Wednesday, November 1, Feast of All Saints,

A Holy Day of Obligation: Today the Church celebrates the Feast of All Saints – honoring and asking the prayerful intercession of all the Holy Men, Women, and Children who have gone ahead of us in faith

and now live in the light of God's presence. Some of the saints have been "declared" by the Church and their names are known to us. Most, however, are known only to God, and this day we both commemorate their holy lives and remember our own calling to become saints – holy witnesses of Christ's love to the world. A Holy Day of Obligation, All Saints will be celebrated at three Wednesday Masses: **9 AM, 5:30 PM & 7 PM.**

Thursday, November 2, All Souls Mass:



Catholics believe that our prayers assist souls that died in a state of grace through purgatory – a journey of purification that allows a soul to enter God's eternal presence in a state of perfect innocence, able to receive fully the light and glory of God. At St. Mary's, a special candlelight All Souls Mass will be celebrated on **Thursday, November 2 at 7 PM**. Those buried from the parish over the past year will have their names read and a candle lit in their memory. The candlelight Mass is open to everyone who would like to pray for their own departed loved ones. The full Adult Choir will be ministering.



Saturday, November 18, Parish Pasta Night: Come

Join your fellow parishioners at a special <u>Thursday, Nov. 23, 9 AM Mass</u>, at which together we will thank God for all His many blessings. Bring an item of food that will grace your family Thanksgiving dinner to be blessed at Mass and then take home – connecting your table to the Table of God. As always, this Thanksgiving Day morning Mass will be followed by a pastry reception in Father Haley Hall.

Dear Members of the St. Mary's Parish Family,

October is "Respect Life Month," and yet as I write this on October 18 the Holy Land is wracked by violence. Thousands of innocents have died, first at the hands of Hamas, then at the hands of the Israeli military. I thank everyone who joined in our parish's Rosary and Holy Hour for Peace in Israel and Palestine. And I encourage all to continue to pray and advocate for peace.

True peace means more than a temporary cessation of violence. It must be a peace that allows both Israelis and Palestinians to live unmolested - with equal rights, security, and justice for displaced persons and refugees. The current conflict is a continuation of one that has been raging now for fifty years, since the occupation of the West Bank, including Gaza and East Jerusalem. It is time and past time for the world to seek justice and a lasting solution for all.

Terrorist attacks and indiscriminate retaliation against civilians only fuel the hatreds and distrust that have so long afflicted the very Land where Jesus lived, taught, died, and rose to offer hope to all the human family. In His Name we are called to work towards a true reconciliation of hearts.

Let us pray for the safe return of the Israeli hostages. Let us pray for the safety of innocent civilians in Gaza. Let us mourn the lives already lost on both sides and ask God's consolation upon the grieving. Let us pray for the injured, and make every effort to assure water, food, and medical care for all who are suffering.

Let us pray for the day when our common humanity and the value of every human life will be recognized and respected without discrimination. Let us pray for Jesus' Easter gift of Peace.

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

For the past 63 years, St. Mary's, Holliston has relied on the Grand Annual – a once a year special collection that goes entirely toward parish operating costs. In combination with the weekly offertory, the Grand Annual allows St. Mary's to pay her staff and maintain her four buildings, three of which are over 100 years old.

As you know, the Grand Annual always takes place in November. The 2023 St. Mary's Grand Annual Collection is Veteran's Day Weekend - November 11 & 12. The goal is \$150,000 – the same as the 2020, 2021, and 2022 Grand Annuals, which despite the pandemic were all achieved.

The single largest facilities items covered by this year's Grand Annual are the renovation of the Sister Ricci House downstairs bathroom, and upcoming repairs to the church boiler pumps. The bathroom was severely deteriorated, and with Sister Ricci House receiving more and more use by various groups the repair was overdue. Both church boiler pumps have recently developed serious leaks and must be repaired or replaced. Here is a complete Grand Annual breakdown:

\$12,840	Sister Ricci House Bathroom Repairs
\$5,100	Painting inside of Sister Ricci House (1st & 2nd Floor)
\$7,000	New Flooring for Choir Loft and Elevator
\$4,609	Emergency Roof and Siding Repairs from storm damage
\$2,347	Carpeting of Music and Youth Ministry Offices
\$8,408	Crack sealing and Sealcoating of the main Parking Lot
\$3,000	Parking lot repairs
\$6,200	Exterior Church Repairs
\$3,815	Electrical Repairs - Outside Light Poles and Father Haley Hall
\$6,200	Lower Church Emergency Exit Stairwell Repairs
\$9,000	Church Windows Exterior Woodwork Repairs
\$3,000	Sacristy Repairs
\$10,000	Boiler Pumps in Church

The remaining Grand Annual amount is applied to staff salaries (\$68,481).

Since successfully paying off the last of her \$1.2 million loan debts in the fall of 2010, St. Mary's has been able to pay her bills and remains debt free. Your generous support of St. Mary's 2023 Grand Annual will assure that the hard-won financial health of our parish continues. We realize that these current economic times are difficult for many. But if we <u>all</u> do what we can according to our means, then the 2023 Grand Annual will be a success. Thank you in advance for your generosity. And thank you for the many ways you personally help to build up our beautiful parish family.

If you have children, make them aware of your Grand Annual support so that they can learn good stewardship by your example.




