our young people accomplish after years of religious education. It is first something God does for them. He strengthens them. He seals them. He pours out the gifts of His Spirit lavishly upon them. And then He says, in effect, what the landowner says in today's Gospel: *"You too go into my vineyard."* There is a place for each of them there.

The Church needs their faith, their enthusiasm, their questions, their compassion, their courage, and gifts that perhaps they themselves have not yet discovered. The

vineyard is enormous, and God has entrusted a little corner of it to each of us.

Saint John Henry Newman expressed this beautifully: *"God has created me to do Him some definite service."* He believed that each of us has a particular part in God's providence that has been entrusted to no one else in quite the same way.

That is my prayer for our ninety-seven young people. May they never imagine that Confirmation marks the end of something. May they discover instead that God is placing a vineyard before them - a whole lifetime in which to love, serve, build, forgive, sacrifice, and become holy.

And someday, looking back over that life, may they recognize what the workers in Jesus' parable discovered at the end of the day: that the Master of the vineyard has been far more generous than they ever dreamed.

Please keep our Confirmation candidates, their sponsors, their families, and all who have helped form them in faith in your prayers this coming week.

Open their hearts to Your presence, their ears to Your voice, and their eyes to recognize You in the people and moments of each day.

Give them the courage to follow Jesus, the strength to live their faith when it is difficult, and generous hearts ready to serve others.

May the Holy Spirit awaken within them a faith that is truly their own - alive, joyful, and rooted deeply in You.

And may their Confirmation not simply mark a day in their lives, but the beginning of a deeper friendship with Christ that continues to grow for all their days.

CEMETERY REMINDER: R & R Landscape will begin their Cemetery Fall Clean-up soon. Per Cemetery Rules and Regulations (posted online and at the Cemetery Entrance) bushes planted on either side of the monument (never to exceed two feet in height) must be kept pruned by the planter accordingly. There are no planting of trees or any other alterations in the back of the headstone, no fences, borders, curbing, statues, benches (unless used as the headstone at the top of the grave), hedges or hardscapes on the lot. All benches not used as headstones will be marked this week for removal. Seasonal flowers (no glass containers) may be placed on graves with the understanding that staff may remove them.

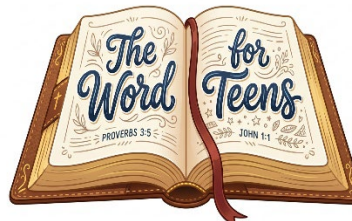

"Are you envious because I am generous?" Jesus asks a question that can hit pretty close to home, especially when we are young. It is easy to look

sideways at everyone else: Who is more popular? Who has more friends? Who is better looking, more talented, more successful? Who seems to have an easier life than I do? Comparison can quietly steal our joy because it makes us concentrate on what God has given someone else instead of recognizing what He has given us.

Jesus invites us to stop looking sideways and start looking upward. Your life does not have to look like anyone else's life to be blessed. God knows you personally, loves you completely, and has given you gifts that are uniquely yours. Someone else's blessing does not mean there is less grace left for you. God's generosity is not a pie with only so many pieces. So when you see something beautiful happening in someone else's life, learn to rejoice with them - and then look again at your own life. You may discover that God has been far more generous to you than you ever knew.

***CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD (CGS) MONTESSORI PROGRAM SEEKS FIVE ADULTS AND HIGH SCHOOL TEENS TO BE CGS ASSISTANTS.**

Assistants **do not teach**, they observe the children's activities, behaviors, and responses and are



available if a child needs help. CGS is a child-centered approach to **inform, form, and transform the children** to know God's presence in their early years of development. The child becomes the teacher as the Catechist and Assistants let the children learn at their own pace Who

the Good Shepherd is. Those who are assistants marvel at how their own lives and faith have been changed by observing the children in the Atrium. **CGS Level 1 is for 3 to 6 year old children.** New Assistants will receive training from a CGSUSA Certified Formation Leader, Mary Pat Heelan. Training will take place at St. Mary's Parish on a date to be determined by the formation leader. Parents who have registered their children for CGS are encouraged to attend the training as well as other parishioners and catechists who may want to learn more about the CGS "WAY" and method.
